We leave the fondest hopes that they will have as much fun in high school as we have had.

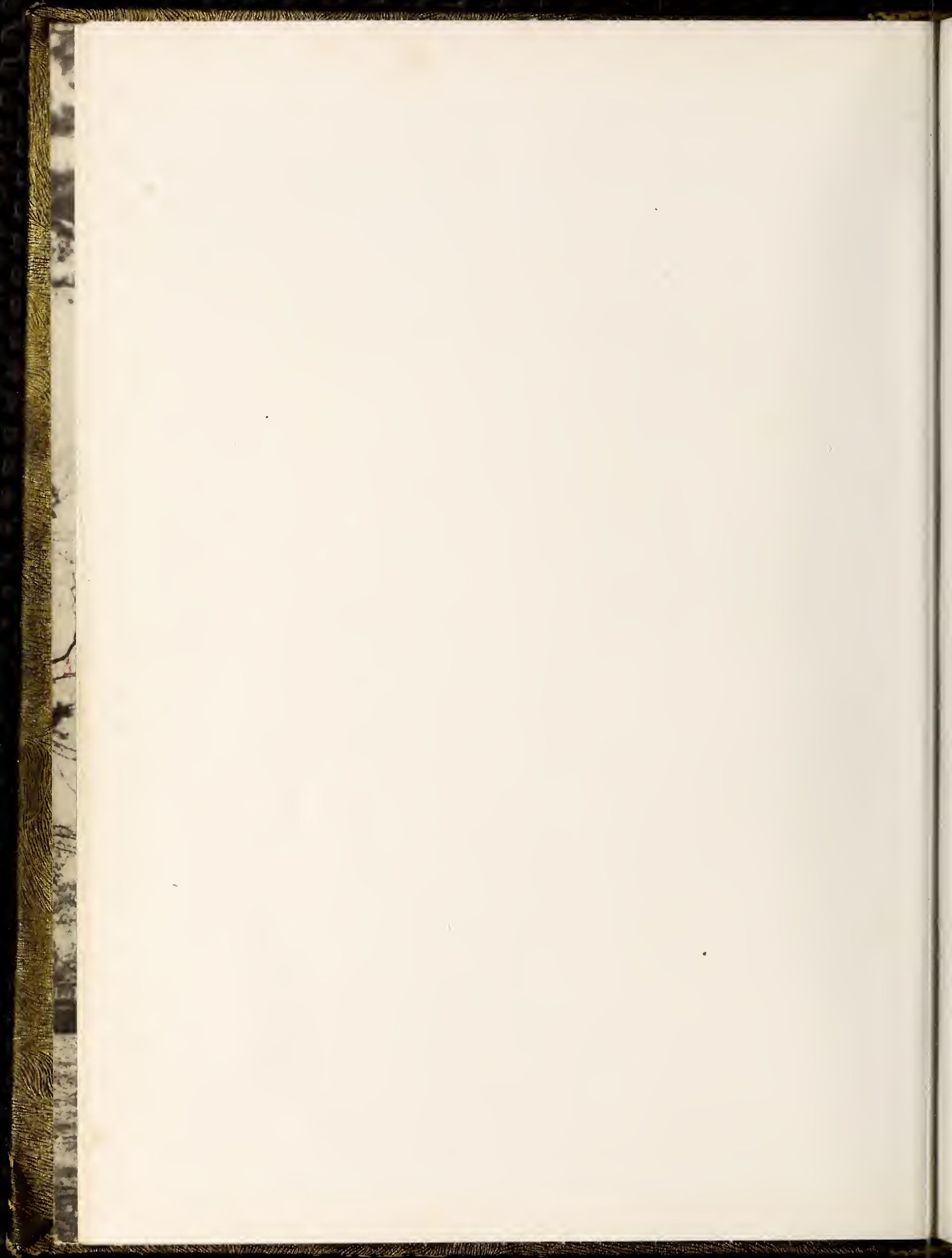
