Now, because we have finished our flight on the plane we started off on, many of us are planning to make reservations on a larger and more important plane in which some will be taking up nursing, teaching, business administration, and many other different careers. Before we leave we would like to say "Thank You", to the teachers in grammar school for all you did for us; to our high school teachers, who showed us we would have to "Aim High and Hold Your Aim", and to Mr. Kearns, for being só patient and understanding to us all these years. As we leave we will never forget all the wonderful things that happened during our years at Fair Grove. After we are gone, we will always proudly say, "Fair Grove is my School!"
