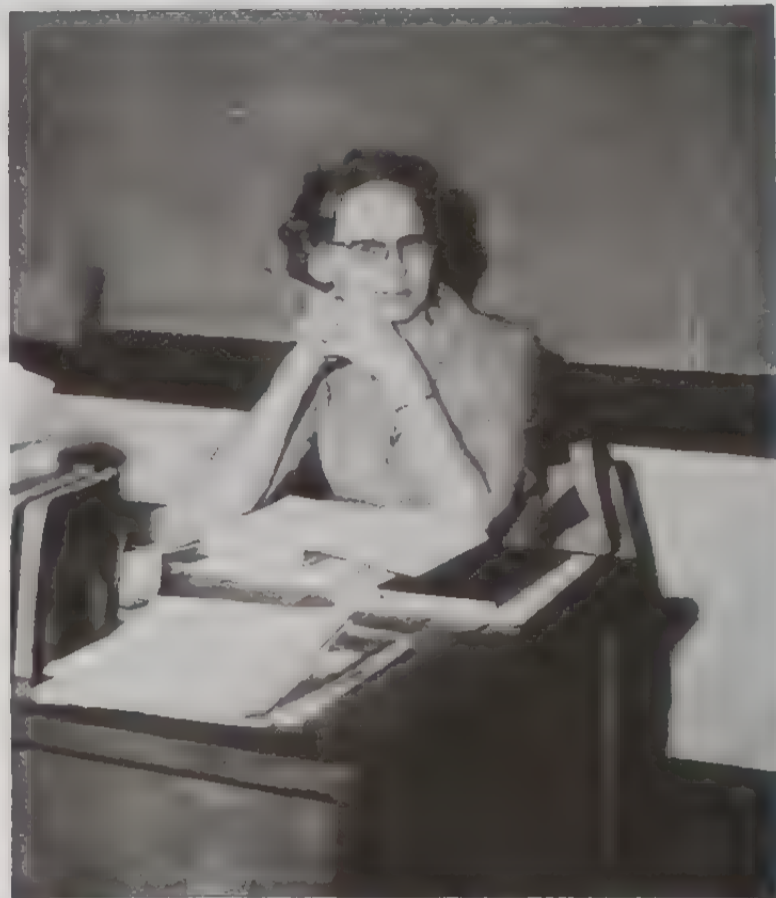
Guardians of Education . . .

As Juniors, our homeroom teacher again was Mrs.

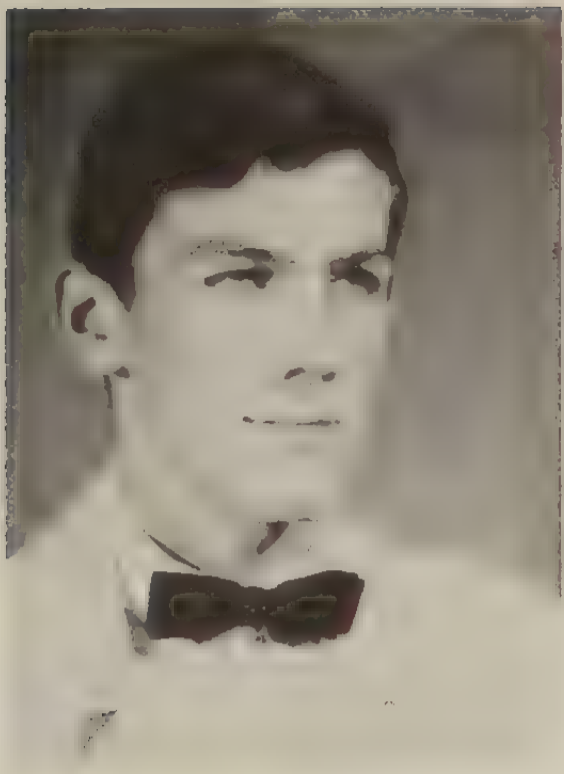

Preparing for Vocations in FFA

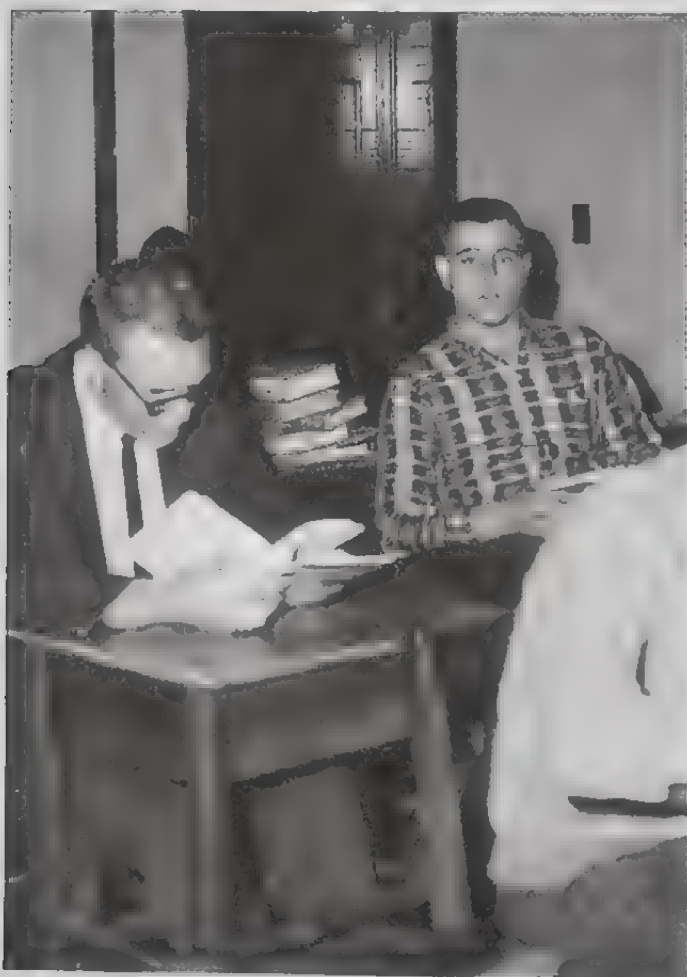
