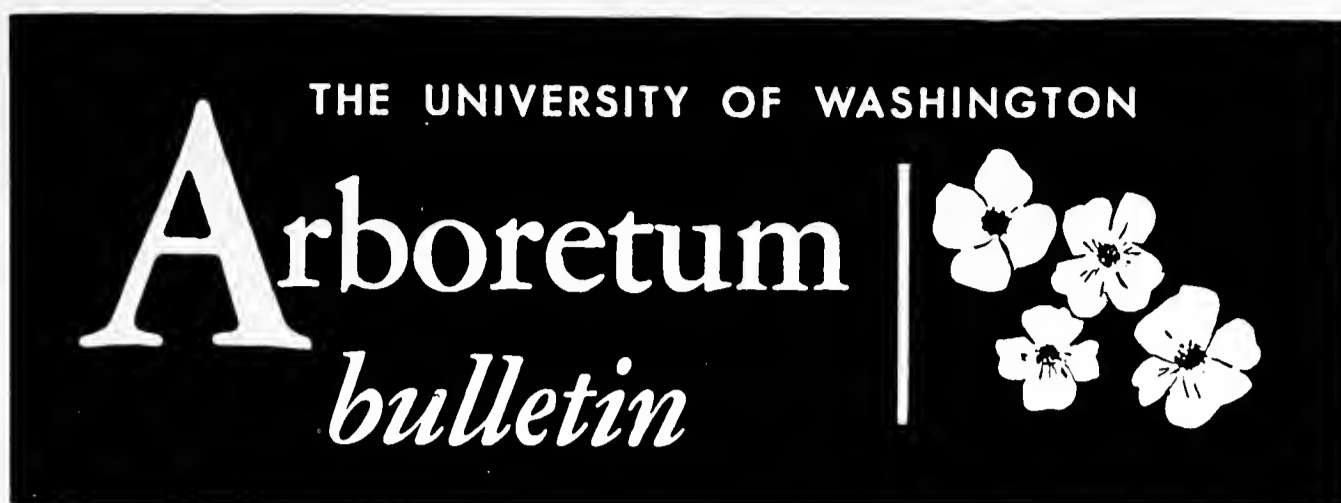

INTRODUCTION

The last cumulative index of the *Arboretum Bulletin* covered the years 1955 to 1964 (Volumes XVIII through XXVII). It was published in Winter 1965 (Volume XXVIII, No. 4).

For the years 1965 through 1973 (Volumes XXVIII through XXXVI) the Winter 1973 issue was reserved for publication of an index covering these years.

The present format consists of an AUTHOR INDEX and a SUBJECT INDEX. In the former, titles of articles are alphabetically arranged and indicated only by issue number. Book reviews are preceded by an asterisk.

The SUBJECT INDEX lists all items alphabetically by subject: articles by title, their subject (when the entries are not redundant), photographs and shorter references of interest, when sufficient information is given. All entries are given page references except titles of articles. All plants are listed alphabetically by their botanical names rather than under the broad categories where they were found in former indexes. Cross references are freely used to guide the reader to alternative subject headings.

Plants and Arboretum subjects covered by the columns "Some of Our Favorites" and "Arboretum Spotlight" are listed by botanical name or subject and are followed by the words in parentheses "Favorites" and "Spotlight" respectively.


