





OR the first time in the history of the South France Bulb Trade to our knowledge, this crop has been secured by foreign buyers or their agents at buyers prices. The crop was a large one, too large to dispose of at prices growers tried to obtain. Further, the American demand had been greatly reduced by the excess prices demanded by French growers in Fall 1922 and many liberal planters of these bulbs in the United States resented the high prices which made it impossible to wholesale the cut blooms at a profit. American importers in Fall 1922 found their orders reduced to 25%of early orders because of double cost. Overloaded with these high cost bulbs dealers had difficulty in disposing of their supply.

For this season of 1923, therefore, no American dealers were willing to again risk an overstock-all waited for a break in price which the big crop reports seem to insure. This Price Break came about July 14 and continued some days, may not have reached bottom yet (Aug. 10).





Formosum Cold Storage 10 Days

Growers must not force Formosum in great heat. A cool house, 60 to 65 degrees, with plenty of moisture is better, but they will certainly do best when grown in pots. The so-called Formosum seems to be a class rather than a single type, and starts into growth irregularly, so if in pots they can be shifted into sections representing varying heights thus giving the growing plants of different heights proper light and watering.

N. B.-Ten days in cold storage before planting is sure to benefit the crop.
