Grass, Farm, Bird and Clover Seeds, Onion Sets, Potatoes, Fertilizers, Raffia, Reeds, Mushrooms Spawn and Flower Pots are always net cash.

Garden Tools, Supplies and Insecticides, 1 per cent, 10 days, net 30 days.

CASH DISCOUNTS: We allow a discount of 1½ per cent for cash with order, and on sixty-day goods paid for within 10 days (excepting items sold for net cash, or so quoted).

DISCOUNTS ON STANDARD RETAIL PACKETS FOR RESALE

In no case will a discount be allowed on open account where the retail value of the order sent in at one time is less than \$1.00.

 We will, however, allow a discount of 40 per cent from the retail prices of packets (only) if a check for the full amount accompanies the order. The cost of entering such orders on the records and ledgers is too expensive.

On orders for packet seeds not on consignment that are for resale, discounts on prices in our **SPRING RETAIL CATALOG** will be given as follows:

BEETS

In general, beets may be planted about April 20 to May 1st in the vicinity of Chicago, and they will attain bunching size or cooking size in about 50 to 60 days. The bottoms and tops may be used for greens at an earlier stage. The dates given are for the bunching period when the beet is usually at its prime eating stage; size about 1¾ inches.

This seed starter must not be confused with the fragile, impractical pasteboard devices which have disappointed so many customers. This is a full size "flat," made of 28 gauge steel enameled green to last for years, which you will be glad to have in your sun parlor or living room window.

It makes use of two of the most recent scientific developments in seed starting: 1. Wick-feeding of water, which keeps the soil at just the right moisture, never drying out, never too wet, and never dripping dirty water from an overflow. 2. The use of sphagnum moss to prevent damping off of seedlings, highly recommended by the U. S. D. A.

As shown in the illustrations, water is supplied to the soil from a pan placed underneath the starter, by the agency of capillary attraction, through a fibre glass wick, the top of which is frayed and embedded in the soil, the lower end being immersed in water in the pan below. Any suitable pan, saucer, or dish can be used.

Fill this container with water daily, and the wick will do the rest. This method of watering leaves nothing to chance or judgment, and solves in the easiest imaginable way one of the most serious problems of seed-box management. CALADIUMS

Vaughan's Special Fancy-Leaved

Caladiums are easily grown but should not be put in a Carnation temperature. Start the bulbs in flats, turning them upside down, since this is a crown-rooting bulb and the roots come out around the top (center) eye. This direct contact with the growing medium produces roots more quickly than the opposite method. Use a mixture of one part leaf-mold, one part good garden loam, and one part peat moss or other coarse neutral material, throwing in a small amount of coarse charcoal or other rubble for drainage. Press the bulb halfway into the soil and place the flats under a bench. The flats can also be placed on top of the flows, but if this is done, they should be shaded. The temperature should be 80 to 85 degrees or higher, as the higher the temperature, the better starting results you will have. Be careful that the flats do not dry out if placed either on the flows or returns. Water sparingly until the bulbs begin to sprout and have roots 4 to 6 inches long. When the sprouts begin to show, place the bulbs in 5 or 6-inch pots, using a good rich leaf-mold. Water copiously when in full growth and use weak liquid manure once weekly if possible.
