## 1924 Dutch Crop Conditions

The Dutch Bulb Exporters' Association of Haarlem, Holland, writes as follows,: "On account of the short growing season, which is shorter than normal, owing to the wet and cold winter by which the ripening of the bulbs have been delayed, the exportation of bulbs will begin about eight days later than last year. For hyacinth bulbs the expectation is fairly good, but not as good as last year. The crop of the Darwin and late tulips is good, but that of the single and double early tulips does not come up to expectations. The crop of narcissus is good, that of crocus is moderate.
"The weather for the ripening of the bulbs has been favorable, so that we may expect to get bulbs, which though small, will be of good forcing quality."

## ANNUALS FOR FALL SOWING

Few know many of our prettiest and best known annuals may be sown in the fall, in fact some varieties, like the annual Larkspur, are much better, treated in this way. The principle is the one nature uses. Seed dropped from parent plants will lay dormant in the soil until early in the spring when it germinates and begins a root system long before one can get in the ground to sow seed. Consequently the flowering season is prolonged by the earlipi blooming. Ground should be prepared and seed sown just previous to the late heavy frost-early in November.
