Vick's Pink Enchantress A Superlatively Beautiful New Variety



Although we have a number of novelties this year, we propose to give the most prominent page of our Aster Book to this exquisitely beautiful new variety.

Its color is a soft delicate pink, so popular in the Pink Enchantress Carnation. Notwithstanding its delicate shade the color remains practically fadeless during the life of the flower.

Vick's Pink Enchantress is upright in habit, as distinguished from the branching form. The plant is very vigorous and produces freely long, strong, graceful flowering stems for the support of numerous large marketable blooms. The flower itself is always full double; petals are of medium length and very broad. Those towards the center fold in very regularly, while gradually, towards the outer edge, the petals stand out more and more until those on the outside recede from the center, thus increasing the diameter of the flower, which compares favorably in size with the largest flowering kinds on our farm.

The general effect of the loosely arranged, delicately colored flower is indiscribably soft and pleasing. The rare combination of desirable qualities in this new production attracted the favorable comment of every florist and seedsman who visited our farm last summer. The farm number of this novelty "1050." was copied into many note books belonging to florists who expect to procure some of this seed for next season.

There is no other variety, of the same season, with the possible exception of Vick's Royal Pink, which can compare with Vick's Pink Enchantress in grandeur and beauty.

Probably Vick's Violet King has won more prizes in the last few years than any other variety. In many markets it has frequently been the only dark colored late variety to find any sale; in others, it has frequently furnished good

marketable blooms where other varieties have failed. There are few Florists of any prominence who do not grow this handsome Aster.

The habit of the plant is similar to Vick's Branching; vigorous in growth with numerous long, stiff flowering stems.

In form the flower is distinct from every other variety; petals somewhat resemble the quilled varieties, but are much larger and broader, those in the center being fantastically twisted, curled and incurved, completely covering the crown. Season, midsummer to frost.



Two Splendid New Asters

Ever since we introduced Vick's Violet King Aster, we have endeavored to get a full set of colors in this splendid type of flower. The appearance of the brilliant Rose King was encouraging but after all it was the light colors for which we were most eagerly working. At last we have two new light colors; White and Lavender-Pink.

Every person acquainted with Vick's Violet King or Vick's Rose King will appreciate the importance of these new Asters. They have the same narrow petals as the older varieties, although not quite so closely folded. This gives the flower a somewhat softer appearance. The illustration shows perfectly the type of flower of White King: large full centered, pure white.

Vick's Lavender-Pink King is similar to Vick's White King in type of plant and flower, differing only in color which is a beautiful lavender-pink, very much like the now famous Rochester Aster.

In season Vick's White King and Vick's Lavender-Pink King bloom with the Late Branching, and have all the vigor of that famous class of Asters. Plants, however, are upright in growth, differing in this respect from Violet King and Rose King. Stems are long, and very free from side shoots. In the field this summer there were any number of plants with flower stems from 14 to 20 inches long.

The flowers have the splendid lasting qualities characteristic of the King Class of Asters. Because of their extra good shipping qualities they are sure to win high favor among commercial florists.

Frequently growers select seed stocks from flowers grown for market, only to be disappointed in results. The reason is clear: seed from overfed and overdeveloped plants frequently reproduce plants which are weak and sickly, especially if planted on the same soil.

Wie Leading Mid-Season Comet Asters

There is a rapidly growing demand for good Comet Asters of large size and long stem in the Cut Flower Trade; without the slightest doubt this class of Asters will continue to grow in popularity wherever dis-

played. The main difficulty has been to find Comet Asters of sufficient substance to stand shipping. While we do not claim that Vick's Mikado Asters will stand more abuse in shipping than any other classes, they are in our estimation superior to any other strain of mid-season Comet type.

The flowers of this variety are large and full and of good substance; the curved and twisted petals resemble hugh Chrysanthemums and are borne aloft on long stiff stems, from eighteen inches to two feet in length.


The blooming season is most opportune, coming between the extra early and late sorts, thus enabling growers to have Asters of the Comet type from early summer until cold weather.

The rapidly growing demand for these varieties has made necessary an increased acreage on our farm each season. This year we have doubled our crop over a year ago and are therefore ready for a large trade. We do not advise growers to use Mikado Asters exclusively, but we do urge every fancier of good Asters to put in a reasonable acreage; we are sure they will prove satisfactory.



The petals are narrow, very long, and gracefully reflexed. The outer petals show to their full extent, while gradually towards the center they bend and curl across each other in magnificent disorder.






"A Mile of Asters"

As a rotation of crops is necessary, some of the helds this year were planted to Gladick by Jishins or the crossed trops. Belund the woods to the right we had several acressed to Drummondin Grandshora which we believe surpassed anything else of the kind in the country. The famous Eric Canal, shown in the left hand corner, skirts the entire length of the farm, of which not much more than half appears in the picture.

In our estimation, this is the best bedding Aster we have ever seen. It is especially attractive where a summer hedge is desired. In color, which is a bright, rich cardinal, it makes as brilliant a showing as Scarlet Salvia. The plants are strong and vigorous, and yield flower stems most profusely. We offer a new strain this year vastly superior to the parent stock, which is unique in that the centers of the flowers are filled with partly tubular petals which prevent the



appearance of yellow centers, even when the flowers are old. This Aster will show a good color longer than any other variety. The blooms are round and full, and grow in such abundance that the plant resembles a huge bouquet. The plant photographed contained over thirty blooms. Although we recommend this Aster especially for bedding purposes, it will give good satisfaction for cut flowers wherever there is a sale for dark colors. 
A good many Aster growers prefer the general type of Upright Asters to the Branching form. During the last few years there has been a growing demand for seed of the upright type in all classes, early, medium and late, whether of the Comet or Branching type of flower. Therefore, Vick's Early Upright fills part of the demand for this class. The plants of Vick's Early Upright grow compactly, with long, erect flower stems, quite free from side shoots, and yield eight to twelve marketable flowers. The blooms of this variety are considerably above the average in size, and have a solid, compact, ball-shaped appearance, so desirable in good shipping Asters. The crowns, or centers, are completely covered. Petals are of medium length, quite broad and of good substance.

Many florists find that they get more flowers, larger blooms and longer stems of Vick's Early Upright than they can grow, in their soil, of other early kinds because it grows as vigorously and yields as abundantly as any of the late varieties. Although we have catalogued this variety for three years, we have yet to hear from a grower who has been dissatisfied.

There are two colors, White, and Lavender Pink. The latter is a beautiful shade, very similar to Vick's Early Branching Pink. When the flower first opens it is almost white, but in full bloom the prevailing color is pink, shading to a decided lavender pink tint on the outer petals. Both are excellent colors for any wholesale market.

As Stated on the opposite page, the Upright Aster is a comparatively new, but exceedingly important, form of growth in the Aster family. Vick's Late Upright possesses all of the good points of this class. The plant grows very compactly, sending the flower stems directly upwards, on long, firm, strong stems, sometimes two feet or more in length.

The plants cover less ground than any of the Branching varieties, and affords better opportunity for cultivation and other work in rows without damage to the flower stems. The stems show less tendency to droop than almost any other variety, and consequently the flowers are less liable to be spoiled by storms or other causes.

The flowers in both form and size resemble Vick's Branching Asters, being large, symmetrical, double and full to the centers. The flowers always command high prices in the wholesale markets, They bloom about the last of August. The demand for this seed is rapidly growing.

This strain of Asters is getting better every year. Flowers are larger and more numerous; stems are longer; plants more vigorous.

This year we have a new color: Vick's Late Upright Lavender Pink. The bloom closely resembles Vick's Lavender Pink Branching but shows more color in the opening flower. The plants are strong and leafy, showing great vigor. In season it is about the latest of all our Asters.



We believe that the Hohenzöllern and Mikado Asters are the best and most highly developed strains worked up from the old-fashioned Comet Asters. 
