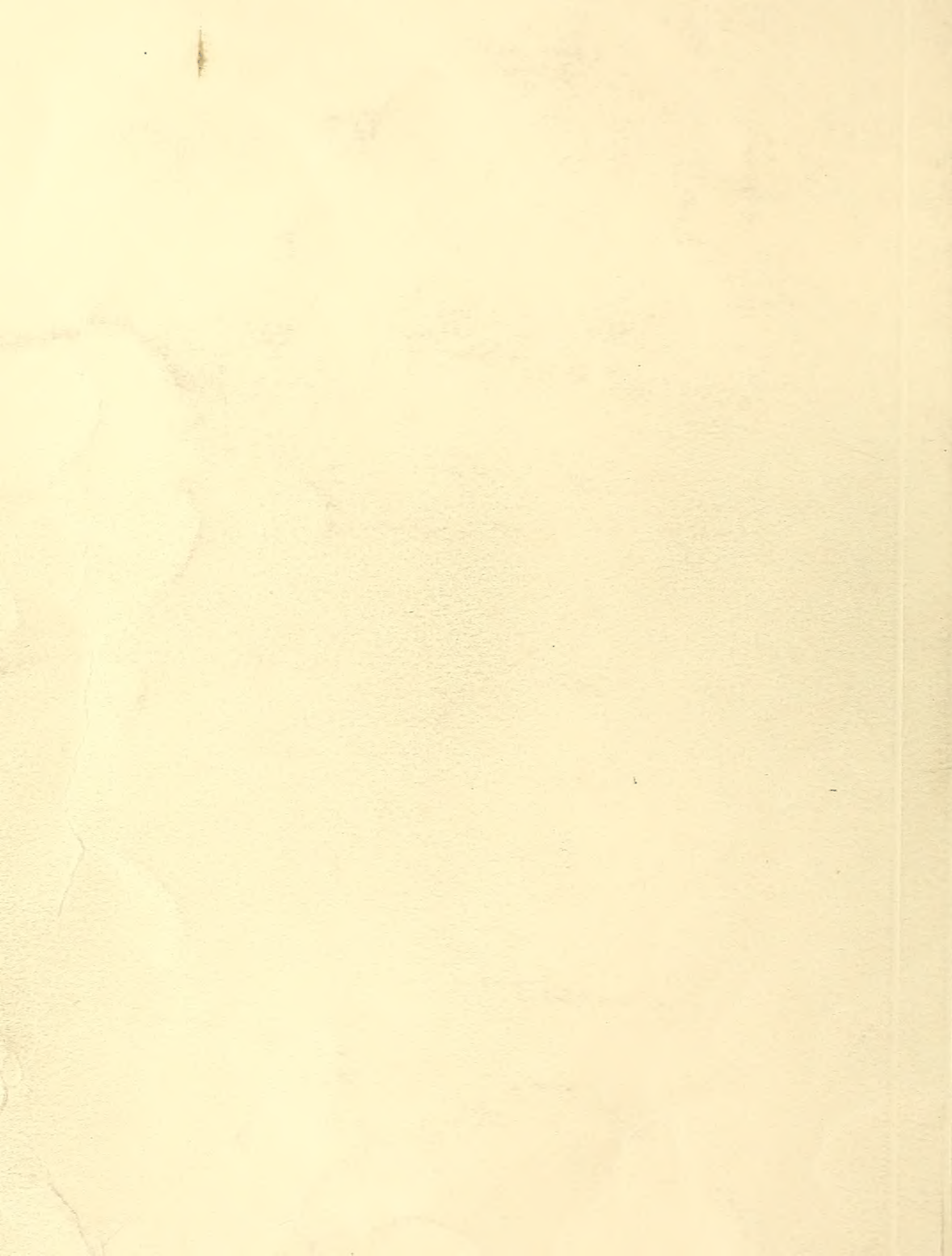

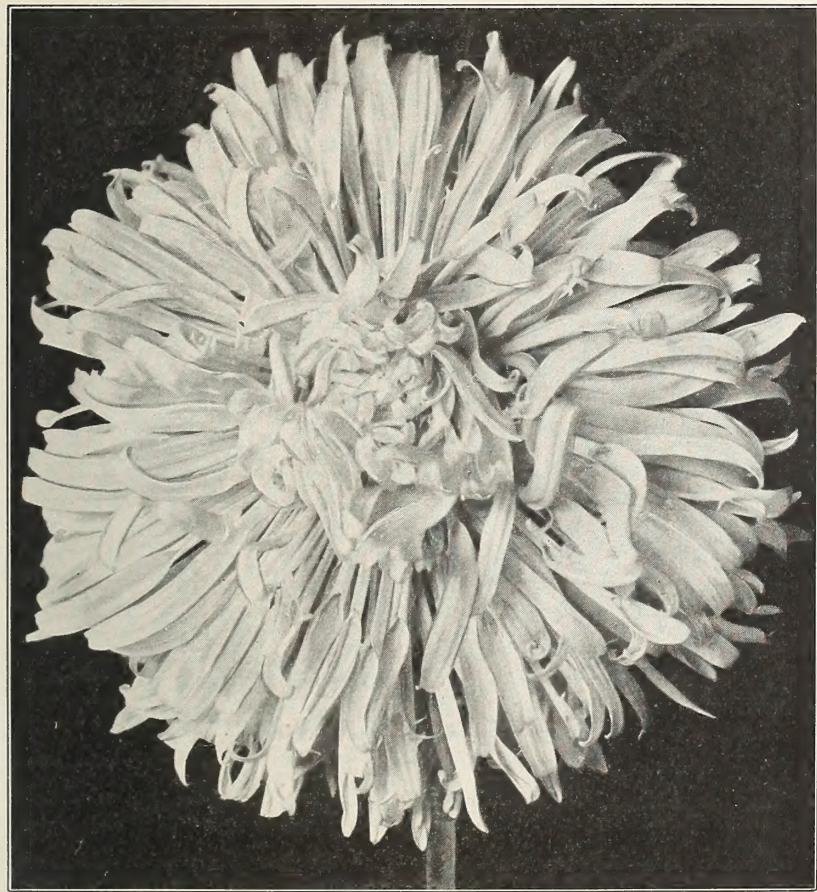

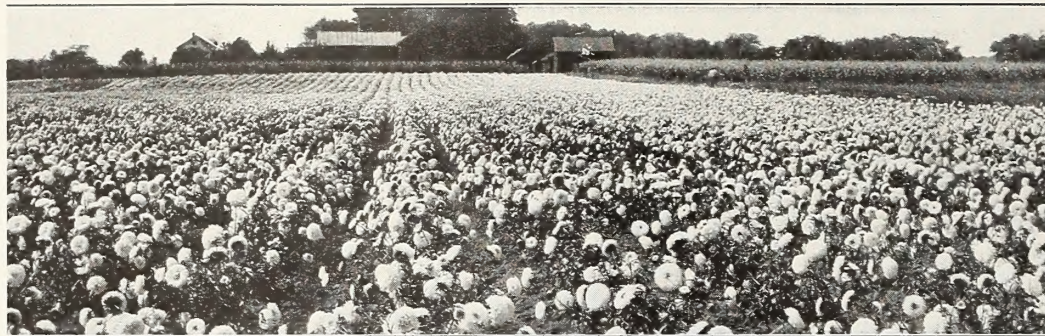

We guarantee that your order will arrive safely, and we guarantee the vitality and purity of our seeds and bulbs to the full amount of their purchase price. You can have your money back any time within the year if you are not satisfied with the results. Since much depends upon weather, soil, and cultural conditions, it is expressly agreed that in no case shall James Vick be liable for more than the actual amount of money paid for the seeds and bulbs.

When goods are not to be sent by parcel post, please give complete shipping instructions together with the name of your express or freight office, and on which railroad you wish goods shipped. This will assure correct routing.
