Captain Thomas Roberts of Waterford, R.N.; born at Waterford, Katherine, day, of 12 January 1778; entered the Navy in February 1790, as a Supernumerary on board the "Swallow," 14, lying at Plymouth; served in the Mediterranean as Midshipman 1793–96, in the "Cyclope," frigate, and "Bedford" and "Audacious," 74's, all commanded by Captain Davidge Gould; in the "Cyclope" he assisted at the reduction of Bastia in May 1795, and in the "Bedford" he fought in Hotham's actions 14 March and 13 July 1795; he was made Lieutenant 24 December 1796 in the "Serpent" sloop (Captain Richard Buckall); from 5 January to 5 July 1797 he was employed on the coast of Africa, and during that period he aided in taking a felucea which had been despatched from Cadiz for the purpose of apprising the South American trade of the commencement of hostilites between France and Spain, and afterwards contributed to the capture, among other vessels, of a French transport laden with naval stores; appointed Commander of the "Serpent" by Sir Hyde Parker, and sanctioned by the Admiralty 23 July 1798; in the following year, owing to ill health, was sent home as whipper-in to a fleet of 113 West Indiamen, under the protection of the "Regular," 44, bearing the flag of Vice-Admiral Richard Rodney Bligh; on the renewal of hostilities in 1803, he was one of the first appointed to raise sea fencibles in Ireland, and remained on that service until it was abolished in 1810; Post-Captain 1840; appointed Receiver of the Leper Hospital Estate in the county and city of Waterford 10 September 1840; died 16 February 1855, and bur. at the French Church, Waterford.
