To all and synguler as well Nobles and Gentilmen as others to whom these presents shall come, Robert Cooke Esquire, alias Claren-Principall Herehault and cieux Kinge of Armes of the Sowthe, Easte, and Weste partes of this Realme of England, from the River of Trente southwardes, sendith Whereas antiently from greetinge. the beginninge the valiant and vertuous Actes of Worthye Persons have ben commendid to the Worlde with sondry monumentes and remembrances of their goode desertes, amongst the whiche the cheefeste

and moste usuall have ben the bearinge of Figures in Shieldes, called Armes, whiche are evidente demonstrations of Prowes and Valor diversly distributed according to the Qualities and Desertes of the Persons: whiche order as yt was prudently deuised in the beginninge to stirre and kindell the Hartes of Men to the Imitacion of Vertue and Noblenesse, even so hath the same ben and yet is, continually observed, to the ende that suche as have donne comendable service unto their Prince and Contry eyther in Warre or Peace may bothe receave due Honor in their Lives and also derive the same successively to their Posteritye after them: and beinge credibly informed by the Reporte of diuers Gentilmen worthye of credit that John Comber, of Shermanbury, in the Countie of Sussex, Gentilman, hathe long continued in Vertue, & in all his affaires hathe so vertuously behaved himself that he hathe well deserved & is worthy to be from henceforth admitted, accepted, & receaved into the Nombre of other aunciente Gentilmen, for remembrance whereof, I, the saide Clarencieux Kinge of Armes, have, by Power & Authoritie to my Office annexed, by Letters Patente under the Greate Seale of Englande, deuised, orderred, and assigned, unto and for the saide John Comber, Gentilman, the Armes and Creaste hereafter followinge, that is to say, Golde, a Fesse Daunce Gules, between three Starres Sables; and to his Creaste, upon his Heaulme, on a Wreathe Golde and Sables, a Lynxe's Heade, Coupe; Golde Pellate, manteled Gules, doubled Argent, as more playnly appeareth depicted in this Margent: To have and to holde the saide Armes and Creaste to the saide John Comber, Gentilman, and to his Posteritie with their deue difference, and they the same to use and enjoy For Ever, without Impediment, Lett, or Interruption of any Person or Persons; In witness whereof,

I, the saide Clarencieux Kinge of Armes, have set hereunto my Hande and Seale of Office, the Sixteenth Day of June, Anno Domini, 1571, and in the xiij<sup>th</sup> Yere of the Reigne of Oure Sovereigne Ladye Elizabeth, by the Grace of God Quene of Englande, France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, etc.

#### Dear S<sup>r</sup>

#### Kirkby-moorside Apr. 18th 1775.

If your Attention to the Ensigns & Memorials of Kings, & those who draw their Honours from Kings, will permit you to attend to the Enquiries of a Country Cousin, I shall be glad to know if you have past the Time, since we had the Pleasure of visiting you in your snug Apartment, in Health & Happiness? But tho' 'tis realy matter of Pleasure to me to hear of my Friend's Health, I do not know whether I sho'd have at this moment put you to the expence of a Post Letter to gratify that curiosity; as we co'd have indulged ourselves in that Pleasure by Enquiry, which we never fail to make, when we write to Wakefield, whither my Wife means to write soon. For to confess a Truth, which I almost blush to own in this generous & disinterested age; (but which I choose to own, because I know your Penetration wo'd discover it;) I am a little actuated by Interest, having a Favour to ask. To the Point then; I am not able to discourse in the Dialect of your Office so clearly as to convince a Coach-Painter, that my Wife & myself belong to the ancient Families of Arbuthnot & Comber. I wo'd give you as little Trouble as possible, & therefore, if you can describe in Words as much as will enable the said Artist to perform a little Job, in his Way, I beg you will not give yourself the Trouble to sketch any thing out. And I dare say you will easily do that, with regard to the Arms; as we can show him the Impression of a Seal for all that will be wanted. Only we shall want to know how they are to be connected. When you were want to know how they are to be connected. When you were so obliging as get my Seal cut, you omitted, I believe, nothing. But won't it be sufficient to use the Comber's Arms without the Thornton's for me. I think I sho'd rather like it if you permit. And what must be used for my Wife's & how placed? You know She had no Bro: neither had her Mother who was an Hassell. I think one wo'd have it as simple as your Rules permit with Propriety. There are two Families of the Hassell's; one, (as a Person of that Name in Cornhill told me,) has three Phaons or Pheones: the other of which my Wife is has a Snakes or some Pheons; the other, of which my Wife is, has 3 Snakes or some kind of Reptiles. But I will seal this with the Arbuthnot's & Hassell's Arms, her Father & Mother's. Upon the whole I think I can make the Artificer understand his Work well enough, if you will only be so good as tell us, (in Terms that he or I may understand,) what Family arms ought to be used, & how connected. But I think I must beg you wo'd take the Trouble to scratch out the Crest; as I think none of the Painters or Engravers here have ever had a good Pattern since Mr Johnson gave my Bro. the Patent for it; as we never knew the name of it before. The sooner your Convenience will allow you to oblige me, the great the Fayour.

I heard last Week from my Sister; & they all I understand are pretty well. I find She has been in hopes of seeing London this Spring; & if She does not I am afraid it is a Disappointment to you all. Mrs Lumley probably will not go down to them yet; as I fancy her good man is in Town; pursuing Measures to bring

[Vol. 7, p. 145.] We spent about ten Days very agreably at Buckworth. I am glad, Sr Wm Wake is confirmed in his Seat; an upright Senator is a character of real Dignity now a Days. Her Ladyship has been very kind in writing a long Letter to my Wife lately; & I must soon acknowlege the Receipt of one from  $S^r$   $W^m$ . At the assizes I had the Pleasure of hearing of our Friends at Wakefield & Bank Top by Mr Mawhood, (I believe his Name is,) the Dep. Clerk of Peace's Son; & by Mr Fenton. You wo'd see, in the Papers, an account of Mrs Hudson's (her whose Name you show'd me in your Book's,) Festins. It was realy very brilliant. She lodges at the Cockpit. And the large Room, (which at certain Times is a Cock-Pit;) was illuminated with a large Number of Lustres, (generaly used, when the Room is open as a Summer Card-Assembly Room;) & with Numbers of Silver Candlesticks. There was a Sideboard, half the length of the Room; against the Wall, on which were 3 silver Urns, spouting Orgeate, Lemonade, &c. Variety of Wines; Cakes of all sorts; Confectionary Ware in the most fanciful Stile; Sweatmeats; Pears, Grapes & Pine-Apples. But alass! alass! two Hogshead's (so says Fame,) of Ice dissolved by the Way. The Chimney Piece decorated with Myrtles, &c. Ten or a Dozen Card Tables at Whist & Quadrille; two or three large ones at Loo Commerce & Lotteries Ticketts. Six or eight Servants out of Livery attended, & sollicited Appetite with frequent offers of Tea, Sweetmeats &c. The Company realy supposed near 300, & all genteel. About ten the Music struck up; an hint to the Carders to finish their Pools; Cold Chicken, Sandwiches &c placed on the Sideboard; & Lord Falconbridge, with the Lady of the Day began the festive Dance. Now whatever you Folks, that live within the Smoak of the Pantheon may think, we Yorkshire Folks think this a wonderful fine thing. We have, I think a Promise from our Wakefield Friends of a Visit this Summer; & hope you will be down, & accompany them. In the mean Time I remain, with my Wifes Compts
