
Memorandum made the 6th day of November 1840 to certify that we the undersigned have compared the enclosed with the original and know it to be a true and correct Copy thereof.

The document is now in the possession of Mrs. Harriett Sheppard (the 2nd daughter) of No 8 Dorchester St. Bath.



To all and Singular to whom these Presents shall come Sir Charles George Young, Znight, Garter Principal King of Arms, and Joseph Hawker, Carenceux King of Arms, of the South, East and West Parts of England from the River Trent Southwards, send Greeting: Atherens Sir George Hayter, of Stratford Place, in the Parish of St Mary-le-bone, in the County of Middlesex, Knight, Principal Painter of History and Portraits, and Principal Painter in Ordinary to Her Majesty, Member of the Academy of St Luke in Rome, Professor of the Royal Academy of Arts in Florence; Member of the Pontifical and Ducal Academies of Bologna and Parma, & Corresponding Member of the Royal Academy of Arts in Venice, hath represented unto The Most Noble Henry




