

## The Voyage Out by Virginia Woolf (1882-1941)

Published in 1915, The Voyage Out is the first novel by Virginia Wool, and considered one of her wittiest social satires. Rachel Vinrace embarks for South America on her father's ship and is launched on a course of self-discovery in a kind of modern mythical voyage. The mismatched jumble of passengers provides Woolf with an opportunity to satirize Edwardian life. The novel introduces Clarissa Dalloway, the central character of Woolf's later novel, Mrs. Dalloway.



THE VOYAGE OUT

E. M. Forster described The Voyage Out as "... a strange, tragic, inspired book whose scene is a South America not found on any map and reached by a boat which would not float on any sea, an America whose spiritual
