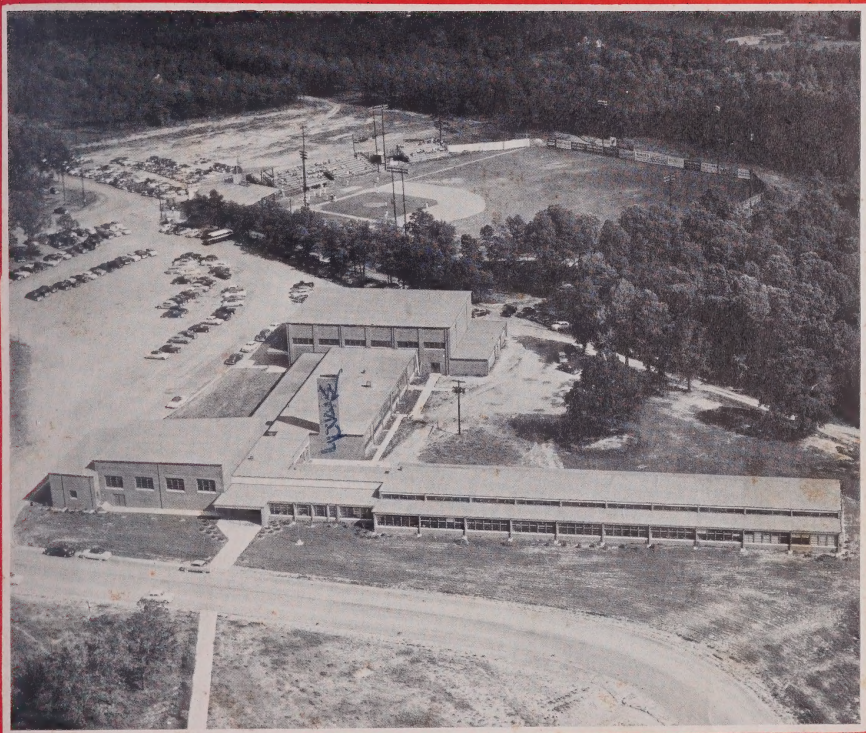




THE WAG '55

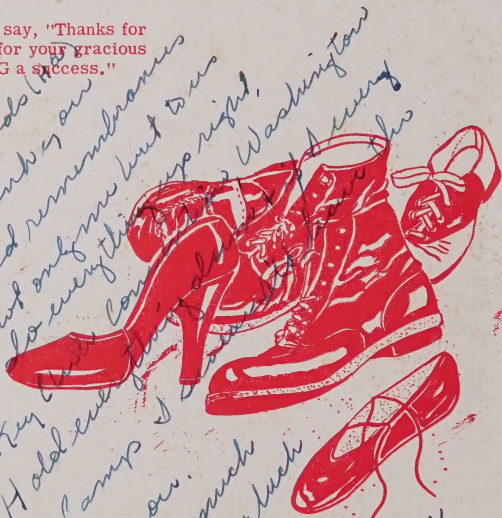
Foreword
