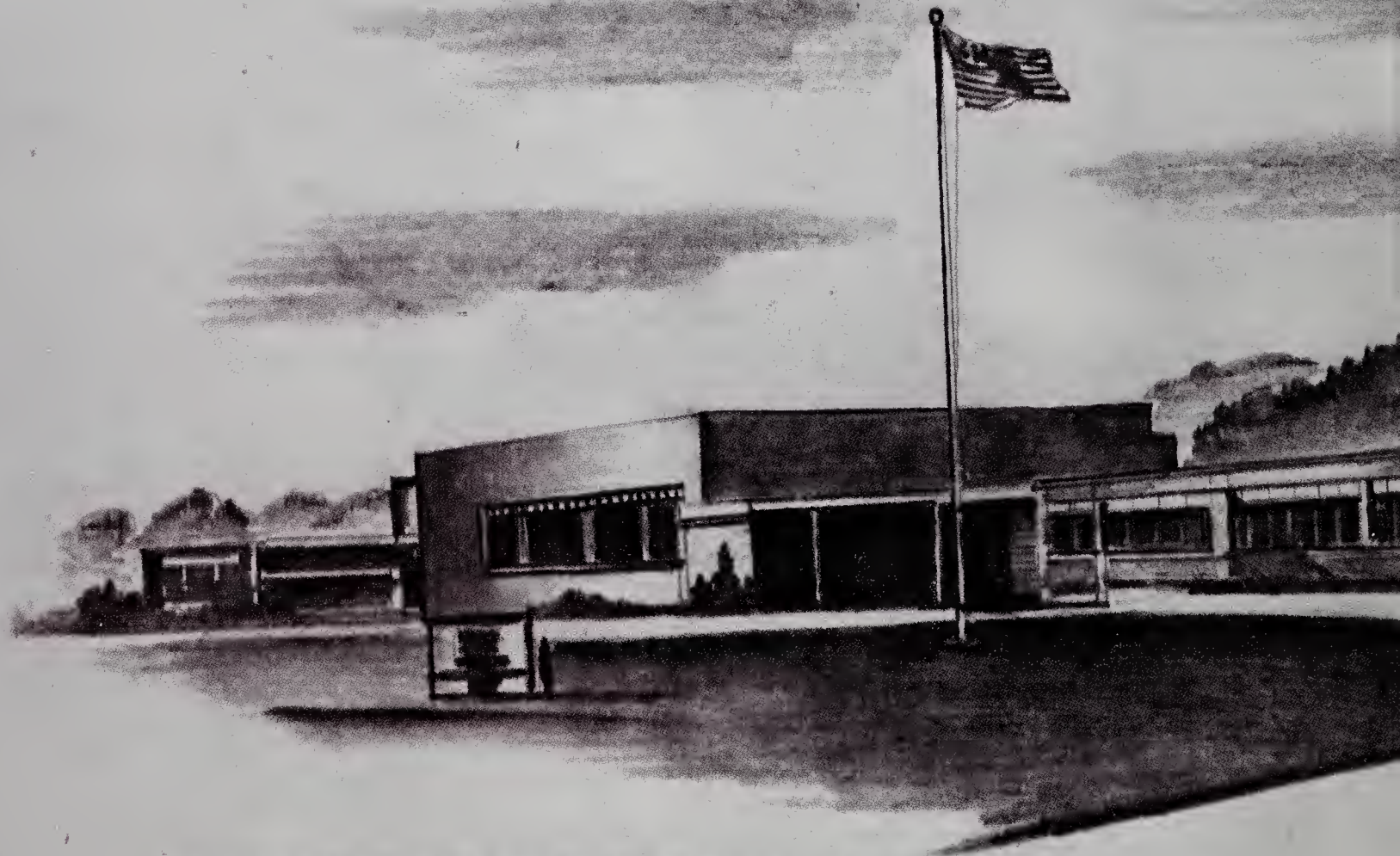

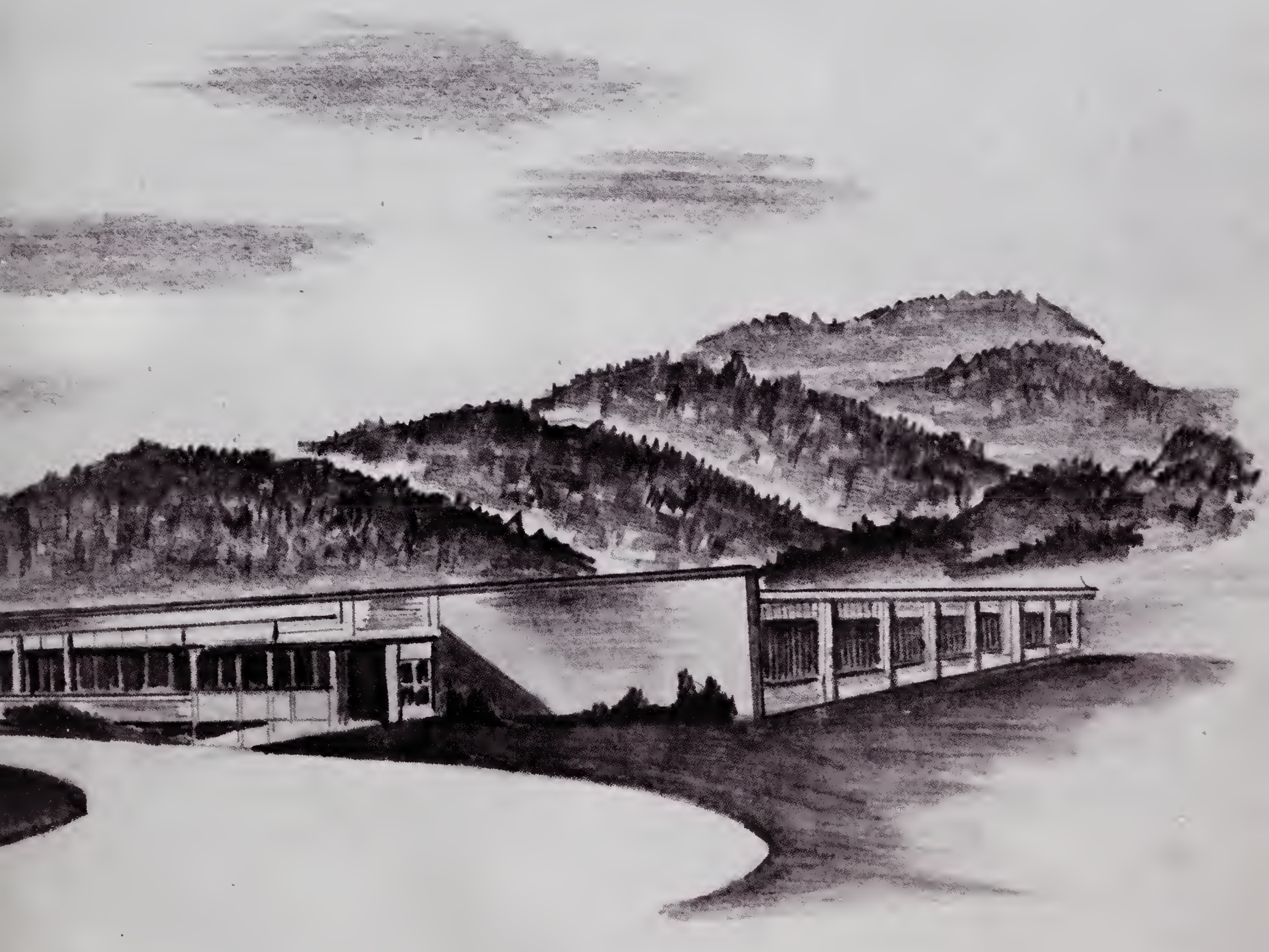

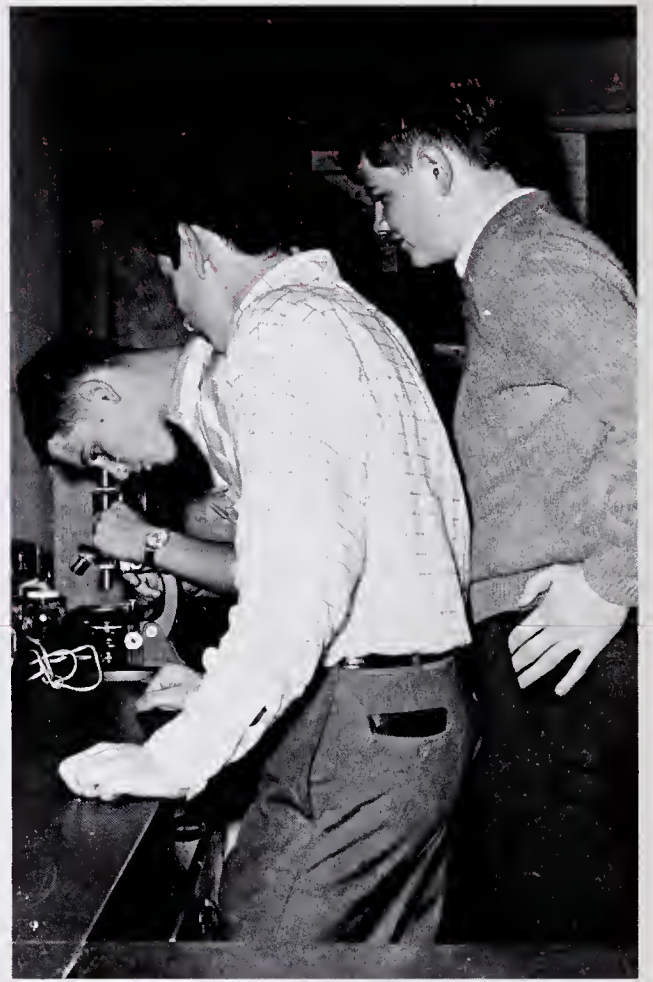

English

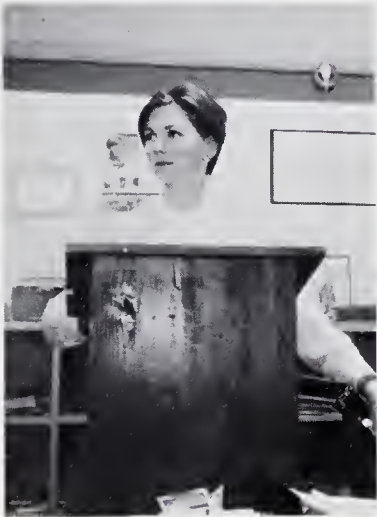

The mathematics department has a curriculum that fits the needs of any high school student. Business math is offered to the commercial students who wish to enter the business world directly after graduation.

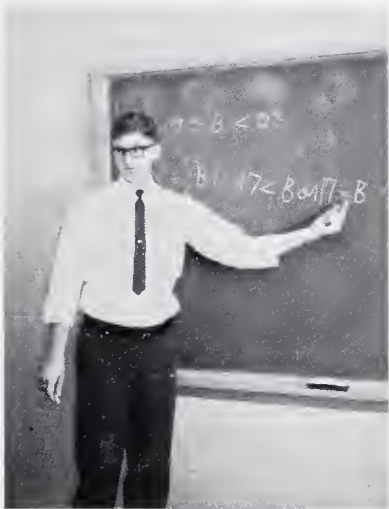
College preparatory students follow the courses of Algebra One and Two, geometry, and advanced math. These courses prepare the students who wish to go on to college.



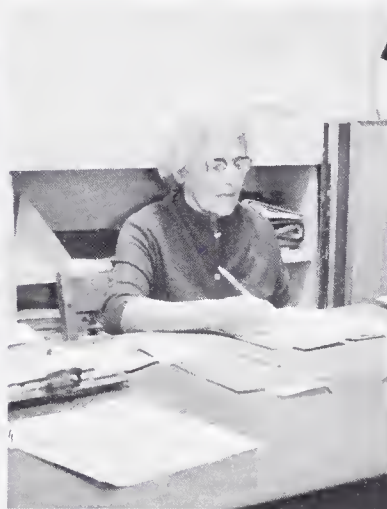

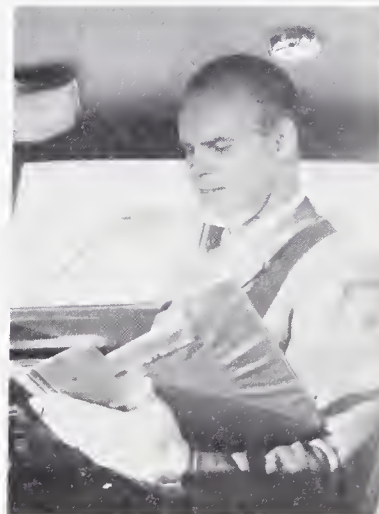

Driver Education

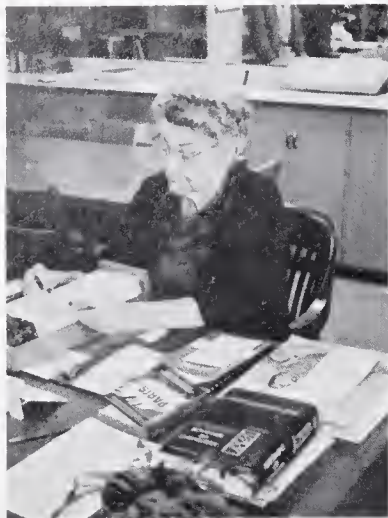

It has been a privilege to coach and be associated with these fine young ladies.

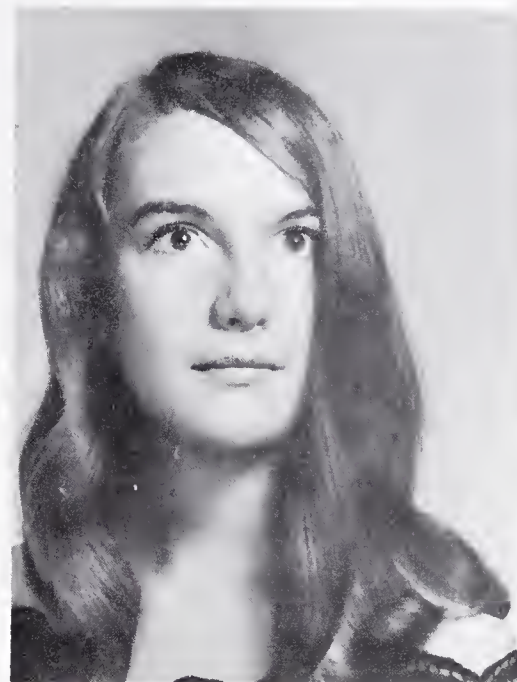

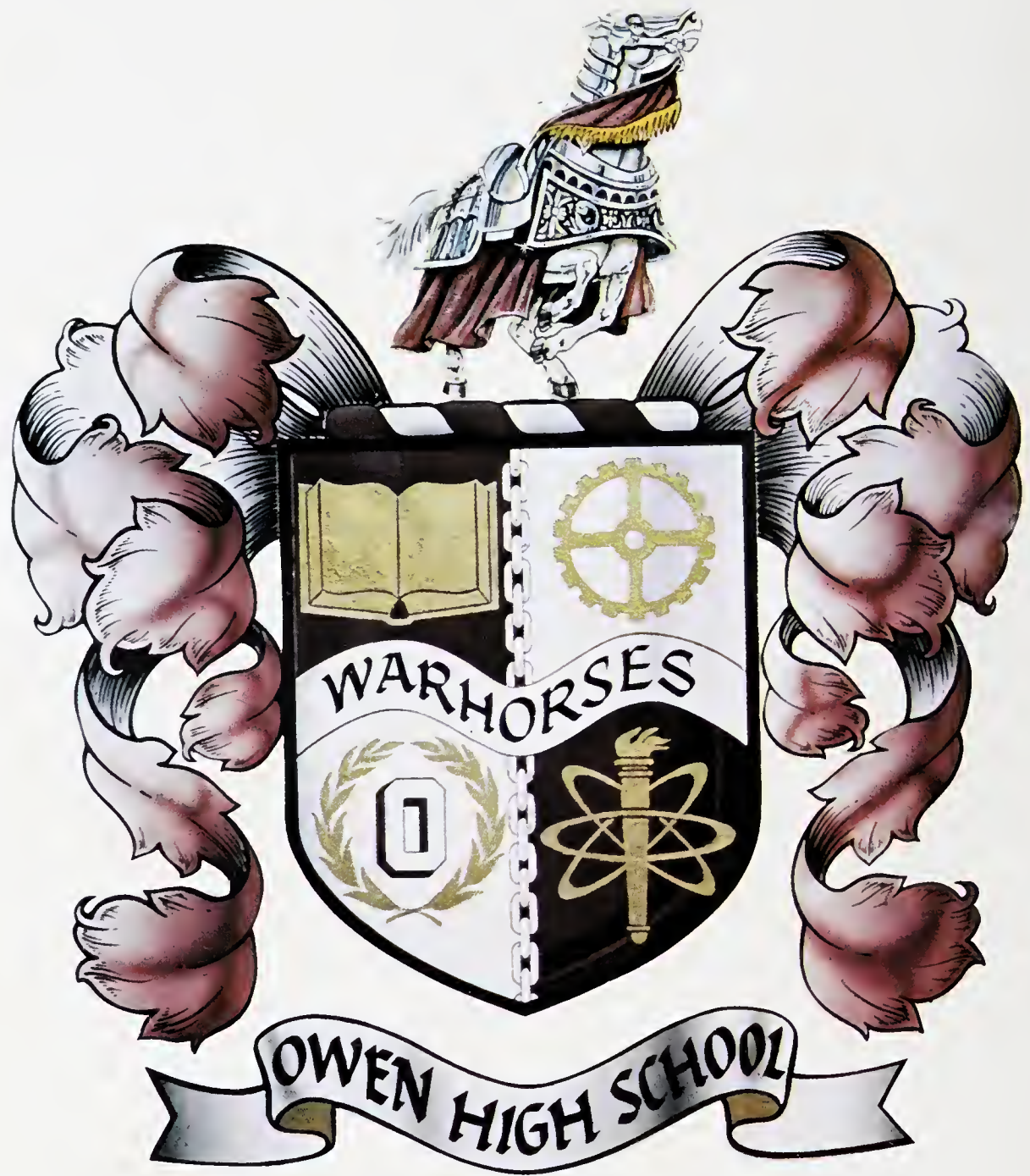


Editor's Farewell
