



If you are weary and tired and sad Do something for others and make them glad. Stick through your job through thick and thin, Turn all around and begin again.


The world wasn't made in just one day, There's lots we can do on the rugged way. So let's face the future with hope and cheer, And a thought of the goal toward which we shall steer.

Now we look behind at what we've done, The battles fought, the victories won. We rejoice at last that we've done our best, Now our talents will be put to the test.







Soon we shall be the first to wear the new blue graduation gowns. Soon—very soon—we shall graduate as seniors from a school of knowledge to become freshmen in the school of life. What happens then? Only time will tell, but among our memories will always be the dear old days at John Graham High.

Buddy Gibbs coaches football at Duke University.


Johnny Greene joined the Navy when school finished. He is now an admiral.






