If we are ambitious, will bring success.

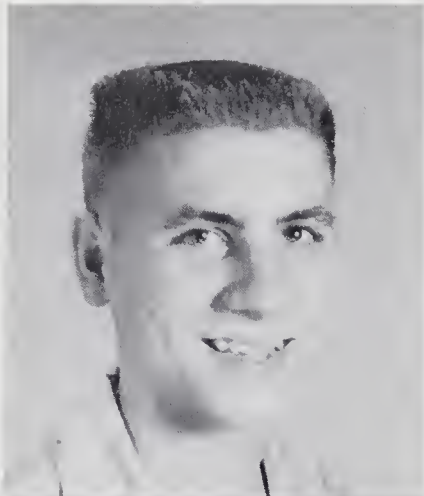
