John Graham advanced to the regional state championship game against James Kenan and was in the game until the final quarter when the Tigers scored three touchdowns and handed Warrenton its second straight loss in championship play.

Warrenton placed five players on the All-Conference team: First Team, Steve Clark, Fullback; Billy Rogers, Center; Rickie Etheridge, Guard; Second Team: John Coleman, Halfback; Roddy Drake, End. Three Yellow Jackets received state recognition by being selected to the All-East Team: First Team, Steve Clark; Second Team, Billy Rogers; Third Team, Roddy Drake.
