TRI-CAPTAINS

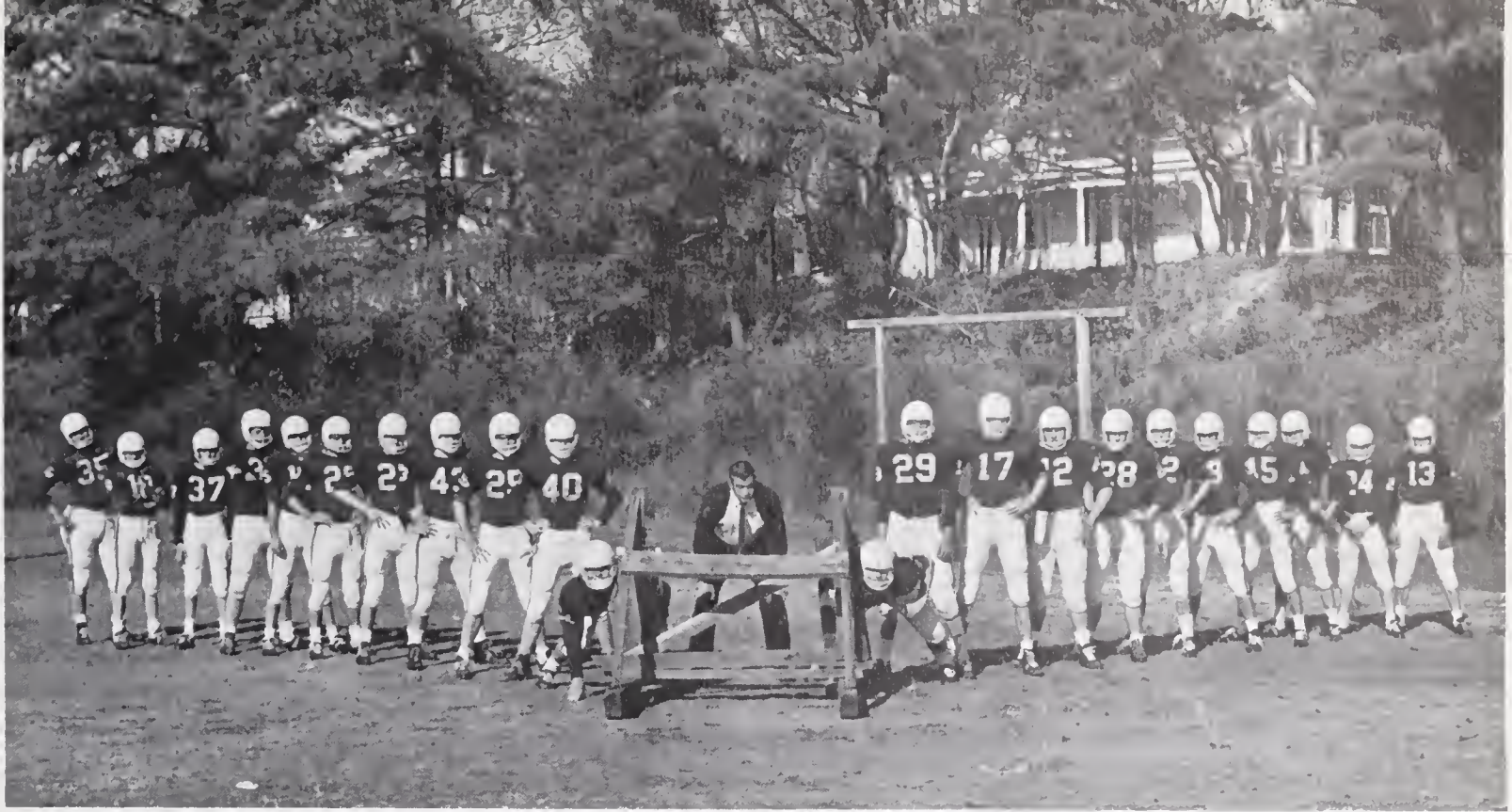

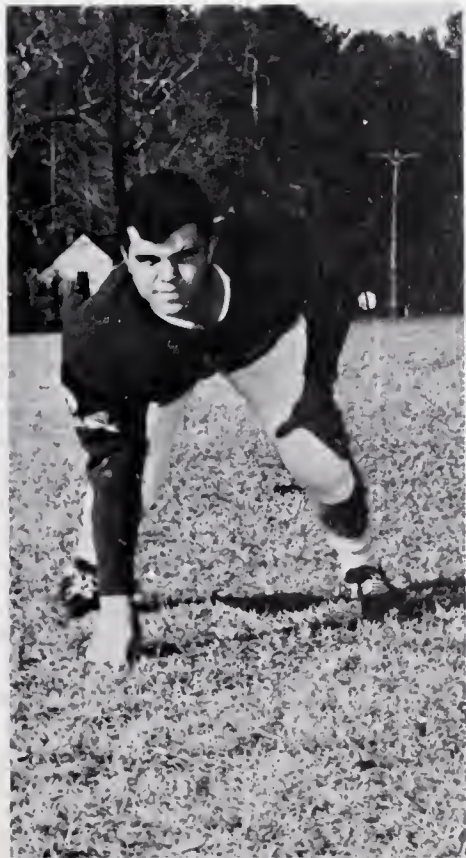

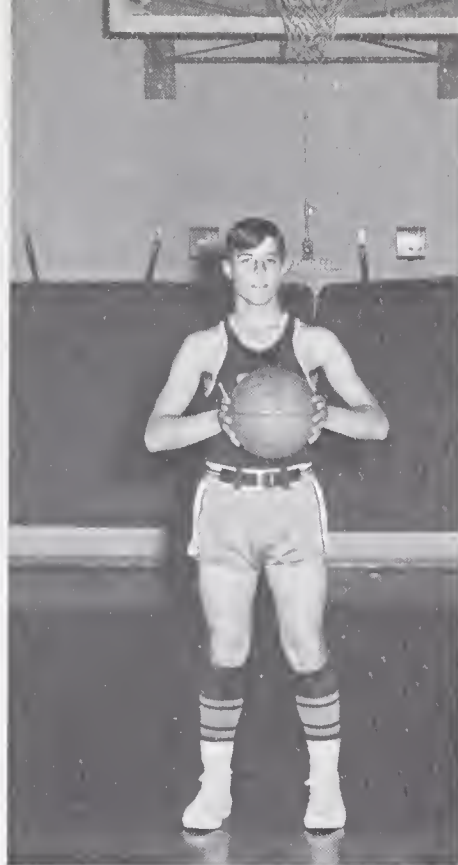
