WALTER BELLAMY PLAYS IN FIRST ANNUAL SHRINE BOWL GAME

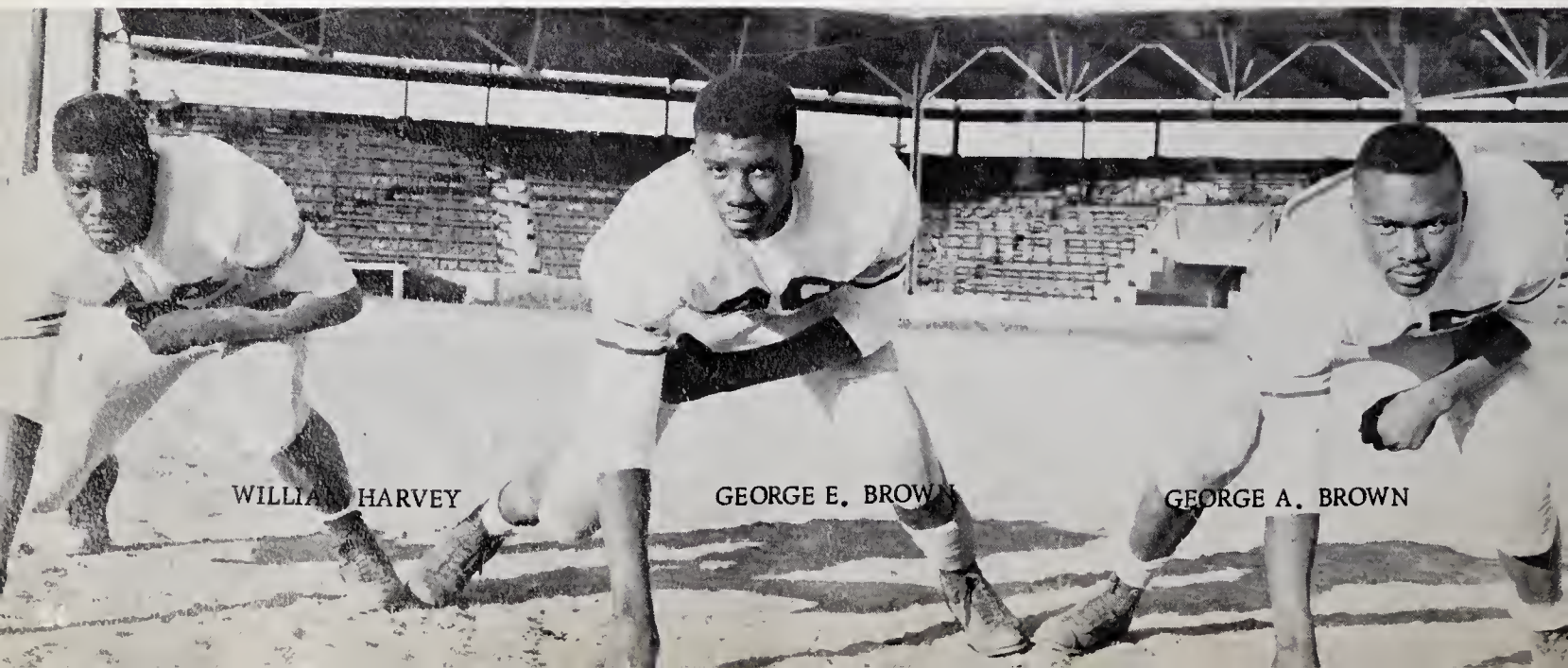
