Principal's Message



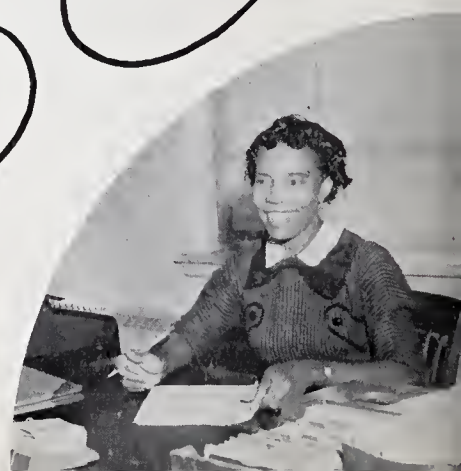
"Education is the torch that destroys the fear in the heart of us."

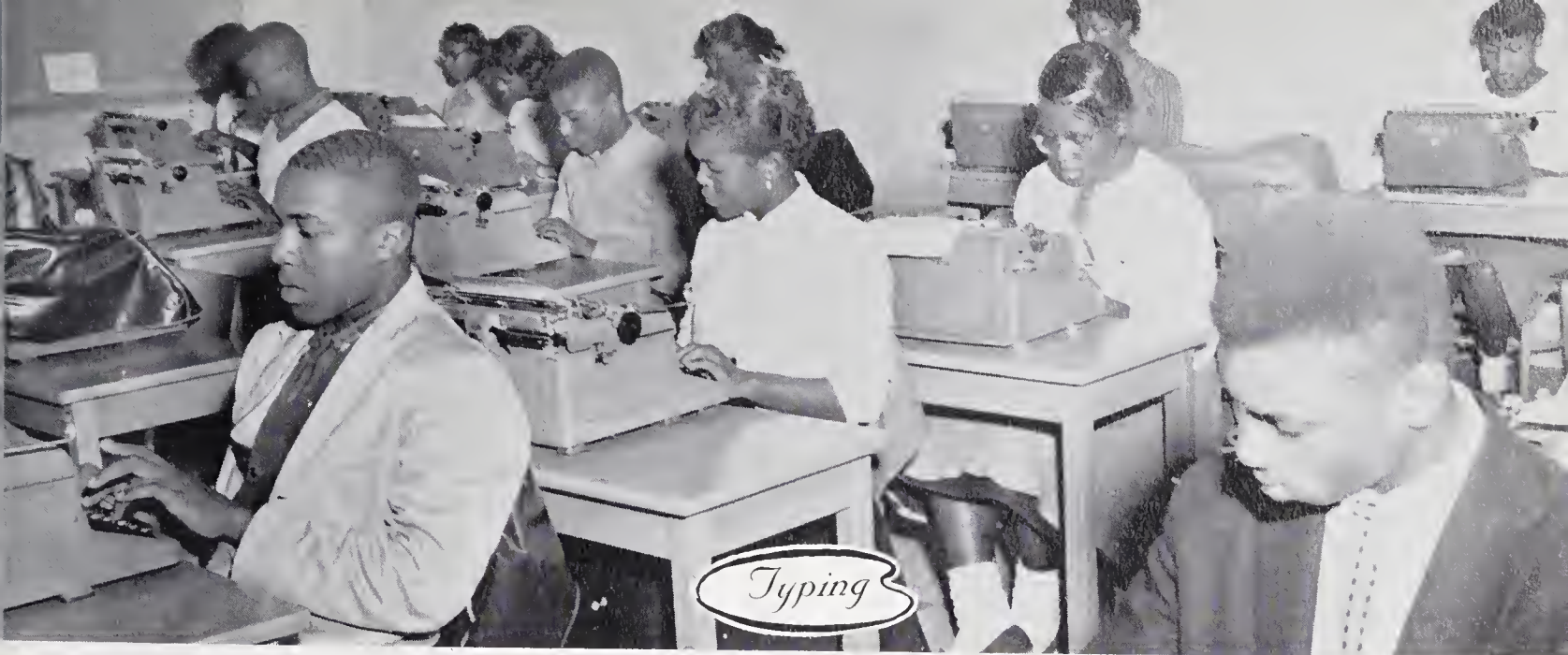

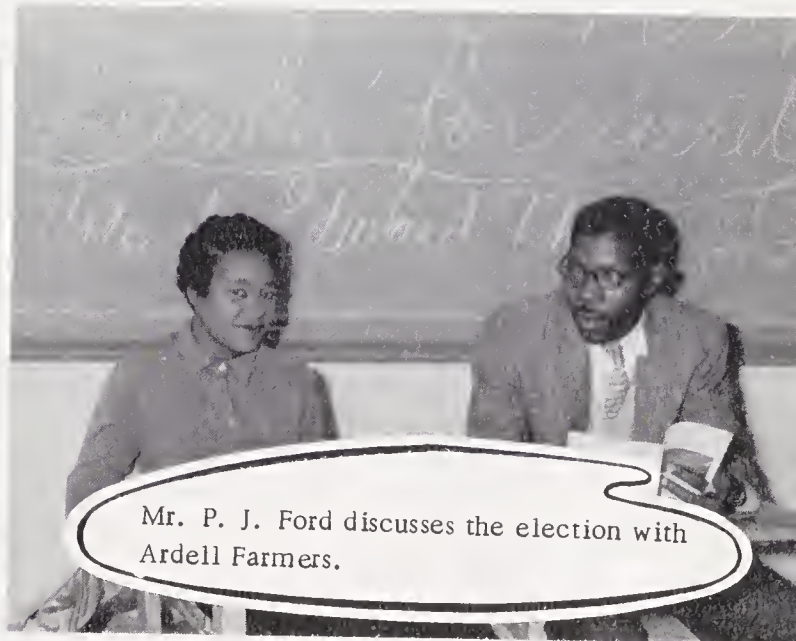
