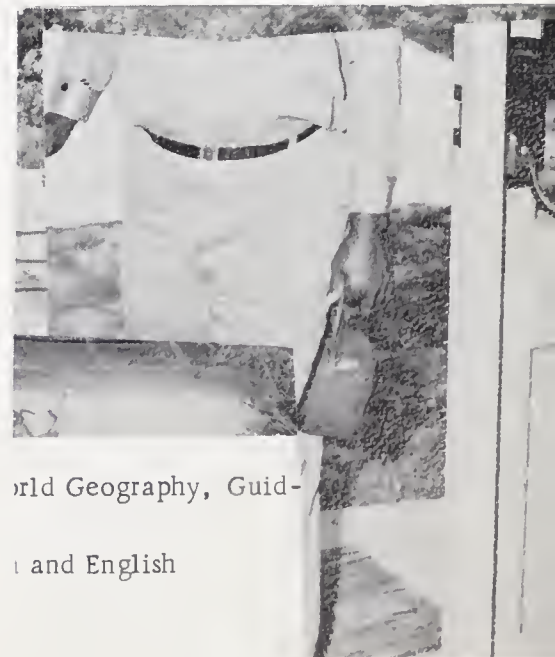
Principal's Message

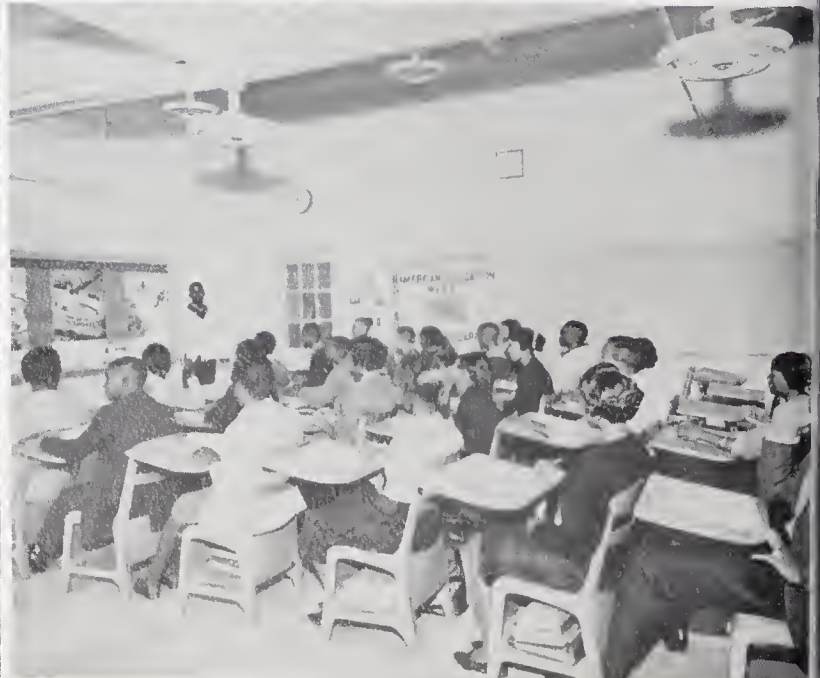

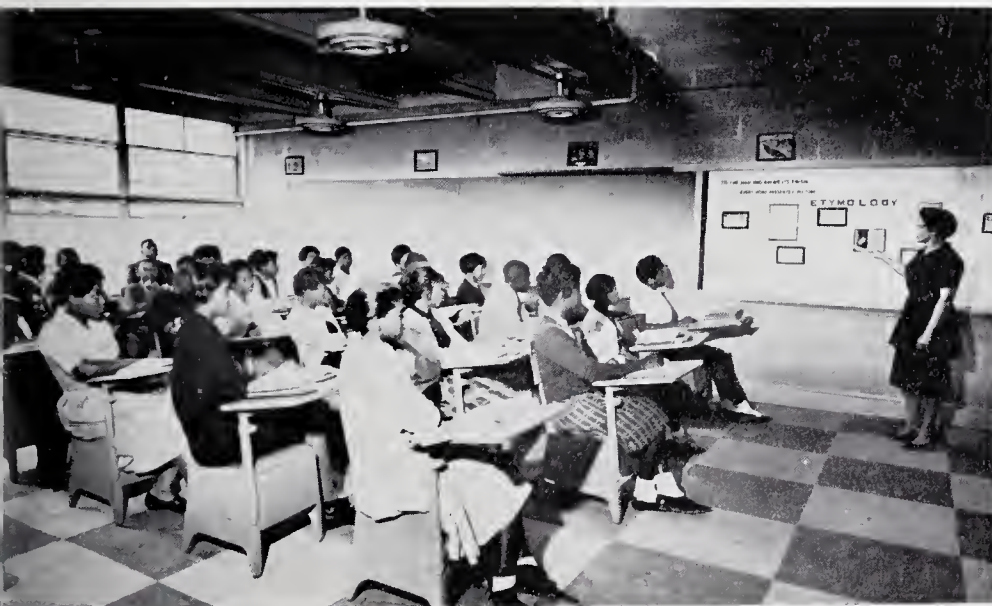

It has long been said of life at Barber that it is merely one meeting after another. While this is, no doubt, true of all schools, we can not help but feel that it is much more so at Barber than at most.

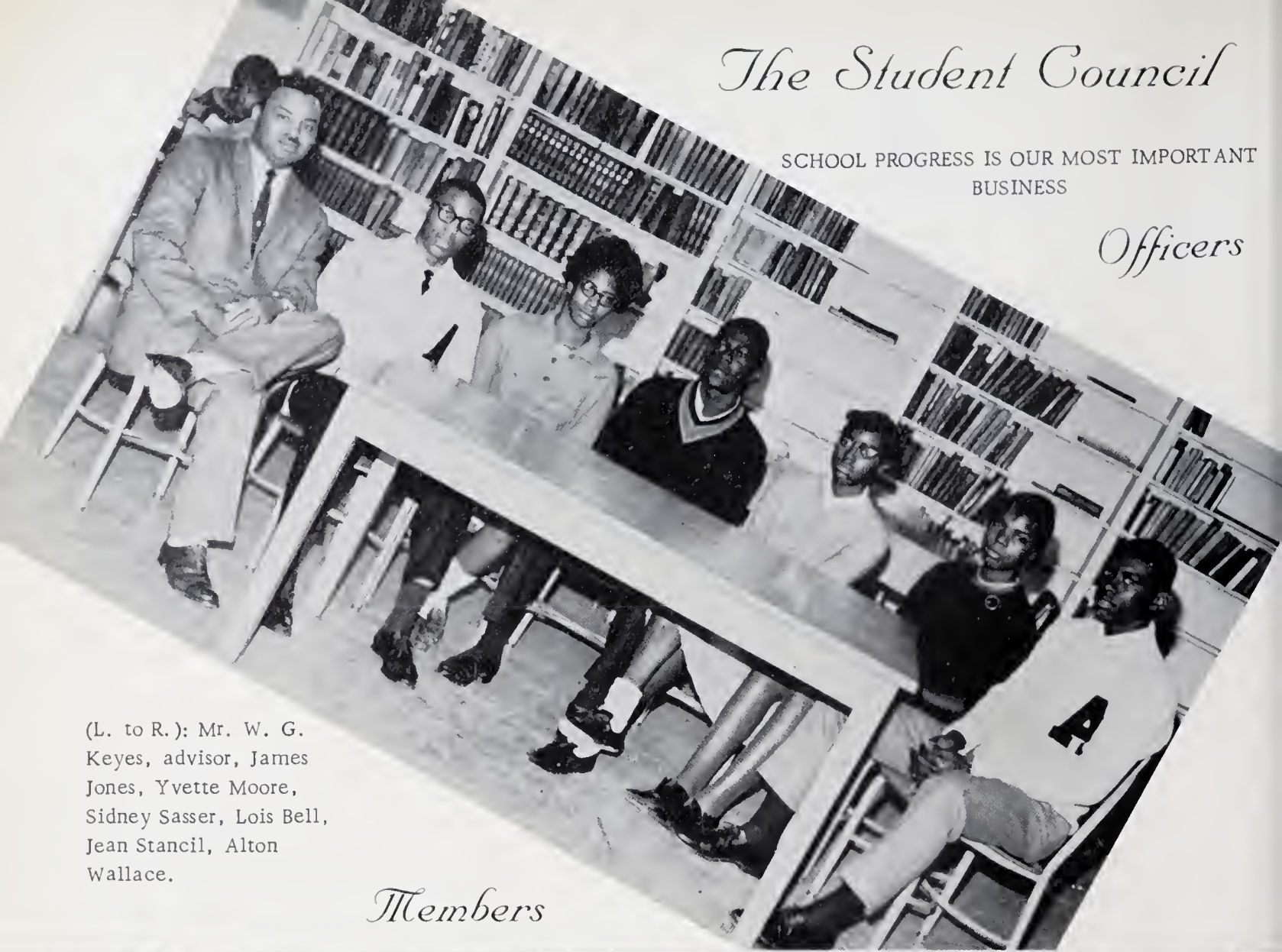

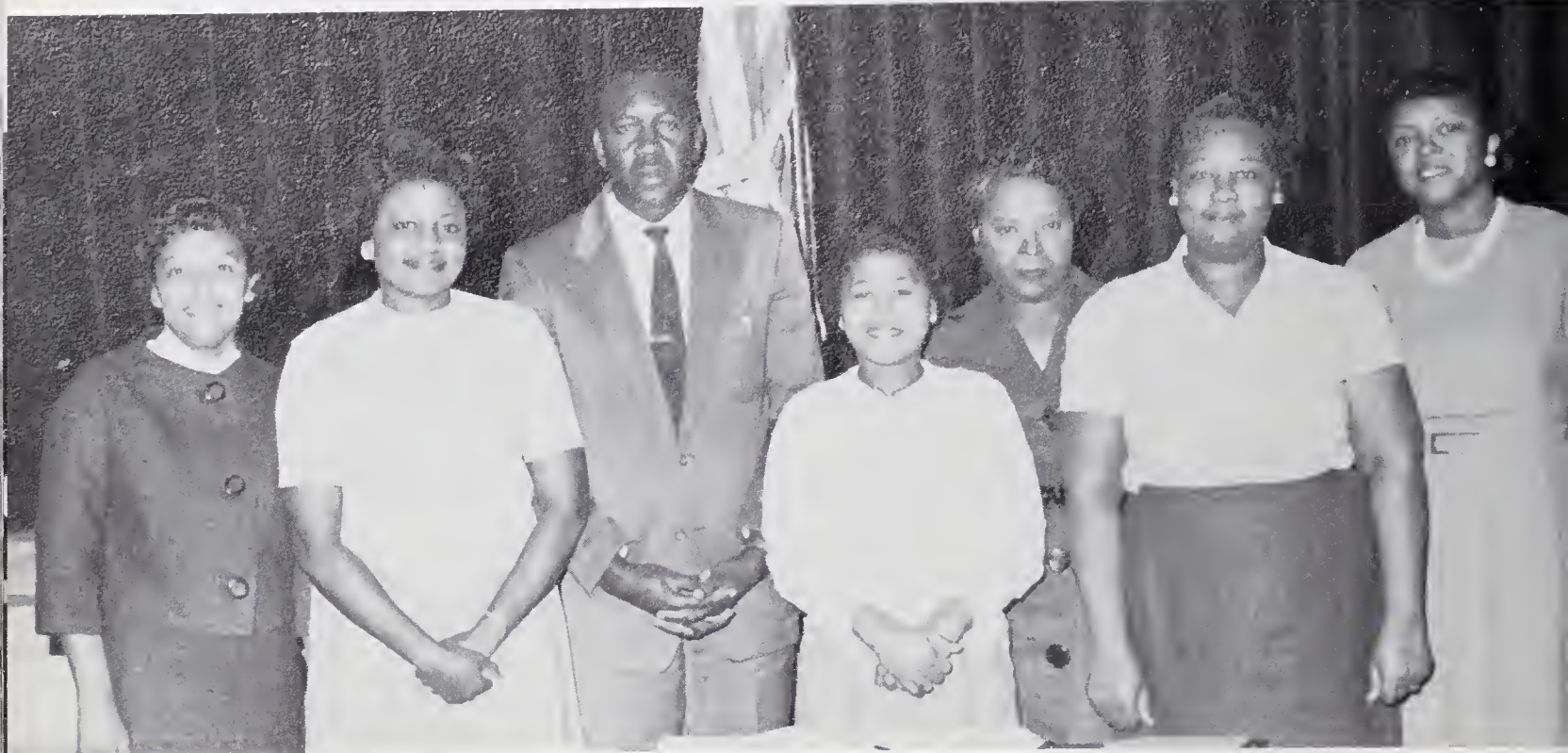

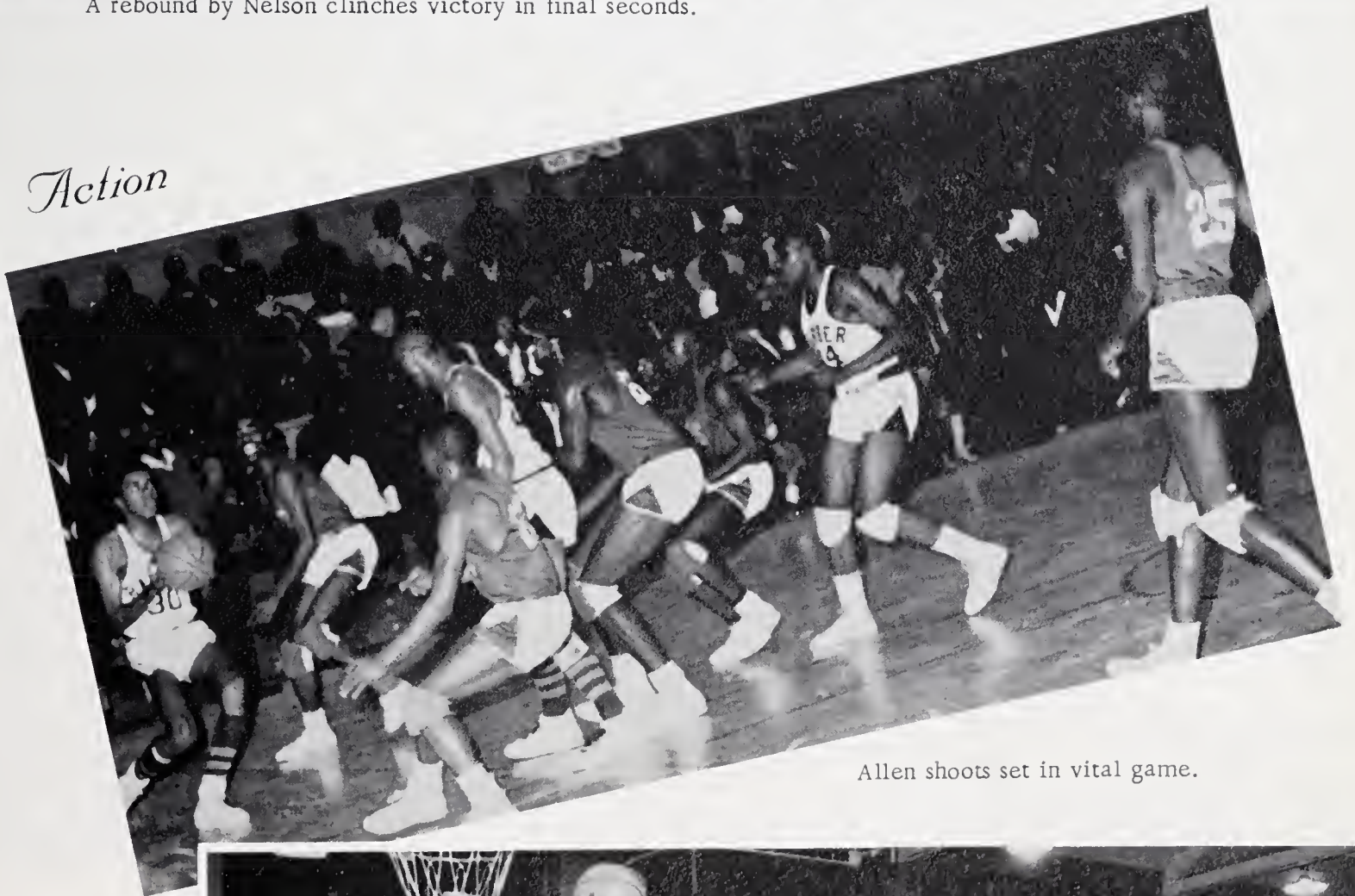
