I have the horour to actnowledee the receipt of your "Ietter Munt。 8288 / 04 of the 2nd. instiant enquiring on what princiole the municipal Comissioners contemplate such a charge as $\$ 35$ a month tio cover the cost of the extension of the water main in Napier o CIung Roads and io stete that the Botenio Cardens, which the extension of the main is intended to serve, are outiside the area within whioh the municipal Comissioners are empowered to Ievr a water rate as defined in Section 87 (6) of the Ordinance. The Comaissioners have no present intention of extonatig the main in the direction of the Botanic Gardens and considered that they should be recouped for their expenditure in layine a further leneth of pine at this end of the town wher the need for the extension of the water supply in other parts is more pressing.

The action of the Commissioners in asting for a speotal payment to cover part of the expenditure involved in laying the main is not peouliar to this case but is the principle usually observed in deeline with all apolicetions for a water supply in districts where in consequence of more urgent demands elsewhere mains would not be laid for some time to come. Should the main laid as far as the Botanio Mardens become a source of additional revenue or should it, be further extended to meet the requirements of the neighbourhood. the contribution now asted for from Government" would be modified.
3. I may, a,Iso remark that the rate which it is now proposed to charee for water to the Botanio cardens is 20 cents per I, 000 gallons, the rate at which it is supplied tro Government buildings and nots at 50 cents per I, 000 geilons, the rate fired in the Schedule of Rates for the private suop. -Iy of water by meter to Recreation crounds.

4．The Commissioners mould fur her observe that if a main be laid as proposed，it mould be impossible to guarantee that there would be sufficient pressure to enable the water to rise tho the level of the Band－stand as show on the plan or even that there would be a regular surely of wetter．
