HISTORY

In 1867, Reverend S.C. Alexander and the Reverend W. L. Miller saw the need to establish an Institution to educate freedmen in one section of the South and as a result, plans were devised to secure the institution. The movement for the school was formally inaugurated on April 7, 1867, at a meeting where the two ministers were elected as teachers. The first eight acres of land were donated by a wealthy Charlottean, Colonel W. R. Myers. In 1924, the institution was recognized by the North Carolina State Board Of Education as a four-year college.

In 1932, the University's charter was amended which provided the admission of women to the senior division which made the University partially coeducational in 1941. In 1944, Johnson C. Smith University joined the United Negro College Fund. Between 1955 and 1968 was a time of expansion of the physical plant and enrichment of curriculum. Seven new buildings were erected during this period. Since 1968, the structures that have been renovated are: Wilbert Greenfield Hall, Lionel H. Newsome Humanities Building, Robert L. Albright Honors College, and the Irwin Belk Complex.

The mission of Johnson C. Smith University is to provide an outstanding education for a diverse group of talented and highly motivated students from various ethnic, socioeconomic, and geographical backgrounds.

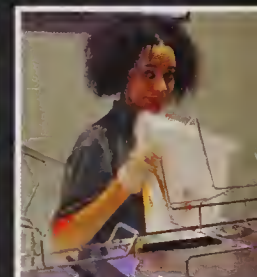

This is the new Science Center that is being built that is schedule to open Fall 2014. The new Science Center will house four of six newly created education centers including:

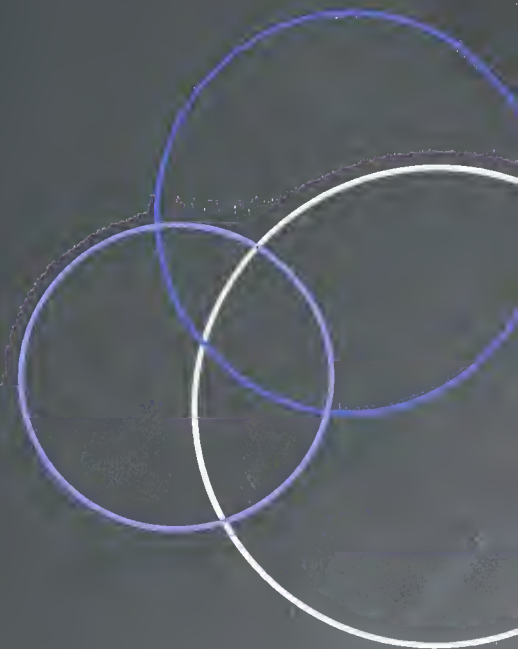
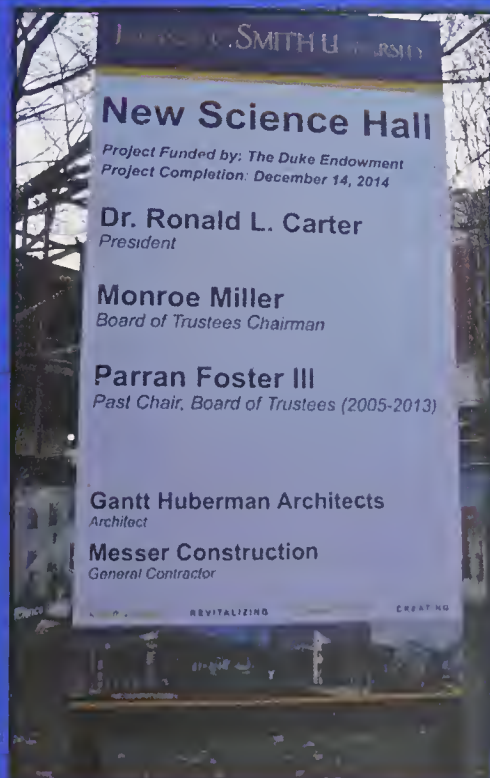

Representing the Gold & the Blue

History of Miss Johnson C. Smith University

The athletic team selected the "Sponsors" of Johnson C. Smith University from Barber-Scotia College and the city of Charlotte. During the 1930's upper class Scotia women were admitted to Johnson C. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. was organized on November 12, 1922, in Indianapolis, Indiana, by seven young educators: Mary Lou Allison Gardner Little, Dorothy Hanley Whiteside, Vivian White Marbury, Nannie Mae Gahn Johnson, Hattie Mae Annette Dulin Redford, Bessie Mae Downey Rhoades Martin and Cubena McClure.

The group became an incorporated national collegiate sorority on December 30, 1929, when a charter was granted to Alpha chapter at Butler University.

Based upon their ages, heightened responsibilities, and increased level of maturity, this group had a slightly different perspective than the norm for college students. It was this perspective from which they established the Fraternity's purpose, "The development and perpetuation of Scholarship, Leadership, Citizenship, Fidelity, and Brotherhood among men." Additionally, they conceived the Fraternity's motto, "Building a Tradition, Not Resting Upon One!"

On September 19, 1963, at Morgan State College (now Morgan State University), 12 students founded what is now the nation's fifth largest predominately African American social service fraternity: The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated.

This group of men was unique for several reasons. First of all, many were long-time friends. Spruill, Coakley, Dorsey, and Gregory had known one another since grade school, and Spruill and Coakley's friendship extended to when the two were preschoolers.

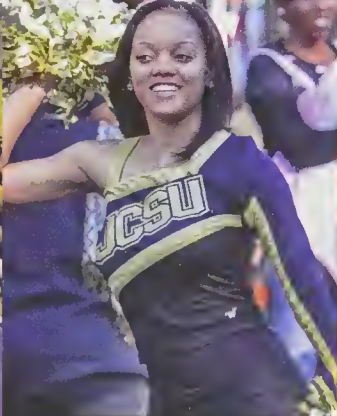
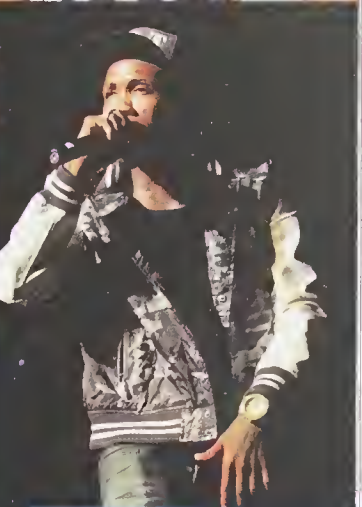
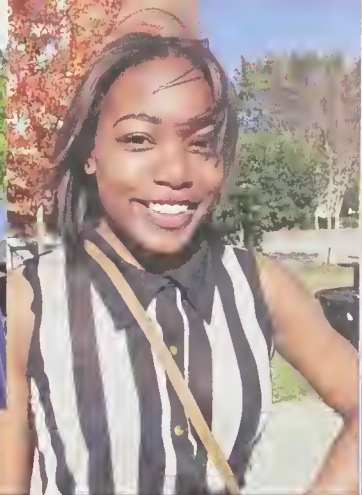

The founders of Iota Phi Theta were Albert Hicks, Lonnie Spruill, Jr., Charles Briscoe, Frank Coakley, John Slade, Barron Willis, Webster Lewis, Charles Brown, Louis Hudnell, Charles Gregory, Elias Dorsey, Jr., and Michael Williams.

Even more uniquely, many of these men were what we are now referred to as "Non-Traditional Students" and were 3-5 years older than the average college student. Gregory, Willis and Brown were all service veterans, and Brown, Hicks, and Briscoe were married with children. Of this group of 12, several were also working full-time jobs and were all full-time students.
