Nine students from the Communications and
Political Science Departments and one Political Science Departments and one faculty member formed the Gardner-Webb University contingent participating in this year's historic presidential inauguration in Washington, DC. The students joined 650 of their colleagues from arond the country and participated in a special 10 day seminar on the Media and the Presidency conducted by the Washington Center for Internships and Academics. The program included classes taught by Dana Bash, Bob Shieffer, Juan Williams, Ted Koppel and others; participation in special broadcasts of C-Span and NPF; site visits that included the Embassy of Bahrain, The Economic and Cultural Center for Taiwan, and the American Civil Liberties Union; small group discussions on the possibilities and constraints of presidential power, or the importance of citizenship; as well as tours of the city, The Capitol, and other activities. The program culminated with GWU students taking thoir spaces in the frigid cold and among 1.5 million others to watch the transfer of power from former President Bush to President Obama. While in DC, the students met up with some GWU alums living and working in Washington, and an evening at Professor Kuchinsky's home before hoading back to North Carolina. The Washington Center offers hundreds of future internship possibilities for interested GWU students.

## Alpha Chi

Membership in Alpha Chi (AX) is the highest academic honor available to students a Gardner-Webb University. AX is a national organization for honors students in al disciplines. The membership requirements are very strict: qualifying students must be juniors and seniors who place in the upper $10 \%$ of their classes in terms of G.P.A These students must also have demonstrated evidence of good character. Students who qualify for and join Alpha Chi are cligible to wear a special medal at graduation and their AX membership is announced when their names are called.

Every year Alpha Chi members plan events for the campus community to promote scholarship and good scholarly attitudes. In 2008-2009, Alpha Chi plannod a woek to celebrate academic integrity in November. In October, AX members provided assistance at events when the campus hosted the writer/undertaker Thomas Lynch and in March 2009, AX members assisted with the Life-of-the-Scholar Multidisciplinary Conference. In April 2009, eight AX members gave impressive scholarly presentations at the national AX convention in Indianapolis. Three GWU students: Sarah Fisher, Lauren Quesenberry, and Jennifer Cheek, won presentation prizes in their disciplines, and Sarah Fisher won a prestigious Nolle Scholarship.

Their projects focus on six educational topics: Market Economics, Success Skills, Entrepreneurship, Financial Literacy, Environmental Sustainability, and Business EtGics.


## Sigma Zeta



Sigma Zeta is a national science and mathematics honor society. The purpose of this national science and mathematics honor society is two-fold: (1) to encourage and foster and (2) to recognize and honor scholarly achievement by Gardner-Webb University students in the natural sciences, computer sciences, and mathematics.



In the fall of 2008, Sigma Zeta sponsored a Rocket Building Contest. Three building sessions were held in the Physics Lab, where the participants learned how to build a rocket and built their own rockets. The big launch was on December 4th. We shot off approximately twenty rockets to a crowd of forty five people. The categories were: Highest Altitude, Prettiest, Best Aeronautical, Best Failure, and Best Multi-stage.



Student Nurses Association (SNA) is an organization specifically for all Pre-Nursing, 1st Year, and 2nd Year nursing students at GWU. The purpose of SNA is to aid in the development of professional nurses, to provide educational programs of interest to nursing students and to encourage involvement in professional nursing organizations.

SNA gives nursing students the opportunity to get involved in the community and use the skills they have been learning and practicing. SNA members engage in community health and service-learning projects, have opportunities to become involved in the state (NC Association of Nursing Students) and national (National Student Nurses Association) nursing organizations, and enjoy non-nursing activities where they can relax and have fun!
