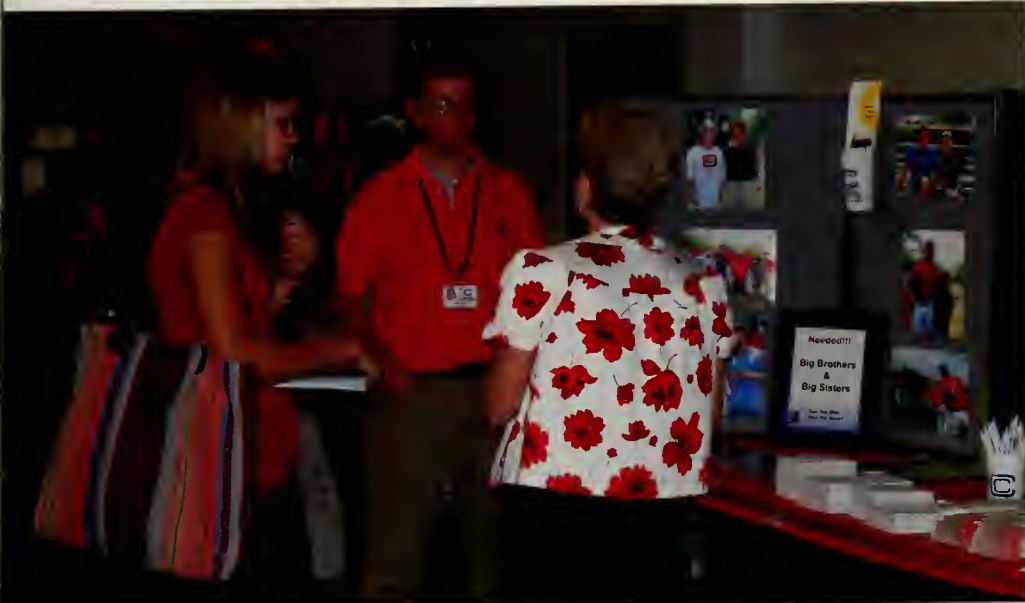

Gardner-Webb Students Headed to Washington, D.C. for the Historic Inauguration of President Barack Obama

Nine students from the Communications and Political Science Departments and one faculty member formed the Gardner-Webb University contingent participating in this year's historic presidential inauguration in Washington, DC. The students joined 650 of their colleagues from around the country and participated in a special 10 day seminar on the Media and the Presidency conducted by the Washington Center for Internships and Academics. The program included classes taught by Dana Bash, Bob Shieffer, Juan Williams, Ted Koppel and others; participation in special broadcasts of C-Span and NPR; site visits that included the Embassy of Bahrain, The Economic and Cultural Center for Taiwan, and the American Civil Liberties Union; small group discussions on the possibilities and constraints of presidential power, or the importance of citizenship; as well as tours of the city, The Capitol, and other activities. The program culminated with GWU students taking their spaces in the frigid cold and among 1.5 million others to watch the transfer of power from former President Bush to President Obama. While in DC, the students met up with some GWU alums living and working in Washington, and an evening at Professor Kuchinsky's home before heading back to North Carolina. The Washington Center offers hundreds of future internship possibilities for interested GWU students.

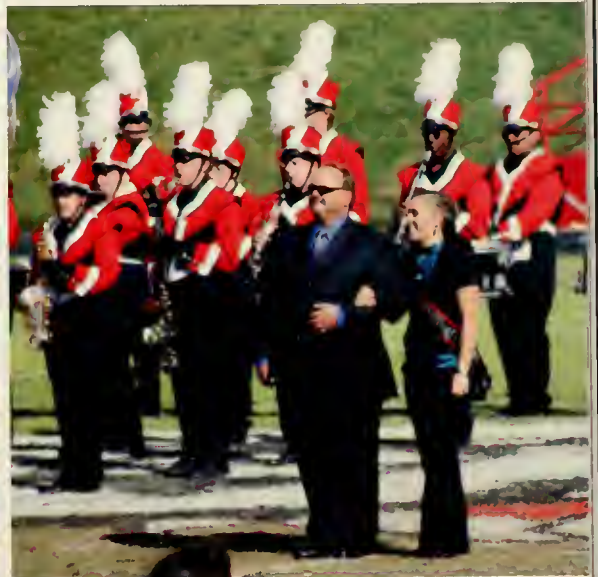

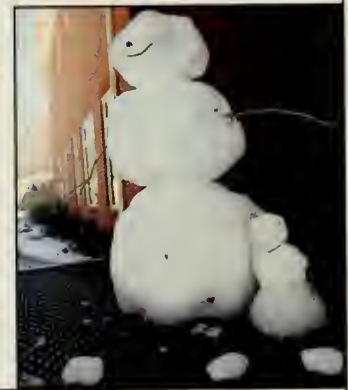
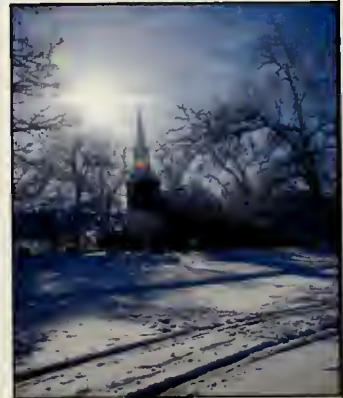


Snow Day!

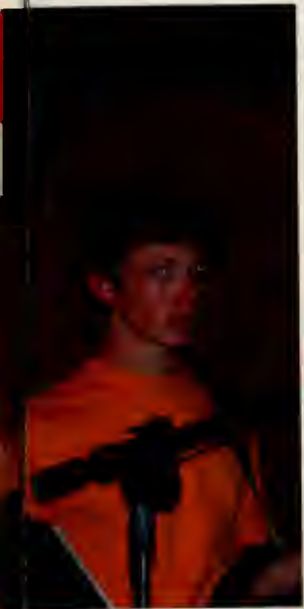

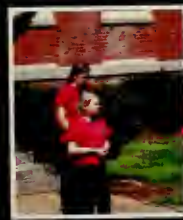






Clubs & Activities

Alpha Chi

Membership in Alpha Chi (AX) is the highest academic honor available to students at Gardner-Webb University. AX is a national organization for honors students in all disciplines. The membership requirements are very strict: qualifying students must be juniors and seniors who place in the upper 10% of their classes in terms of G.P.A. These students must also have demonstrated evidence of good character. Students who qualify for and join Alpha Chi are eligible to wear a special medal at graduation and their AX membership is announced when their names are called.

Every year Alpha Chi members plan events for the campus community to promote scholarship and good scholarly attitudes. In 2008-2009, Alpha Chi planned a week to celebrate academic integrity in November. In October, AX members provided assistance at events when the campus hosted the writer/undertaker Thomas Lynch, and in March 2009, AX members assisted with the Life-of-the-Scholar Multidisciplinary Conference. In April 2009, eight AX members gave impressive scholarly presentations at the national AX convention in Indianapolis. Three GWU students: Sarah Fisher, Lauren Quesenberry, and Jennifer Cheek, won presentation prizes in their disciplines, and Sarah Fisher won a prestigious Nolle Scholarship.

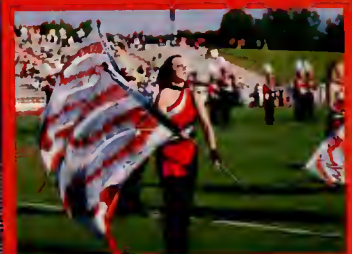

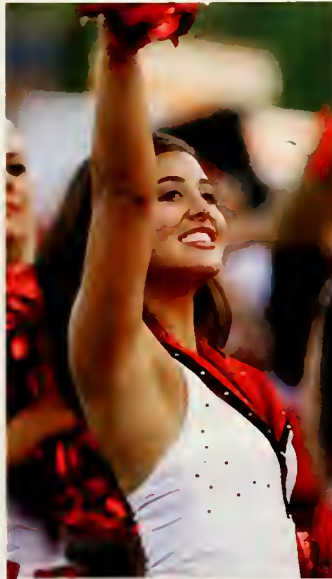
1963 - 2008

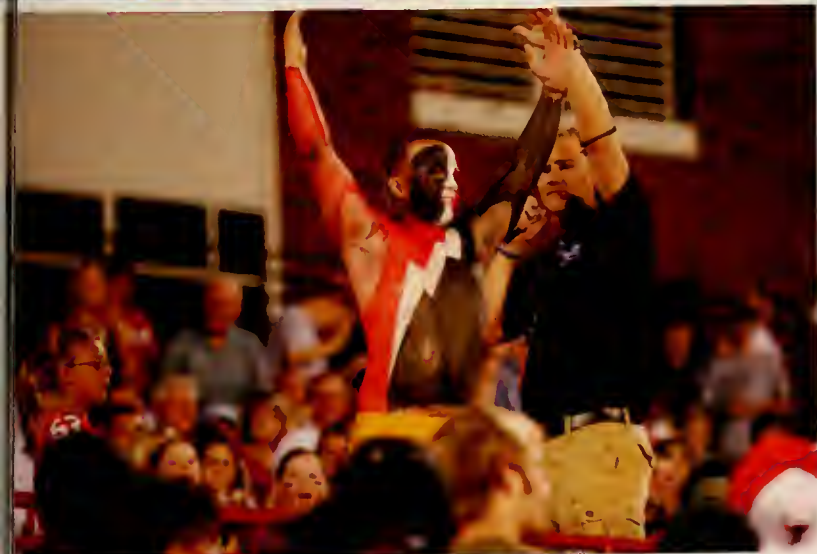
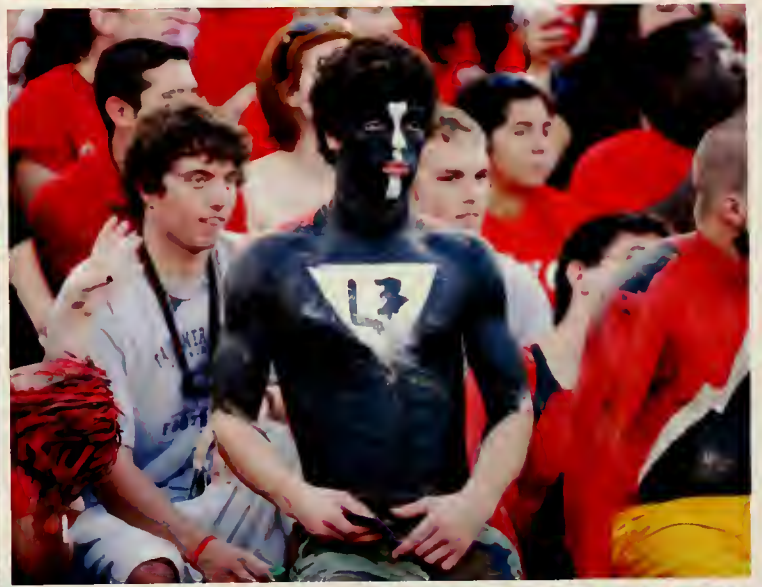

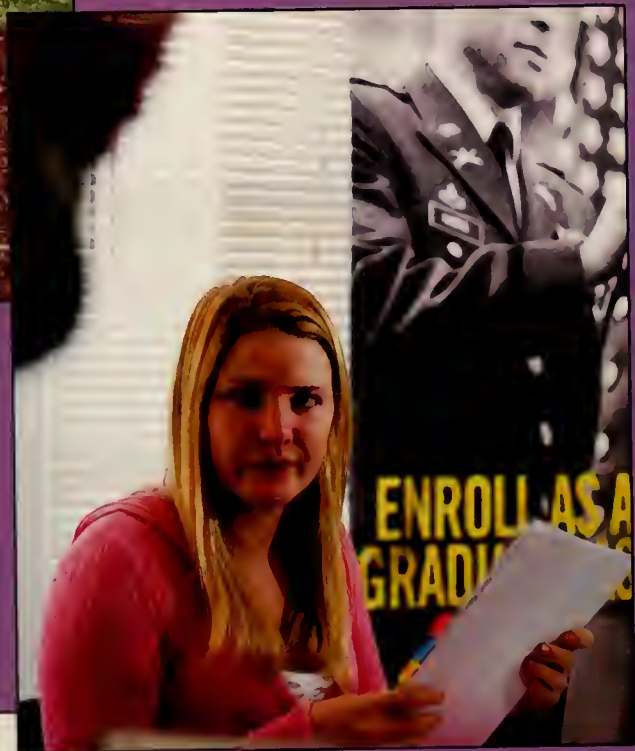

Their projects focus on six educational topics: Market Economics, Success Skills, Entrepreneurship, Financial Literacy, Environmental Sustainability, and Business Ethics.



Sigma Zeta



Sigma Zeta is a national science and mathematics honor society. 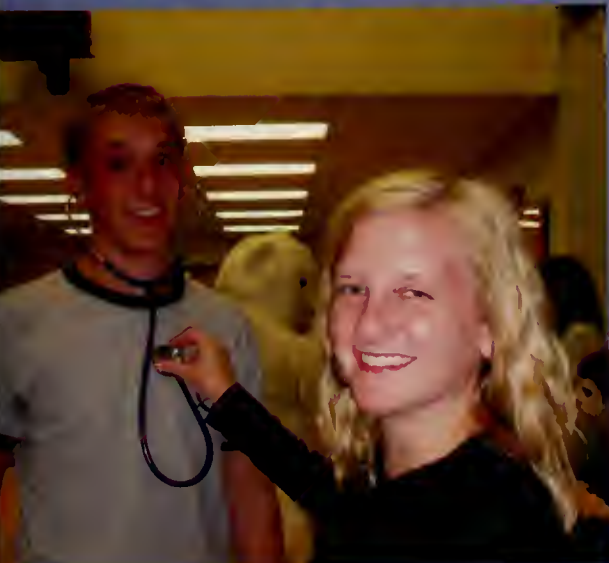
SNA

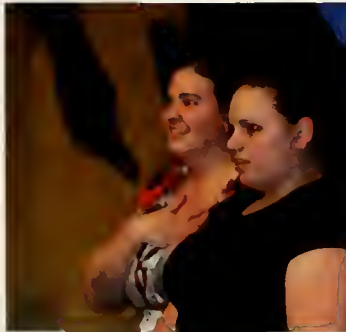
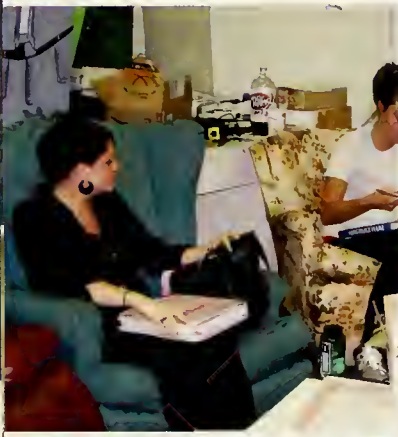

Radio for the People!



WGWG 88.3 FM (wgwg.org) has been a broadcast service of Gardner-Webb University since 1974. What began as a 5,000-watt radio station operating from dawn until dusk has become a 50,000-watt media outlet reaching listeners 24 hours a day in both of the Carolinas. Our on-air signal reaches 16 counties in North and South Carolina, but our online stream is worldwide. We have regular listeners in Asia, Europe and Africa. That's a huge jump from Boiling Springs, said Noel T. Manning, II, general manager of WGWG. WGWG is a non-commercial station that specializes in Roots and Americana music, covering a wide range of styles including Blues, Bluegrass, Alternative Country, Old Time, Folk and Roots Rock. The roots approach to music emphasizes the diversity of musical traditions while creating community through song and thought. Roots songwriters and performers forge new directions, blurring and breaking the musical limits of commercial radio. The station features artists like Johnny Cash, Tom Petty, Ralph Stanley, Robert Johnson, Bob Dylan, John Hiatt, Alison Krauss, Old Crow Medicine Show, Emmylou Harris, Sam Bush and many more. We also welcome local and regional musicians; you'll hear these artists back to back with major charting artists each day, said Manning. In addition to music, WGWG brings daily newscasts to listeners, as well as coverage of sports and area weather forecasts. WGWG also offers nationally syndicated programs each week that focus on parenting, the environment, the legal system, global issues, matters of religion and more. WGWG also gives students at GWU who are interested in radio the chance to gain real life experience through internships and work-study positions. Students are given opportunities to explore their talents in front of and behind the microphone, said Manning. Some serve as hosts for radio shows while others are involved in production work. Manning states, If you listen to our station for ten minutes, you will hear a lot of artists that you may have never heard before. Our station is for people who are looking for an alternative to the commercialism in radio today, that is where we fit in.

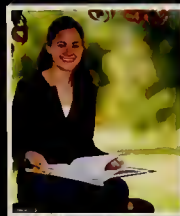
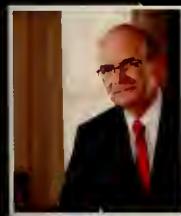
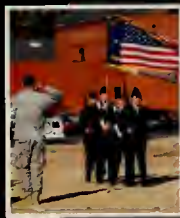
San Diego

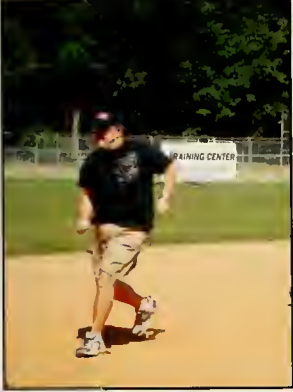

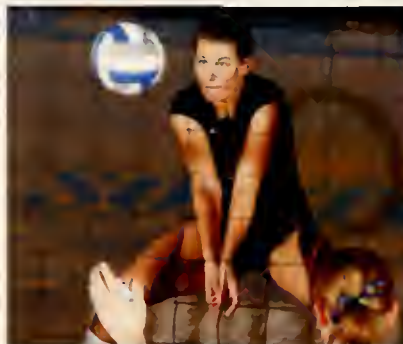

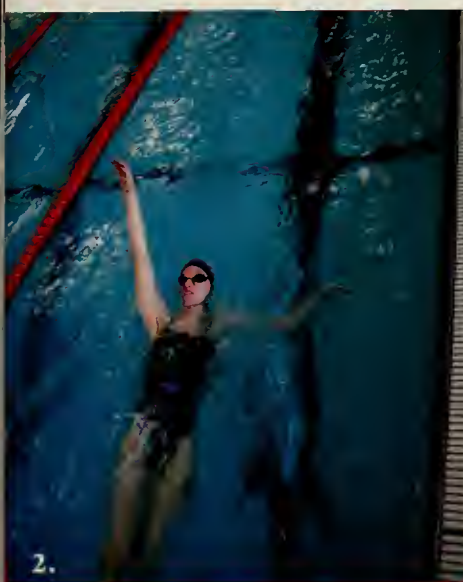
