Strong in our minds as the years roll past.


As we meet hardships, large and small,

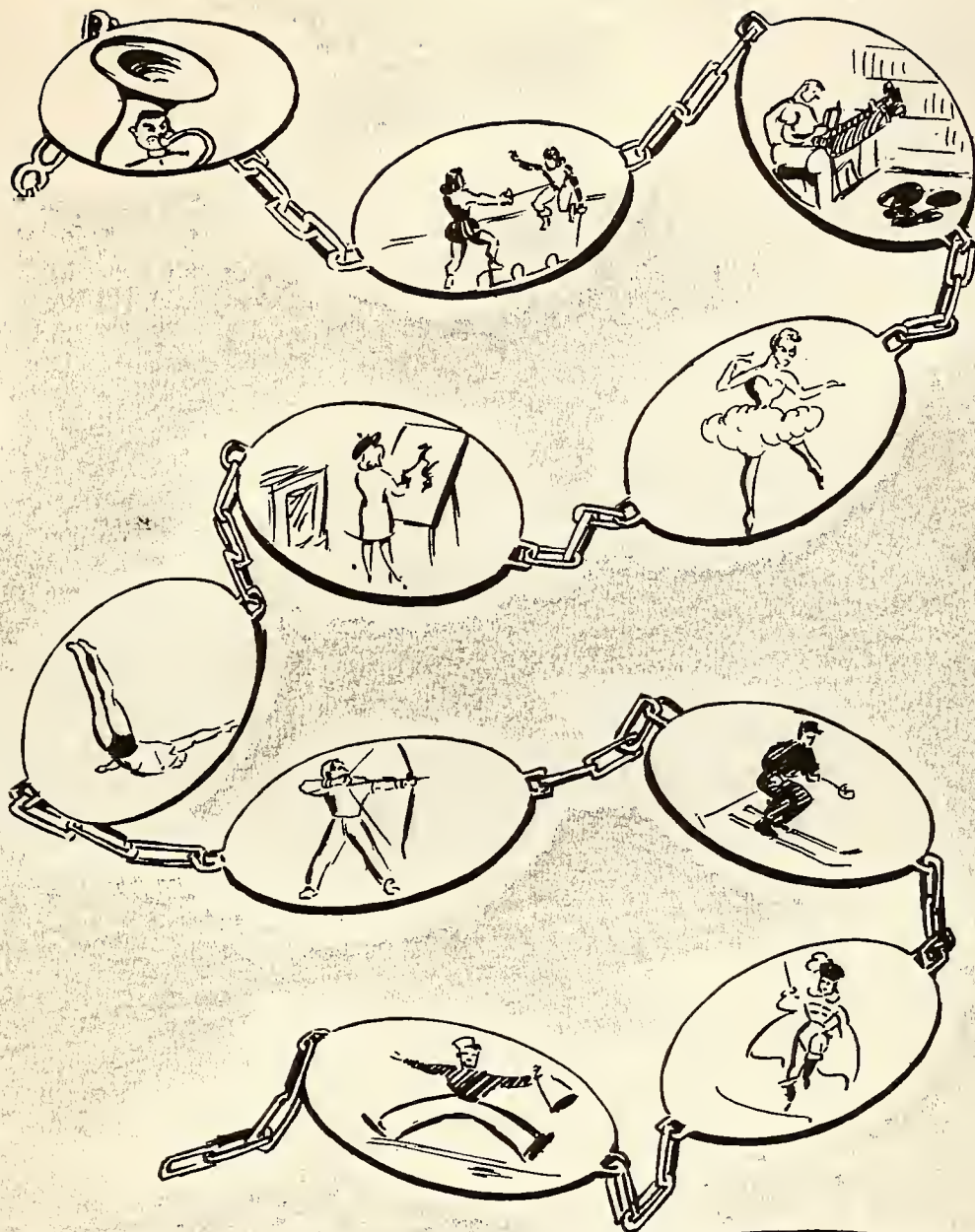



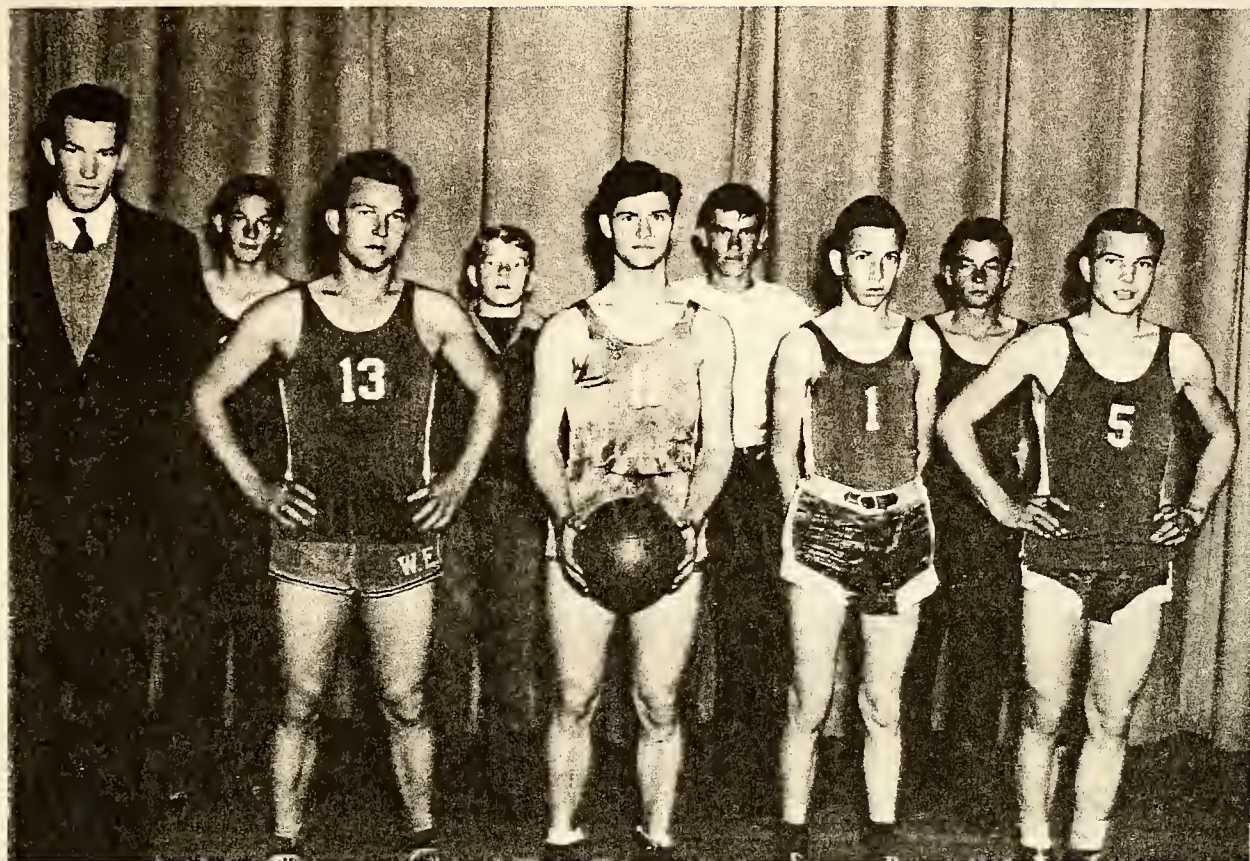

We played our last game March 11, 1948. We have not won many games, but we know how to be a good loser...we all believe that being a good loser is a sure way to win.





We are doing fine in basketball, though not as winners, but as good sports. If we had a gymnasium, we could have a much better record.




