1948-149:



The Campus Sweetheart contest was put on for the first time at this school and was won by Dollie Pope, a senior. We did this to make money for the Senior class, and we are very pleased with the proceeds.

As this school year nears the end we wonder what new history each of us will write in our book of life. Whatever it is, the honor and praise belongs to West Edgecombe; for it was there we laid the foundation for our careers.
