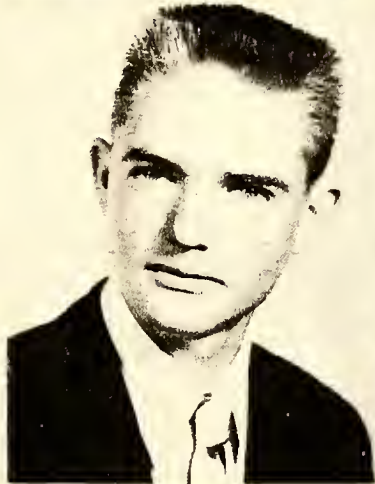

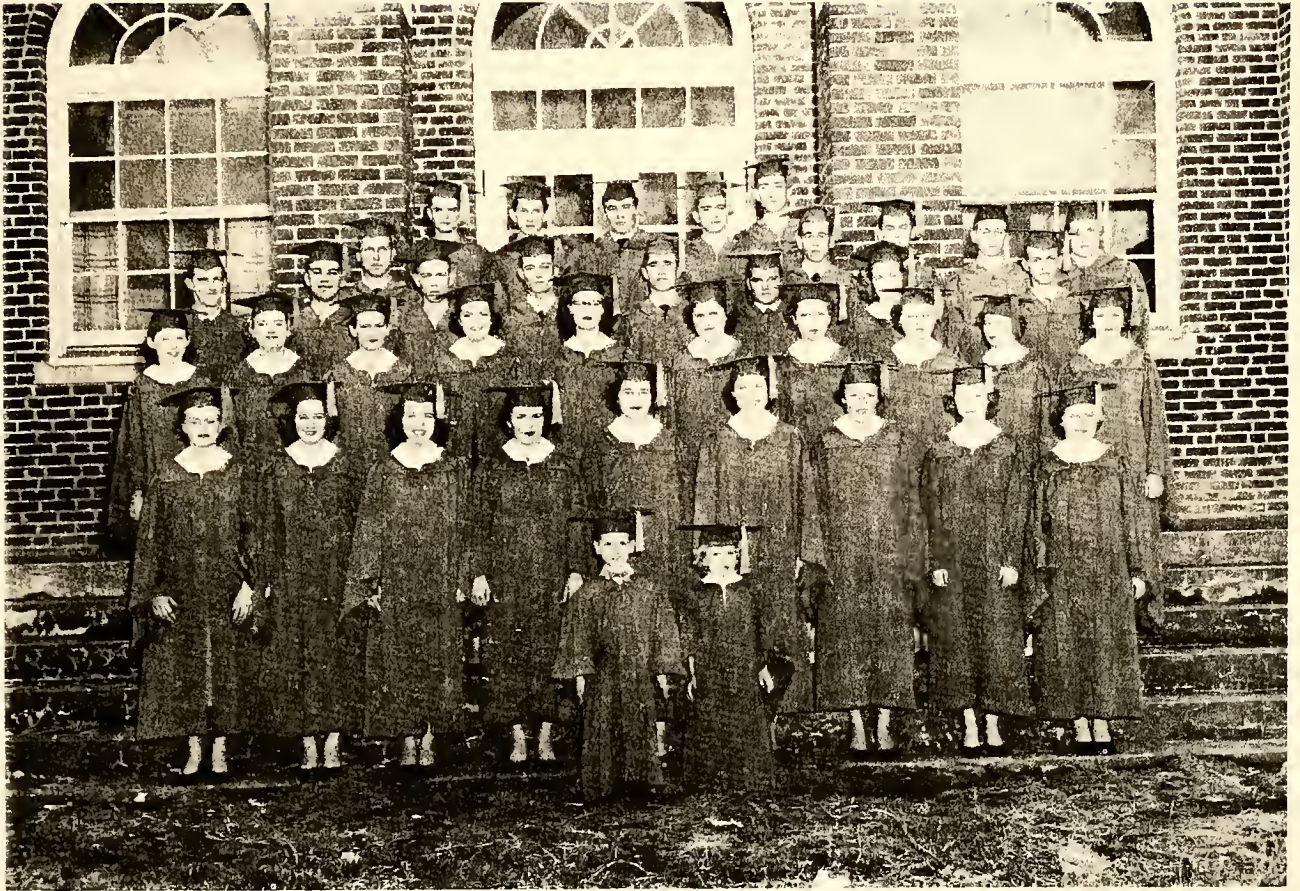

Jeannette Worsley, who was a lover of Home Economics and basketball, is now designing basketball uniforms.

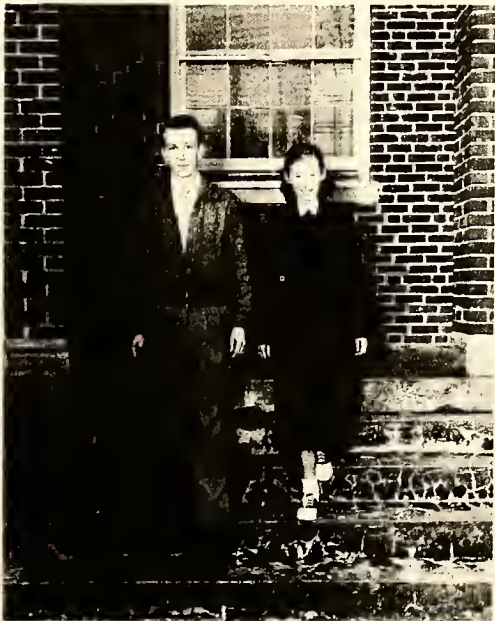
