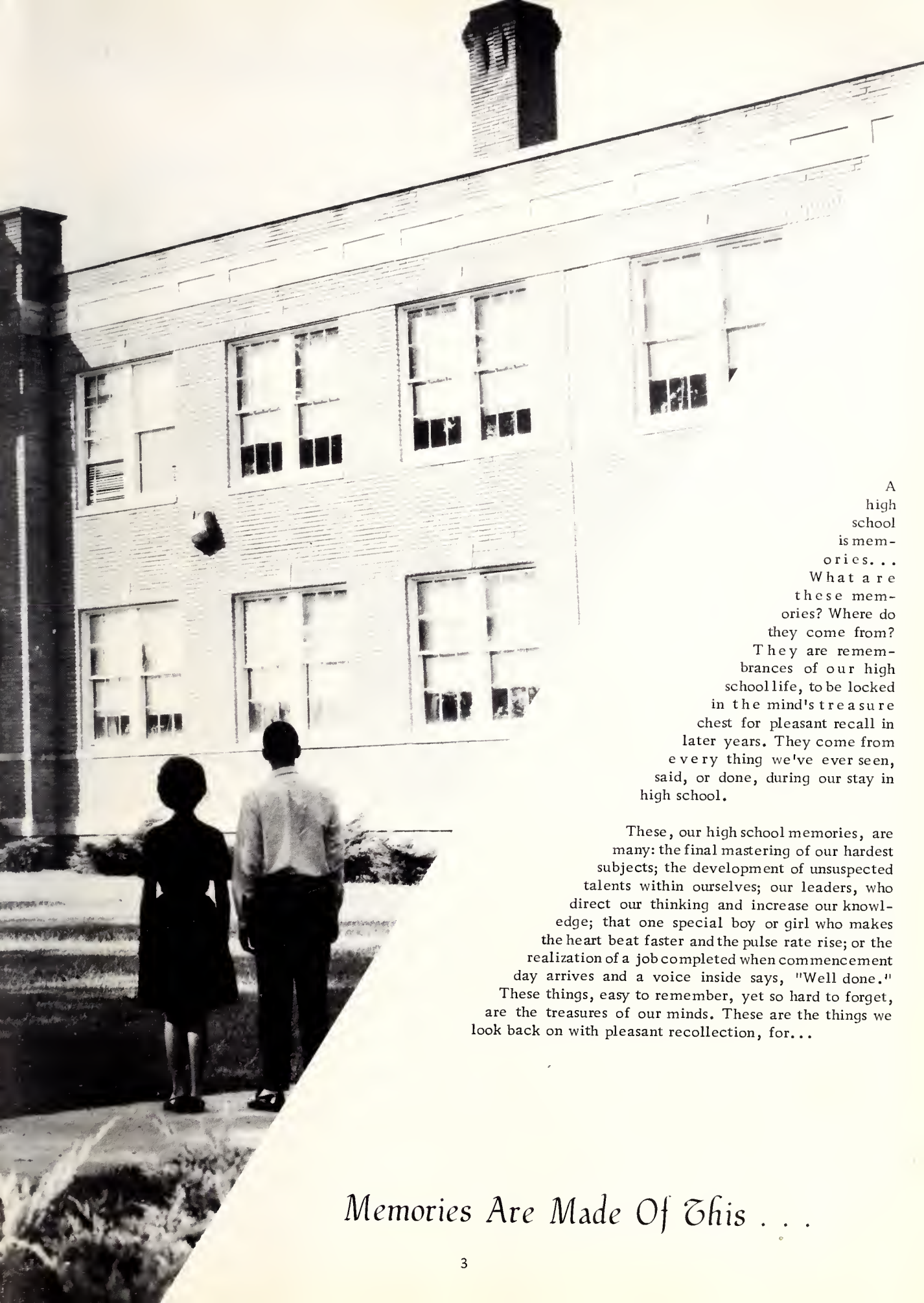

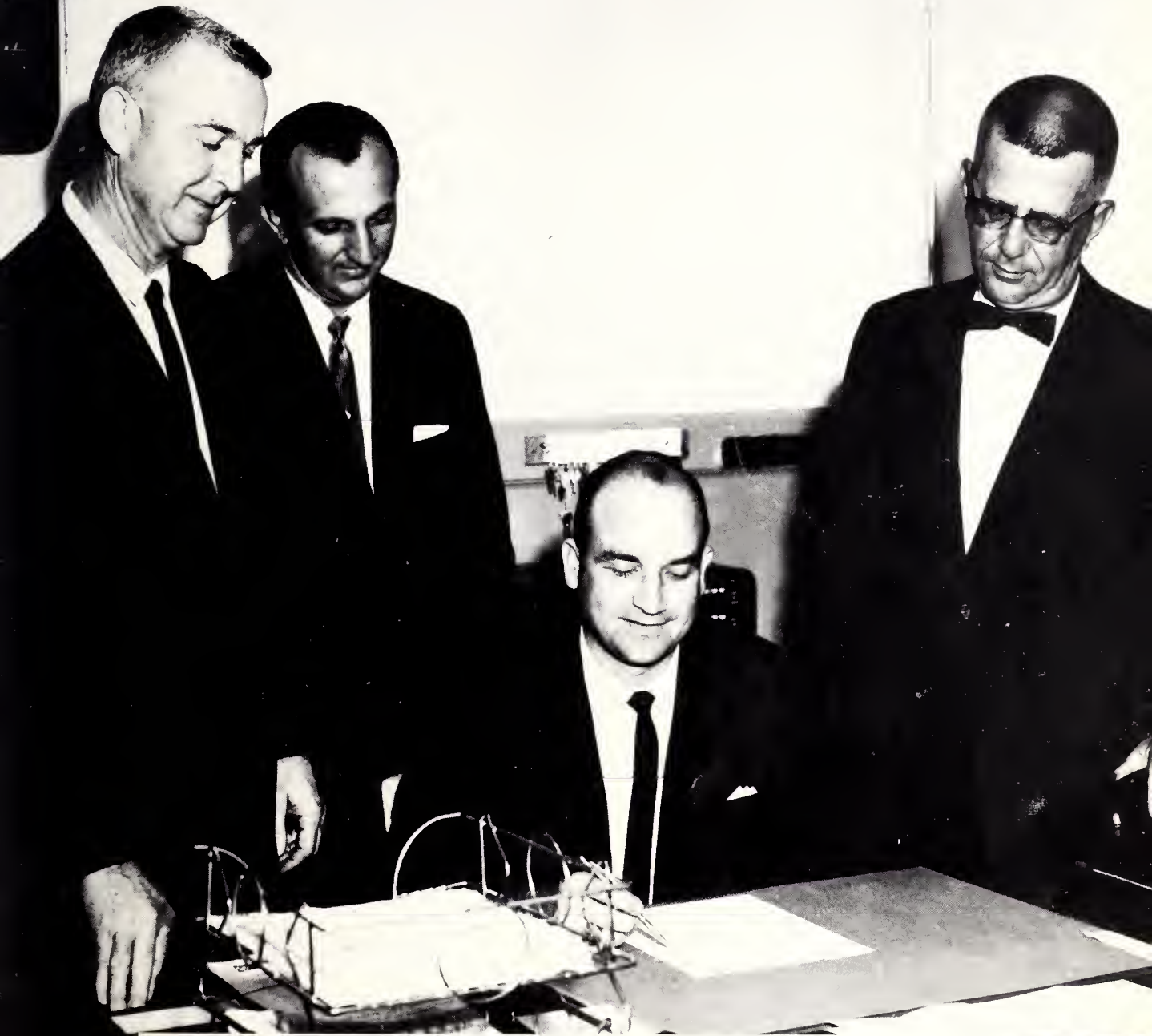
To You Who Have Left Memories . . .
