









Being head coach of the Ayden Tornadoes since 1946, Coach Tripp has guided our football, basketball, and baseball teams to numerous victories. For the two seasons previous to his resignation, Coach Tripp's football teams were conference and district champions. Last year his basketball players placed third in the state. Ayden High suffered a double loss in 1962 when Coach resigned. Mr. Tripp was also a teacher of history and government until last year.
