

FOREWORD




CLASS PROPHECY



BUT SOON WE FOUND OURSELVES IN THE ROARING OF THE TWELFTH HARBOR WHERE WE WERE PLACED UNDER THE COMMAND OF MRS. MARGARET LAWTER. WE PRESENTED OUR JUNIOR PLAY "ME AND MY








