This year our faithful bus drivers are Joe Allen, Roger Henderson, Larry Crater, James Lee Spann, and Donald Anthony. We had two grand and wonderful sponsors, Mrs. Helen S. Wishon and Mr. James Mothis. We also took that long awaited for Washington trip. Everyone had loads of fun. We shall always cherish our past experiences and happy days in this school. The magic spectacles have given us the privilege of looking backward.
