Senior Class History

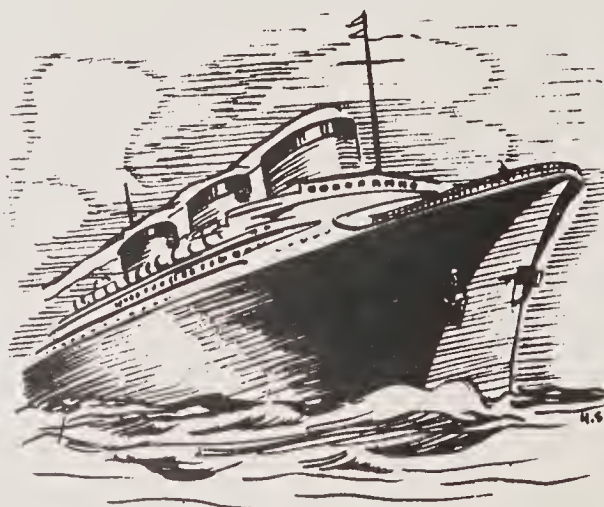
The training we have received is and will continue to be valuable to us in our future adventures. It has been brief but we hope to continue it to obtain a higher commission.
