Senior Class History


The training we have received is and will continue to be valuable to us in our future adventures. It has been brief but we hope to continue it to obtain a higher commission.







Geraldine Leary is just where we knew she would be. She is now instructor of Physics at E.C.T.C.


Annie Montague is in the Cadet Murses Corps. She entered training in Texas---It had to be Texas, for some reason.

Helen Wright (that's me kids) is now the assistant editor of a Navy magazine. She still has dreams of South Dakota (Well, can't I dream?????)


