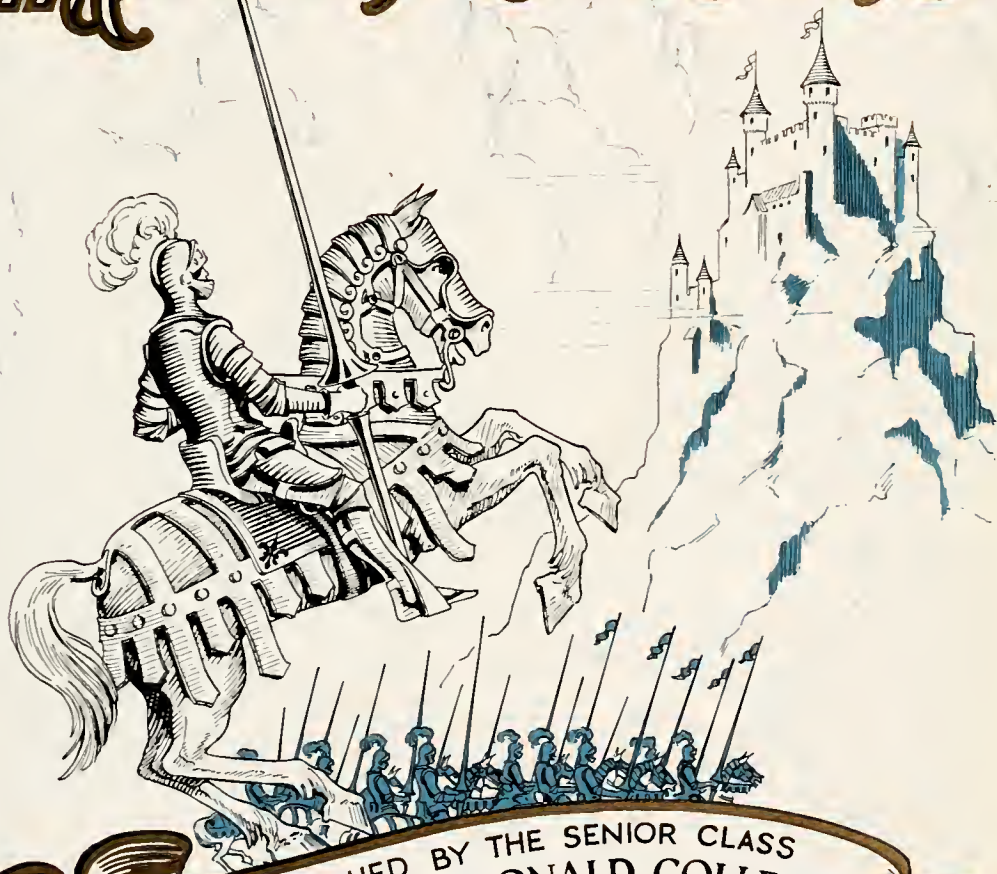

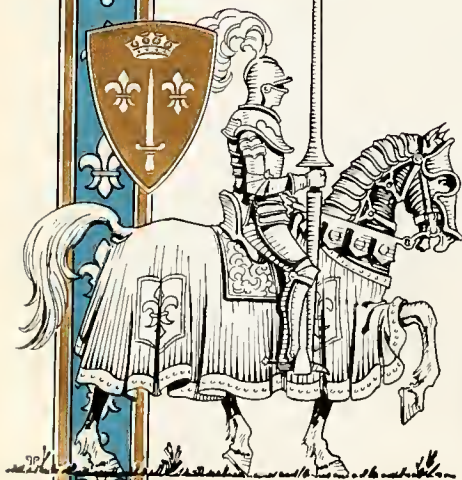
Prologue
