If any error is committed in filling an order, the purchaser is requested to notify us at once, as **No Claims for Reduction will be Allowed, Unless Made within Ten Days** after receipt of stock. Our stock is large and complete in all its branches, and our shipping facilities are unsurpassed. Freight, west, fifty per cent. lower than from any point east of this. The prices indicated apply only to the number or quantity specified.
