HARDY FERNS.

The Hardy Ferns are particularly desirable for florists' use in making up bouquets, as they are so easily grown in some shady corner and are always ready for use. They are also largely used in landscape work planted in masses. Some kinds, like Dicksonia, are especially adapted for growing in open sun. (Those marked * are evergreen.)
