WE HAVE NO AGENTS, and aim to grow exclusively, stock required by Nurserymen and Dealers, and to furnish it at the lowest rates. Freeing ourselves from the hindrances of retail trade, we are prepared to fill orders as early as it will do to dig.

We invite particular attention to our MAHALEB CHERRY, PLUM and PEAR STOCKS, CONCORD, HARTFORD PROLIFIC, and other Grapes, of which we have a good stock; including extra strong vines of IONA, ADIRONDAC and ISRAELLA. PEACH TREES; DOWNING'S EVERBEARING MULBERRY, CURRANTS, RASPBERRIES, and AGRICULTURIST STRAWBERRY; our fine collection of the best ROSES, also PEONIES, PHLOXES, DAHLIAS, VERBENAS and other plants; ORNAMENTAL VINES, FLOWERING SHRUBS, &c., &c. For the Fall Trade we shall have a large stock of Cherry and Peach Trees, (60,000 trees.) Roses, Grapes, Gooseberries, Strawberries, &c.

In Fruit Trees, Roses, Dahlias, etc., the choice of varieties must be mainly left to us; but in all cases good sorts will be sent, and the purchaser's wish complied with, as far as possible. But long lists of selected varieties, will be charged at single rates. The prices given are for the number specified, or not less than half. Thus 6 will be sent at the doz. rate where that is \$1 or more, 50 at the 100 rate and 500 at the 1000 rate.

TERMS CASH with the order, or COLLECT ON DELIVERY, by Express. If the order cannot be filled, the money will be returned. Special arrangements will be made with persons of KNOWN RELIABILITY AND PROMPTNESS, allowing time for delivery to cash-paying customers. But longer time cannot, in any case, be given. For packing, we charge the cost of material and labor, but nothing for delivery to the Railroad or Express office.

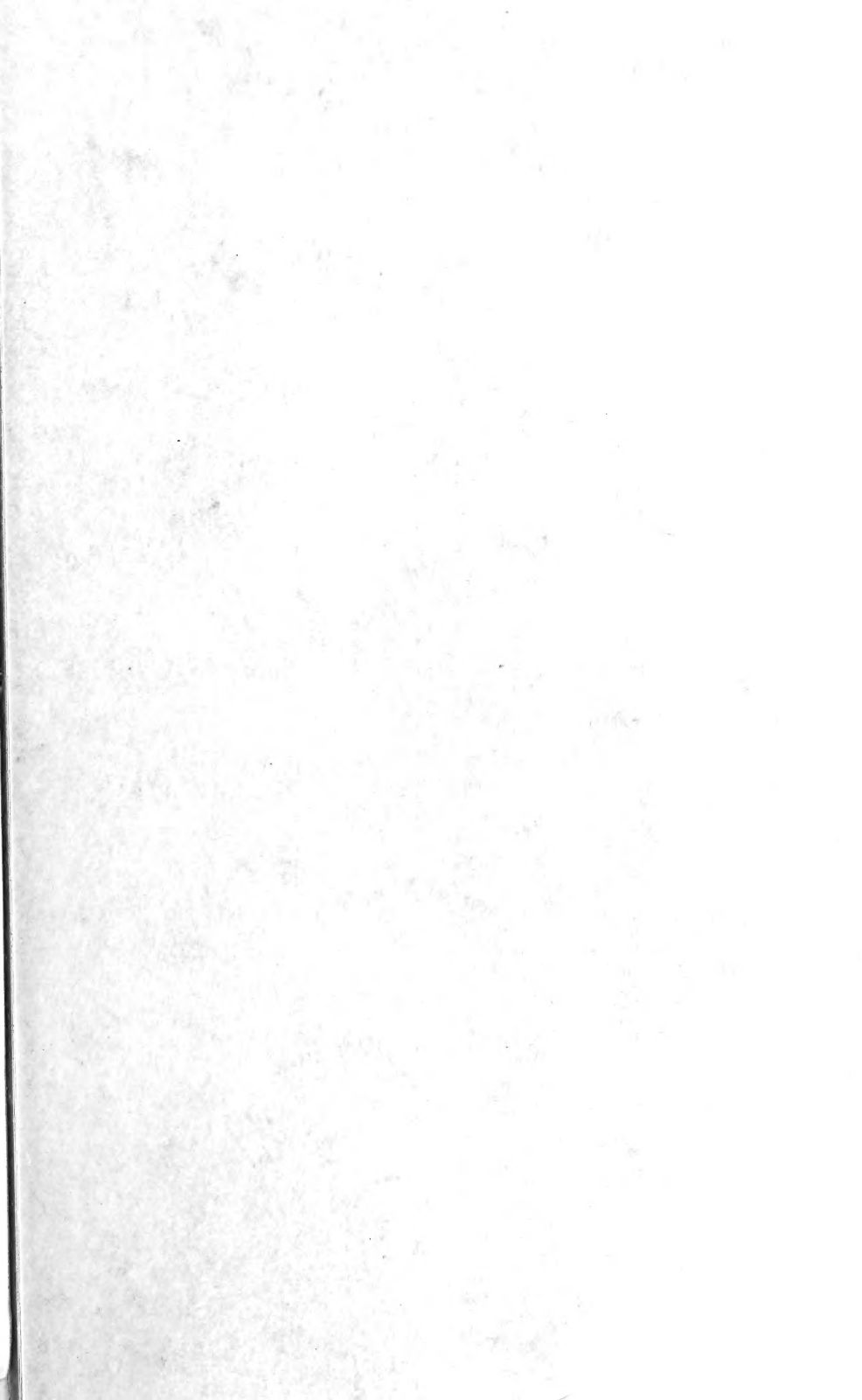
