<u>CEPHALOCEREUS senilis - 1" -----</u>	\$.90	\$ 7.50
Genuine "Old Man Cactus." The sizes given are of the plant body as this is the standard way of measuring all plants. However, the frilly white hair, from one-half to one inch in length makes these plants appear larger than the specified size. (Pl. 20)		
<u>CLEISTOCACTUS baumanii - 2" seedlings -----</u>	.35	3.00
Columnar plants attractively spined. (Pl. 28)		
<u>HARRISIA eriophora - 1½" to 2" -----</u>	.35	3.00
Sturdy columnar type. Very good for dish gardens.		
<u>LEMAIREOCEREUS dumortieri - 1" -----</u>	.35	3.00
Globular seedlings with glassy light green plant body. Ribs widely spaced, edged with soft light colored spines.		
<u>MALACOCARPUS vorwerkianus - 1" to 1½" -----</u>	1.00	----
Globular plant with many sharp angled wavy ribs.		
<u>MAMMILLARIA bocasana - 1" -----</u>	.60	5.00
Entire plant covered with fine silky white hair. A very popular plant.		
<u>M. fragilis - 1" -----</u>	.35	3.00
"Thimble." Miniature plant covered with chalky white, harmless spines.		
<u>MONVILLEA diffusa - 2½" seedlings -----</u>	.30	3.00
One of the best plants for "Tails" in novelty animal pots. Dark green with light soft spines.		
<u>OPUNTIA microdasys - rooted cuttings -----</u>	.35	3.00
Small, flat stems dotted with yellow clusters of small spinelets. Very popular. (Pl. 17)		
<u>PILOCLERUS palmeri - 2" -----</u>	.60	5.00
Columnar plant, light green body with brown spines on the margins and a tuft of white wool in the crown.

AFRICAN LIVING ROCK - See Pleiospilos nelii		
AGAVE <u>applanata</u> - 1½" to 2" plants -----	.35	3.00
Very hardy plant with tough gray green leaves held erect.		
ALOE <u>aristata</u> - 2½" potted plants -----	1.25	10.00
After years of propagation we are now in a position to offer this outstanding, much sought after plant. It's very thin leaves of dark green are generously sprinkled with white dots and taper to a long wavy hair-like tip. The plant is a compact rosette of delicate beauty. (Figure 239)		
A. <u>nobilis</u> - 2" rooted cuttings -----	.35	3.00
A. <u>nobilis</u> - 3" rooted cuttings -----	.60	5.00
Dark green leaves edged with yellow teeth. Very popular.		
CRASSULA <u>arborescens</u> - 3" rooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
C. <u>arborescens</u> - 5" rooted cuttings -----	.50	4.00
Round, thick shiny green leaves edged with red. (Fig. 151)		
C. <u>perforata</u> - 1½" to 2" rooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
(Rosary Plant) The thick leaves clasp the slender stems like the beads of a rosary. (Fig. 5)		
ECHEVERIA <u>hybrid pulv-oliver</u> - rooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
Long, tapered, felted, flexible leaves tipped with red.		
E. <u>leucotricha</u> - 2½" unrooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
Similar to E. pulvinata but leaves are broader and more silvery and less red on the tips.		
E. <u>pulvinata</u> - 2½" unrooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
Thick, oblong, flattened, velvety, dark green leaved edged with red. Choice, distinctive. (Fig. 166)		
EUPHORBIA <u>hermentiana</u> - 4" rooted cuttings -----	.60	5.00
Three-angled, columnar plant with marbled surface and ornamented with small rows of leaves on the angles.		
PLEIOSPILOS <u>nelii</u> - 1" to 1½" -----	.60	5.00
"African Living Rock." Leaves nearly round reddish brown in color.		
P. <u>simulans</u> - 1½" -----	.60	5.00
Thick leaves, flat on top, triangular below.		
PORTULACARIA <u>afra</u> - 3" rooted cuttings -----	.25	2.00
Small, shiny leaves on reddish stems, branching like a small tree. (Fig. 264)		
SEDUM <u>guatemalense</u> - rooted cuttings -----	.20	1.50
Stems densely covered with berry-like leaves, shiny green tinged red; cuttings root easily. (Fig. 195A)		
S. <u>lineare var. variegatum</u> - 1½" clumps -----	.30	2.50
Many stemmed, clumps of tiny close set variegated leaves.		
S. <u>morganianum</u> - 2½" rooted cuttings -----	.30	2.50
"Burro's Tail." Amber white, compact, round, oblongated leaves. Much in demand.		
SEMPERVIVUM <u>montanum</u> - 1" -----	.30	2.50
Small, hard type, with wool on the margins and tips of the leaves. (Fig. 214)
