The Packing Season.

The season for Packing generally begins about the 15th o October, continuing until the middle of November, or later owing to the season; in spring about the 15th of March, and throughout May.

Terms and Conditions.

Careful attention is given to packing, for which I will only charge cost of material and labor. All my stock is delivered at the depot or Express office, free of charge; after which it is entirely at the resk of the purchaser.
