This nursery has been extensively known all over the west as the BLOOMING GROVE NURSERY, W. P. WILLS & SON Proprietors, but on the 19th of November, 1870, the senior partner departed from this nursery here below, to work in that nursery not made with hands eternally in Heaven—rest kind parent your labor is at an end; under all the loss of a great pillar, I now call on all the old customers for a share of their liberal patronage.

My stock is complete—NOT MANAGED BY DISINTERESTED HIRED MEN, BUT RUN AND SUPERINTENDED BY MYSELF IN PERSON. I shall guarantee varieties TRUE TO NAME.

The Packing Season.

The season for Packing generally begins about the 15th of October, continuing until the middle of November, or later owing to the season; in spring about the 15th of March, and throughout May.

Terms and Conditions.

My terms must be CASH, I will not send out my stock on any other terms, unless by special agreement.

Careful attention is given to packing, for which I will only charge cost of material and labor. All my stock is delivered at the depot or Express office, free of charge; after which it is entirely at the risk of the purchaser.
