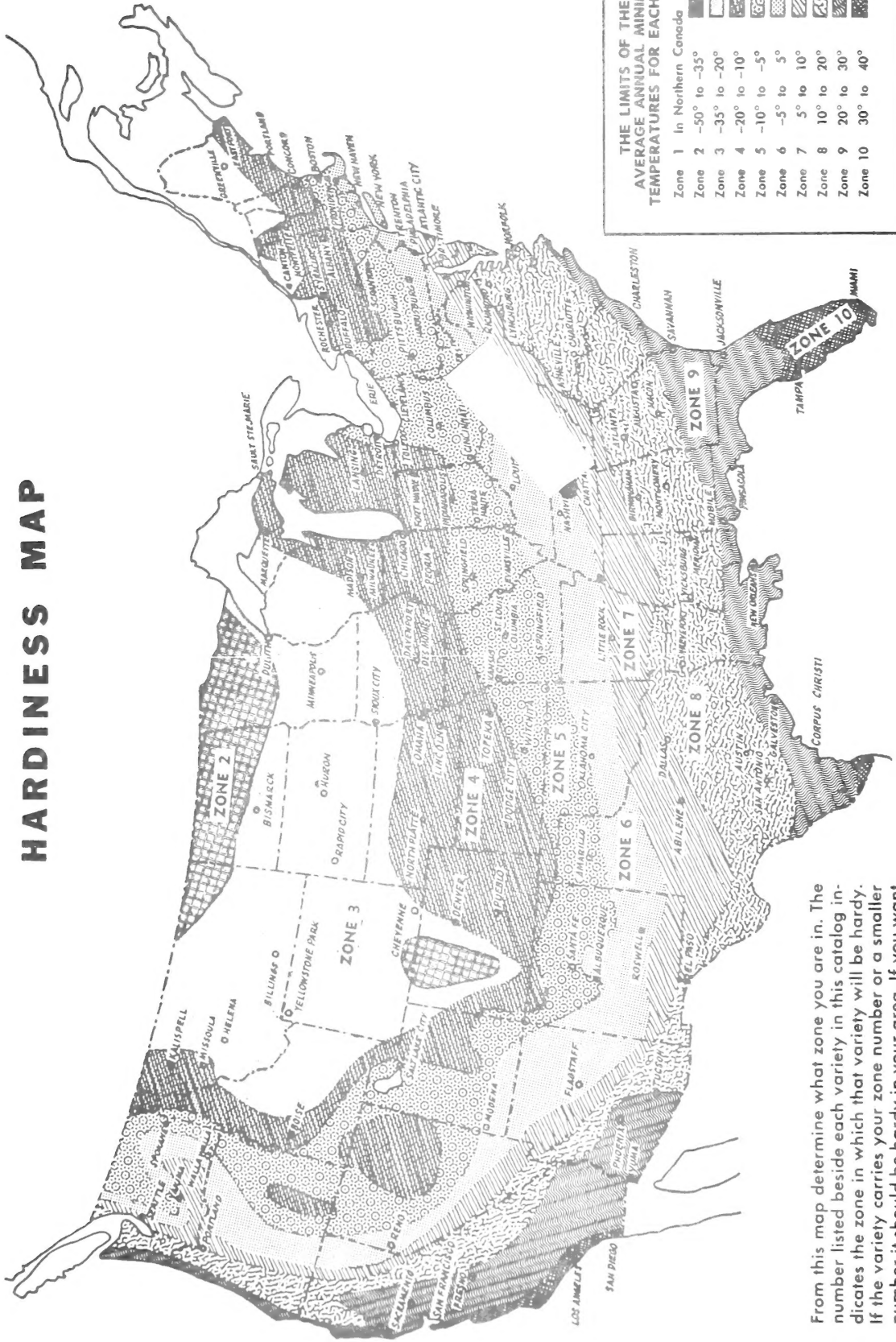

DRAMATIC GARDEN LIGHTING IN UTAH BY PORTER-WALTON'S

Nightscaping is a registered trade name for Bill Locklin's 12 volt garden lighting fixtures, manufactured by Loran, Inc., in Redlands, California.

Nightscaping fixtures may be said to take up where landscaping leaves off. Your beautiful garden and your favorite plants cannot be seen effectively unless they are properly lighted after dark.

Nightscaping creates a dramatic effect by casting shadows of the plants on the walls, ceiling, or on the ground. While all lights can be used to cast shadows, the lighting and shadow effect cannot be controlled as well as it can with Nightscaping fixtures.

Nightscaping is a safe 12 volt A.C. system. This is the same safe voltage used for your child's electric toy train. Just as it can be made to make the toy trains go faster or slower, it can be used to dim your lights from full brightness to low or completely out.

However, there is one disadvantage to a 12 volt system. A transformer is required to reduce the house current, 110 volts, to a safe 12 volts. Actually this slight disadvantage is to your advantage as a 12 volt system can be handled safely so that you could even adjust the fixtures at night during damp or rainy conditions. You also eliminate the shock hazard of cutting the cables accidentally during lawn mowing or trimming your plants and hedges. Even if the able were cut and the electricity turned on with bare ends loose, there is little danger.

LOW VOLTAGE! While even the electricians generally think of using small wires, in Nightscaping this is not true. Because of low voltage we use larger size wire compared to the average cord or house wiring. It is stranded for flexibility so that adjustments can be made easier from time to time.

Wattages for Nightscaping fixtures range from 6.8 watts to 35 watts. In selecting the proper size of transformer to use, first select all the fixtures that you need, then add the total watts per fixture. The total of all the watts added equal the size of transformer required. Transformers come in the following sizes:

25 watts	150 watts
50 watts	250 watts
100 watts	

The total wattage should not exceed the transformer wattage rating. Transformers are designed for both outdoor weatherproof installations or for indoor installation. They may be purchased without enclosures or complete with cord, cap and outdoor enclosures ready for plugging into a 110 volt source. Using a variety of fixtures will usually result in about 15 watt per fixture average, so that a 10 fixture installation will normally require a 150 watt transformer.

Individual fixture list prices start at \$7.45 per fixture up to \$18.75, or an average of about \$12.60 per fixture. Transformers cost from \$12.00 without enclosures to \$37.75 with enclosures for outdoor installation. Low voltage cable costs \$.16½ per foot plus installation cost if you don't put it in yourself.

Low Voltage 12 Volt Lamps:

A 12 volt lamp has a single contact bayonet base with a spring action to ensure good electrical contact. Filament lengths are ¼" to ½" long, compared to lengths of 1" to 18" long for 110 volt lamps. These 12 volt lamps are ordinary automobile tail light lamps and made to be able to withstand a lot of vibration. The lamps are clear and give an almost point source of lighting, which creates the shadows. Shadows can be controlled by moving the fixtures or lamps close to the object or plant to increase the size of shadow, or pull it away and reduce the size of the shadow. The shadow can be cast on the walls, fence or ceiling. The shadow effect can also be reversed so that it will fall on the lawn, walkway, pool decking or on other interior floors. Lights that are directed at trees at the proper angles will produce shadows between projecting branches to create a three-dimensional effect with shadow depths not possible with standard flood lights, which light up the entire tree and destroy shadows. When the wind blows, the shadow effect makes your garden come to life with tree and shrub shadows moving about all of the various surfaces.

When using ordinary PAR-38 flood lights, one or two of them will light an entire back yard, plus light your neighbor's yard at the same time. Nightscaping will adequately light your yard with just a few fixtures without casting unwanted light into your neighbor's lot.

General lighting or moonlighting effect to provide background is a must in good garden lighting. This effect can be created in several ways. If there is a street light shining in your yard, don't let it discourage you — utilize it to your advantage. Street lights are man-made moons which don't cost you anything to operate. Other sources of this lighting are front and rear entry lights, eave lights, patio or other existing lights that can provide you with the required general lighting. But these lights must be well shielded and their light diffused and balanced to harmonize with your garden lighting.

A good example of lighting balance can be taken from night-time driving conditions. On a country road on a pitch-black night it is difficult to see, but when you are driving on a bright

moon-lit night, it is much easier to see. Also, compare driving on an unlighted roadway to driving on a lighted roadway — the lighted roadway is much easier to see and drive on. The same conditions exist in garden lighting.

Nightscaping fixtures are designed for all situations and for all types of lighting effects. A tree 5 feet high and 5 feet wide may require as many as 3 to 5 fixtures to provide the desired effects. A "LOCATOR" fixture, 9" high and 2" wide may be used to light up the tree trunks. Three or four "STARLITERS" will provide the down lights and shadows on the pool or patio decking. These little "STARLITERS" measure only 2" wide and 3" long and weigh about 5 ounces each. They can be placed on almost any branch. The "STARLITER" is our favorite and most widely used fixture — A REAL STAR in our Nightscaping family.

A maple tree that is 20 feet high will need a "POWERLITER" for illumination. The "POWERLITER" provides a beam spread of 25 degrees by 50 degrees, or a change of lamp can provide a pencil-point light with a 6 by 5 degree spread. With the PAR-36 lamp many other beam spreads are possible.

For those hard to reach walls where general lighting cannot reach, the "HILITERS" do the job. They are specially designed for this purpose.

For waterfalls and cascading effects, the "PORPOISE" is best suited. It is only 4" high and 6" wide and can be put into the water for either effect or to get it out of sight.

"SPARKLERS" are designed to give a sparkling effect to a swimming pool or to a fish pond. They come in three different sizes so that just the right lighting can be achieved.

A variety of lights are available for walkways. The "NAVIGATOR" is 9" high and 5" wide and lights 10 feet of your walkway. For something a little larger, the "ILLUMINATOR" will light a walkway 25 feet wide.

Firefly effects in the trees can be achieved through a combination of "TWINKLERS" mixed with "STARLITERS" so that you have little flashes of light darting about.

In addition to the few fixtures mentioned above, additional special purpose fixtures are available to meet your lighting needs. Also, the fixtures mentioned above can be obtained in different sizes to meet different conditions and sizes of plants. Special designs can be fabricated by Porter-Walton's. Thus you can readily see that the Nightscaping line is not JUST a new type of light. It is a new and complete line of fixtures designed to bring out all the best points of your garden and plants.
