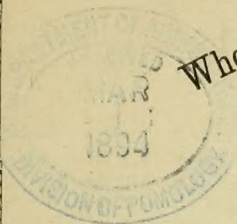

WHEELER'S FAVORITE.—Seedling, produced by George Wheeler. One of the finest of the cling variety. A large yellow peach, of splendid flavor, and ripens about the first of September.

WYANDOTTE CHIEF.—A freestone, and one of the finest for market. Ripens in August.

HOPKINSVILLE SEEDLING.—This peach originated near Hopkinsville, Ky., by the Rev. Mr. Hopkins. Fruit juicy, sweet, highly flavored and delicious. Ripens about the 20th of July.

4. All orders to ship must be accompanied by cash, unless otherwise agreed.
5. All claims for shortage, etc., to receive attention, must be made within five days from receipt of goods.
