Wm. Manning in the WATERLOO NURSERIES, which together constitute more than seventy-five acres in actual cultivation of *young, healthy and thrifty trees*

My facilities for growing hardy trees and for *convenience in handling and shipping* are *unsurpassed*, soil being clay loam, and location only ten minutes from the N. Y. C. Depot, and seven miles from Geneva.

ORDERS.—These should be sent early, and plainly written on a *separate sheet* of paper and *not in the body* of the letter.

PACKING.—All orders will be carefully packed in boxes or bales with damp moss for which a charge will be made sufficient to cover cost.

DIRECTIONS FOR SHIPPING.—Purchasers will confer a favor by naming the route by which they desire their goods sent, otherwise I forward to the best of my judgment; but in no instance can I be held responsible for damage caused by carelessness or delay on the part of the forwarders. All goods delivered free of cartage at the Depot or Express office.

Should any error have occurred in filling the orders, purchasers will please notify me immediately, so that I may at once make such amend as lies in my power.

TERMS.—Cash, draft, or satisfactory note payable at some bank.
