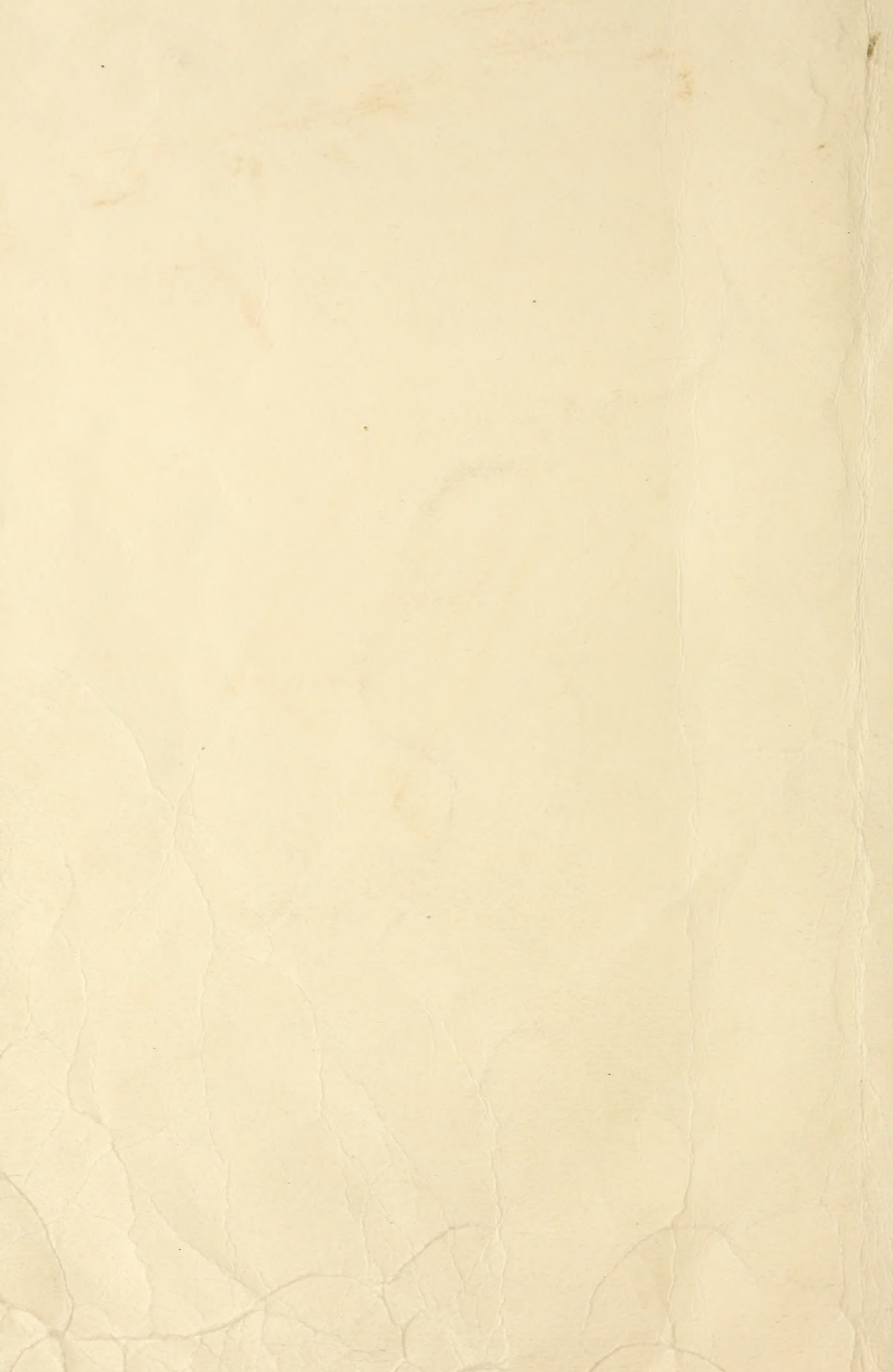

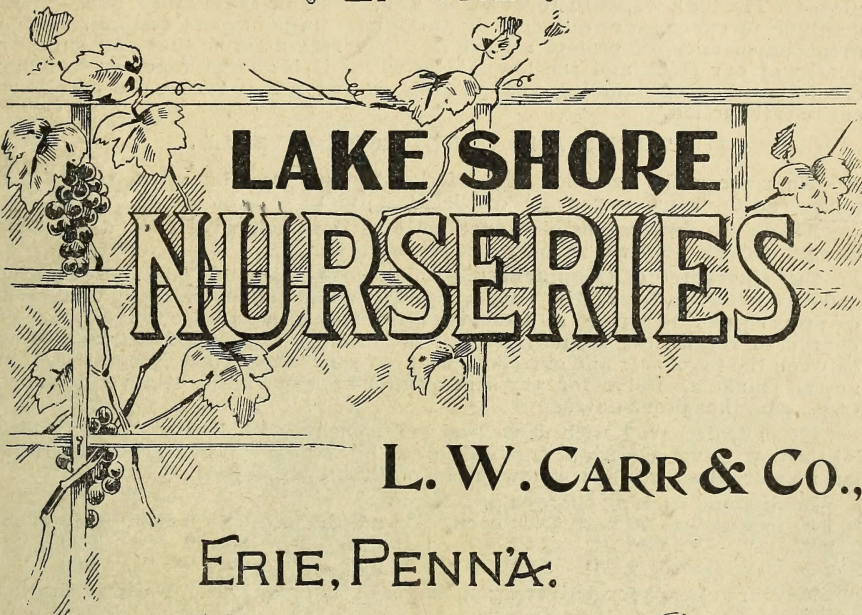

**Our Guarantee of Genuineness.**—While we exercise the greatest diligence and care to have all our trees, etc., true to label, and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc., that may prove untrue to label, free of charge, or refund the amount paid—it is mutually understood and agreed to between the purchaser and ourselves, that our guarantee of genuineness shall in no case make us liable for any sum greater than originally received for such trees, etc., that prove untrue.

When dealers pack with us we heel in the entire stock by itself and furnish labels and tying materials free. Help for billing up will be furnished gratis, but no more than can be constantly and profitably employed.

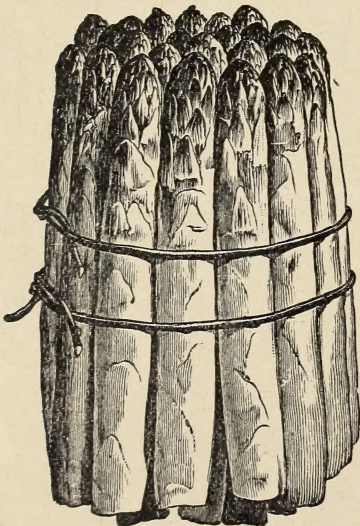
