Shirley Van Dyke has broken her fourth engagement. When will she stop breaking those poor boys' hearts?

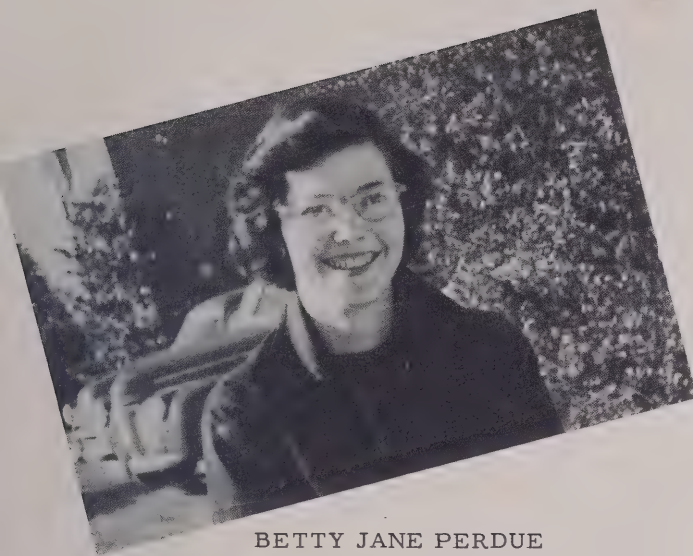

You were my friends then

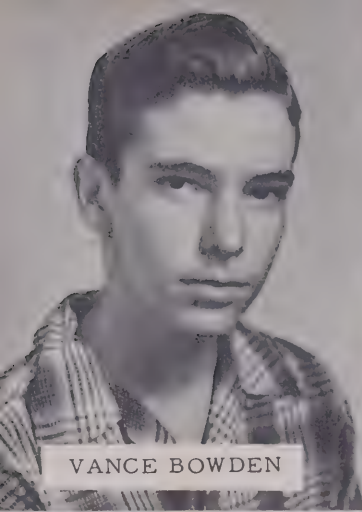
