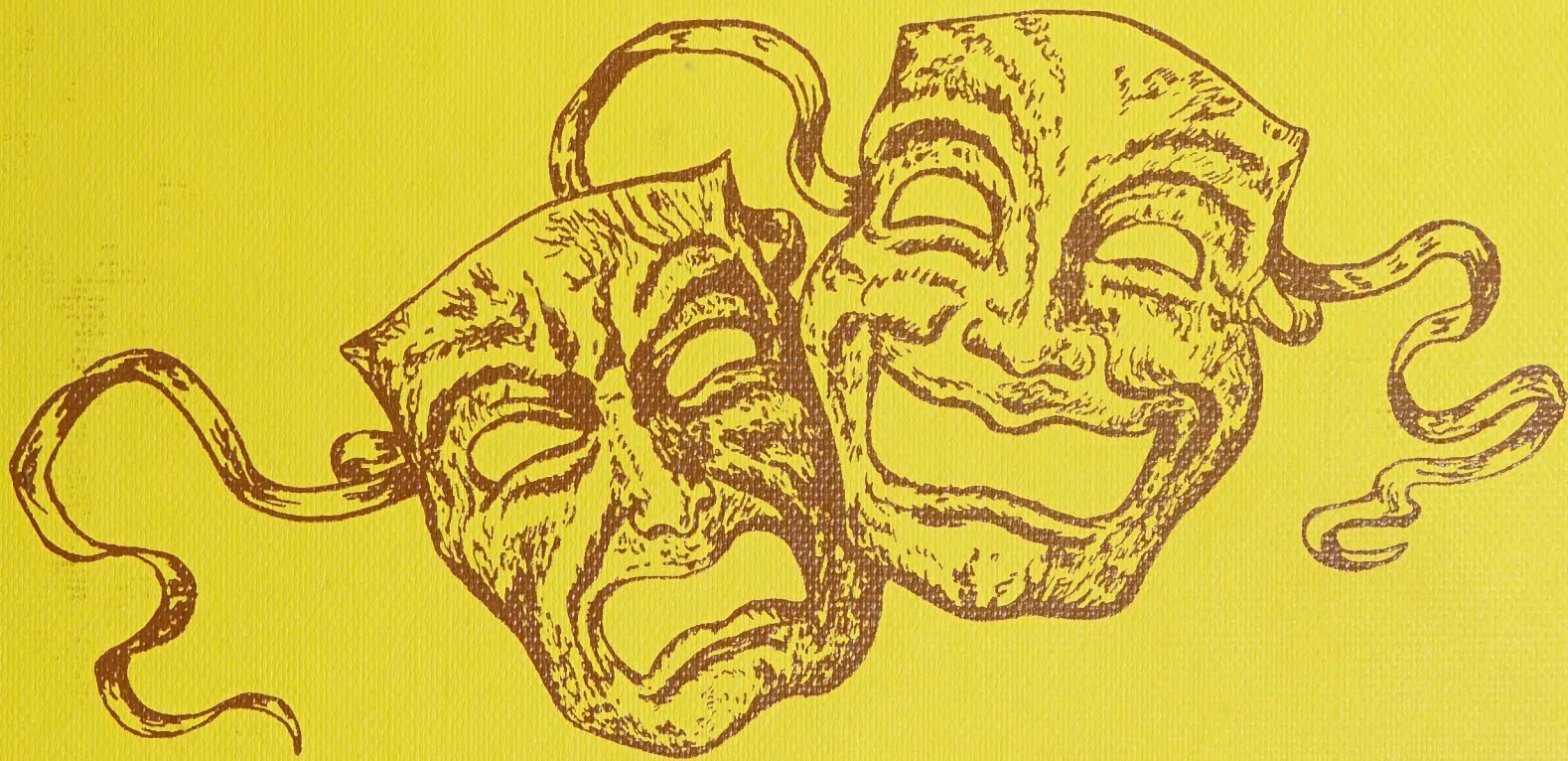

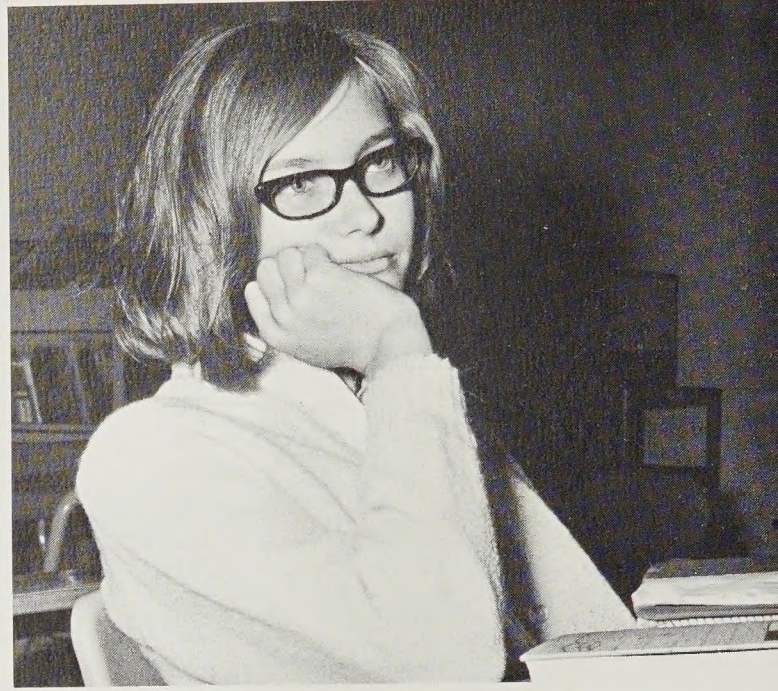

Portraying Webb . . . an atmosphere . . . a way of life . . . an education . . . is not easily done in a few words.

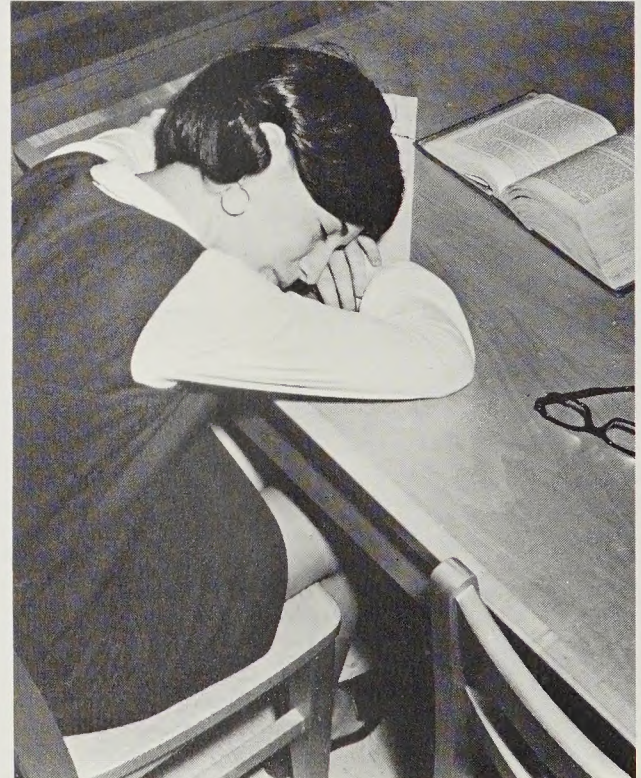
Though it may take a few years, we soon learn that Webb is more than a concrete and brick establishment; it is the expression of a brilliant and colorful way of life.

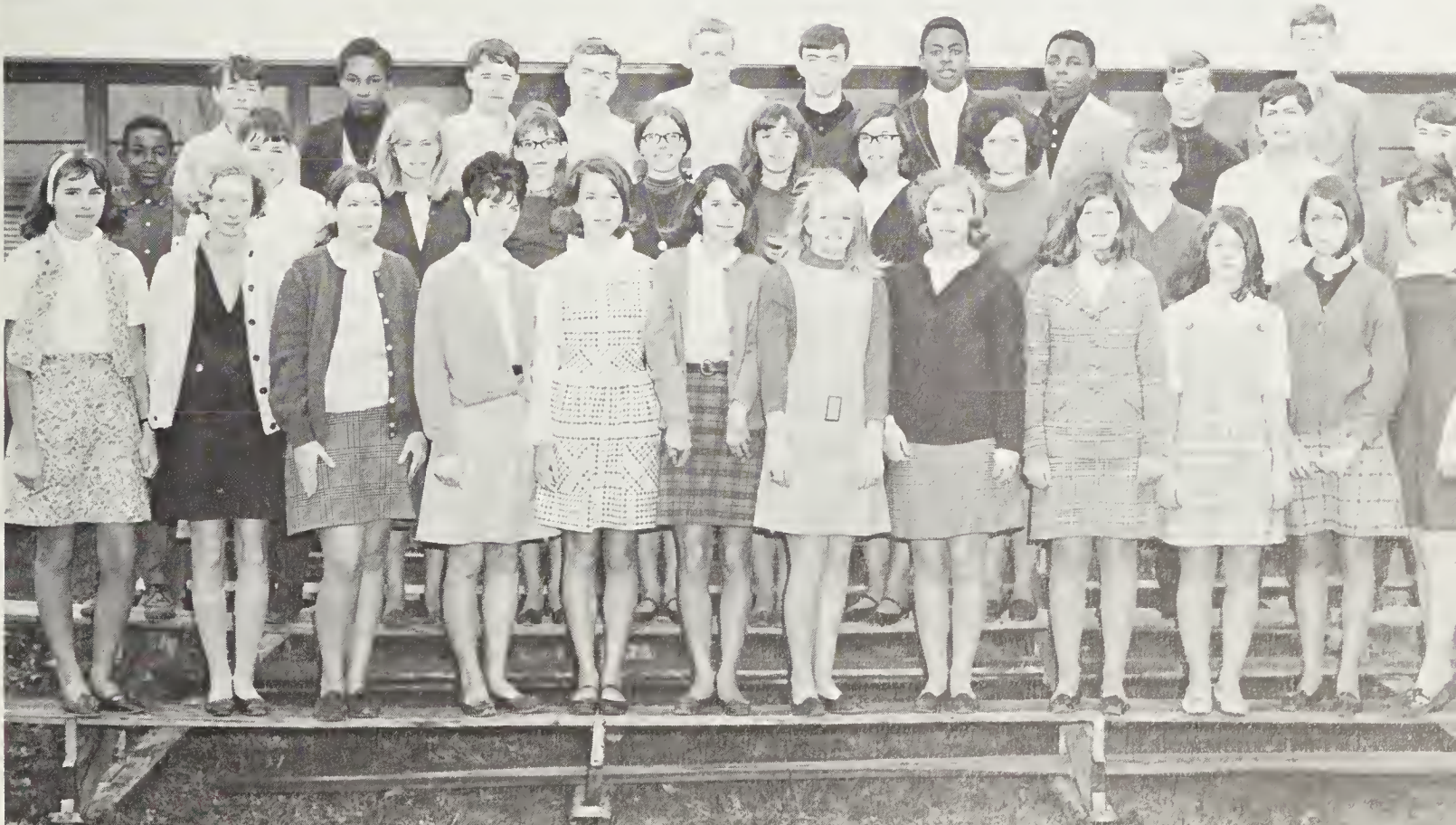
This year's state convention April 12th found Oxford JCL'ers well represented and competing in the several contests.

Several from Webb are looking forward to attending JCL National Convention in New Orleans in August. In the past ten years 113 from Oxford have attended nationals.

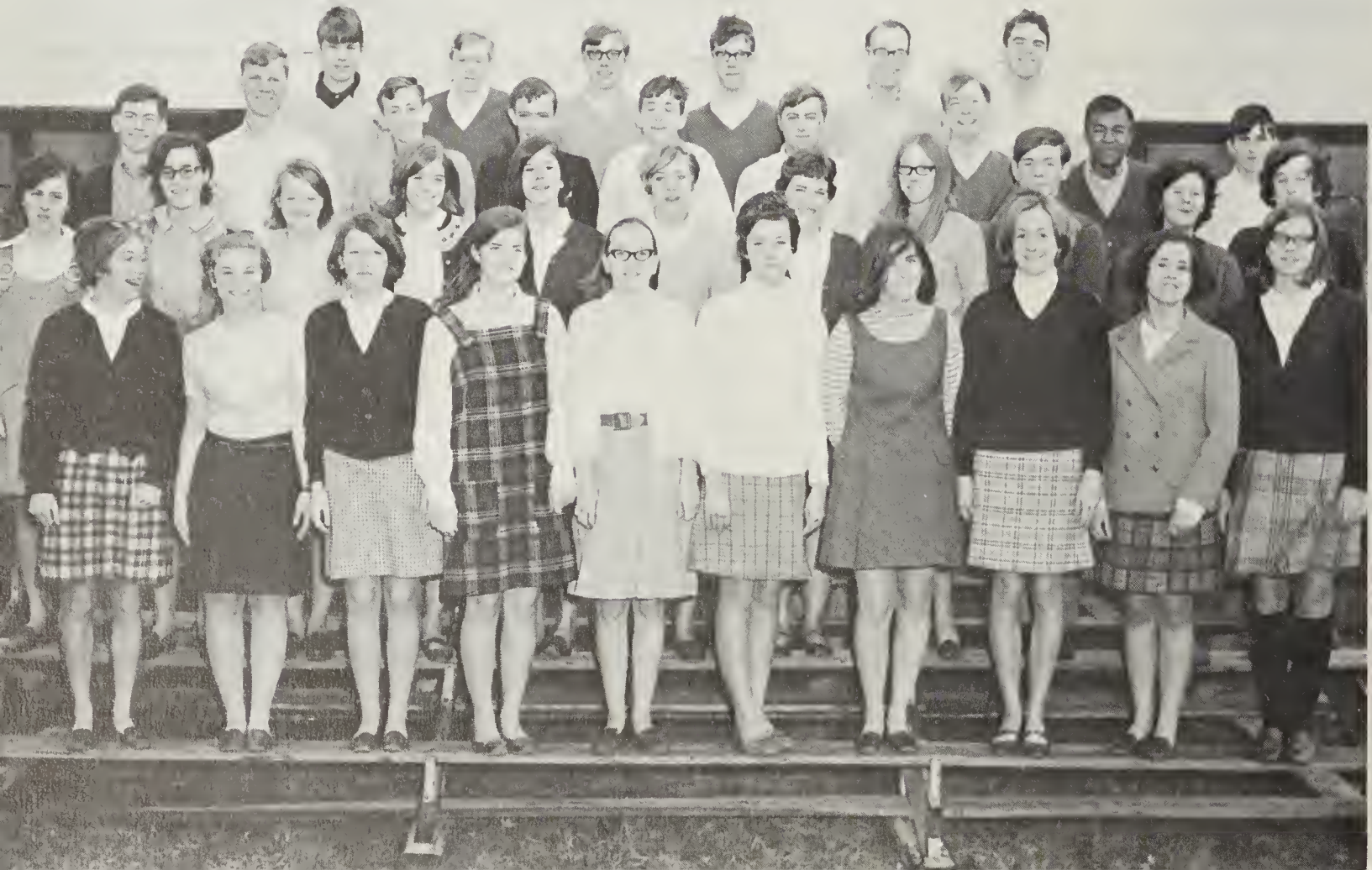

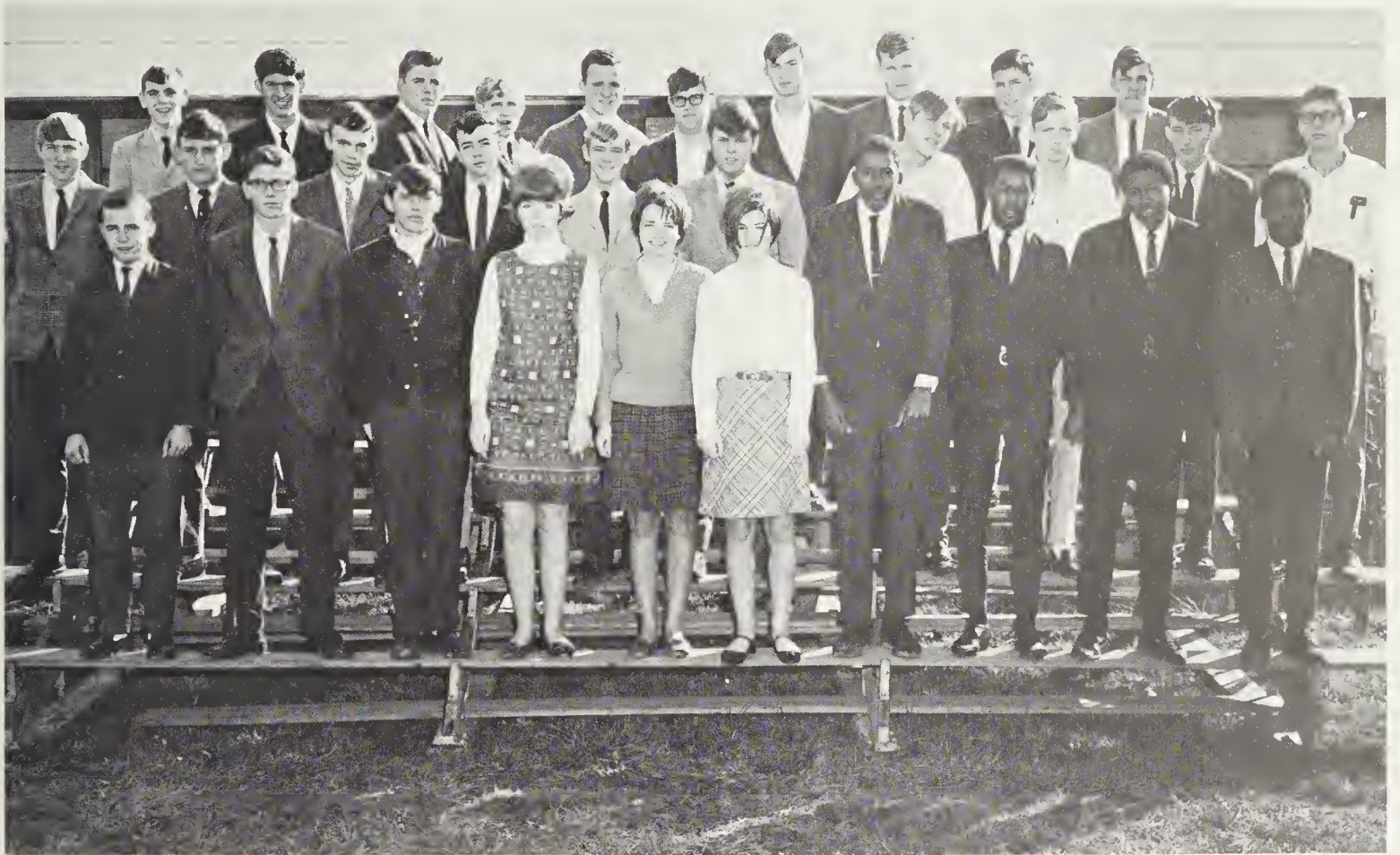


Distributive Education Clubs of America

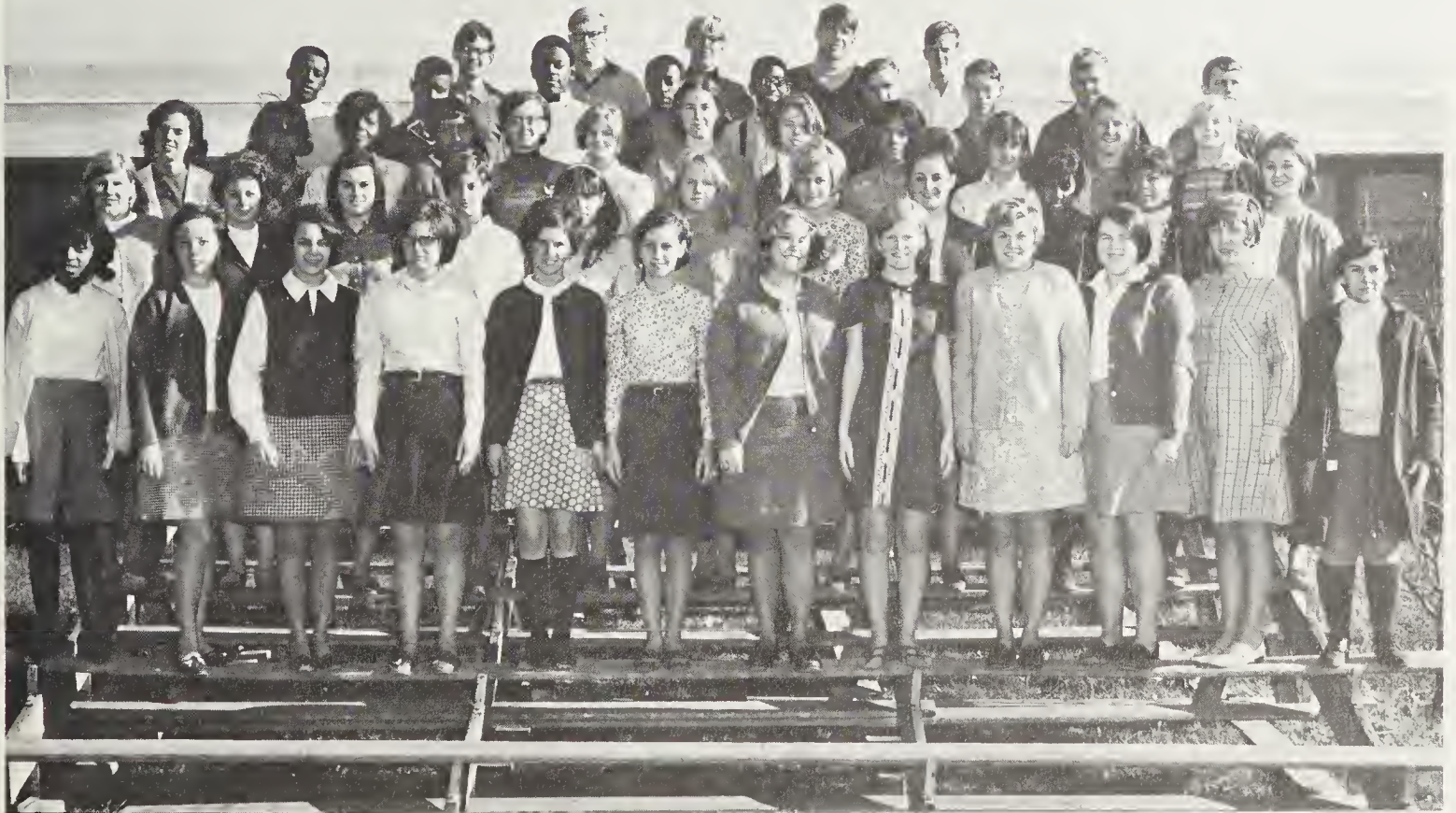

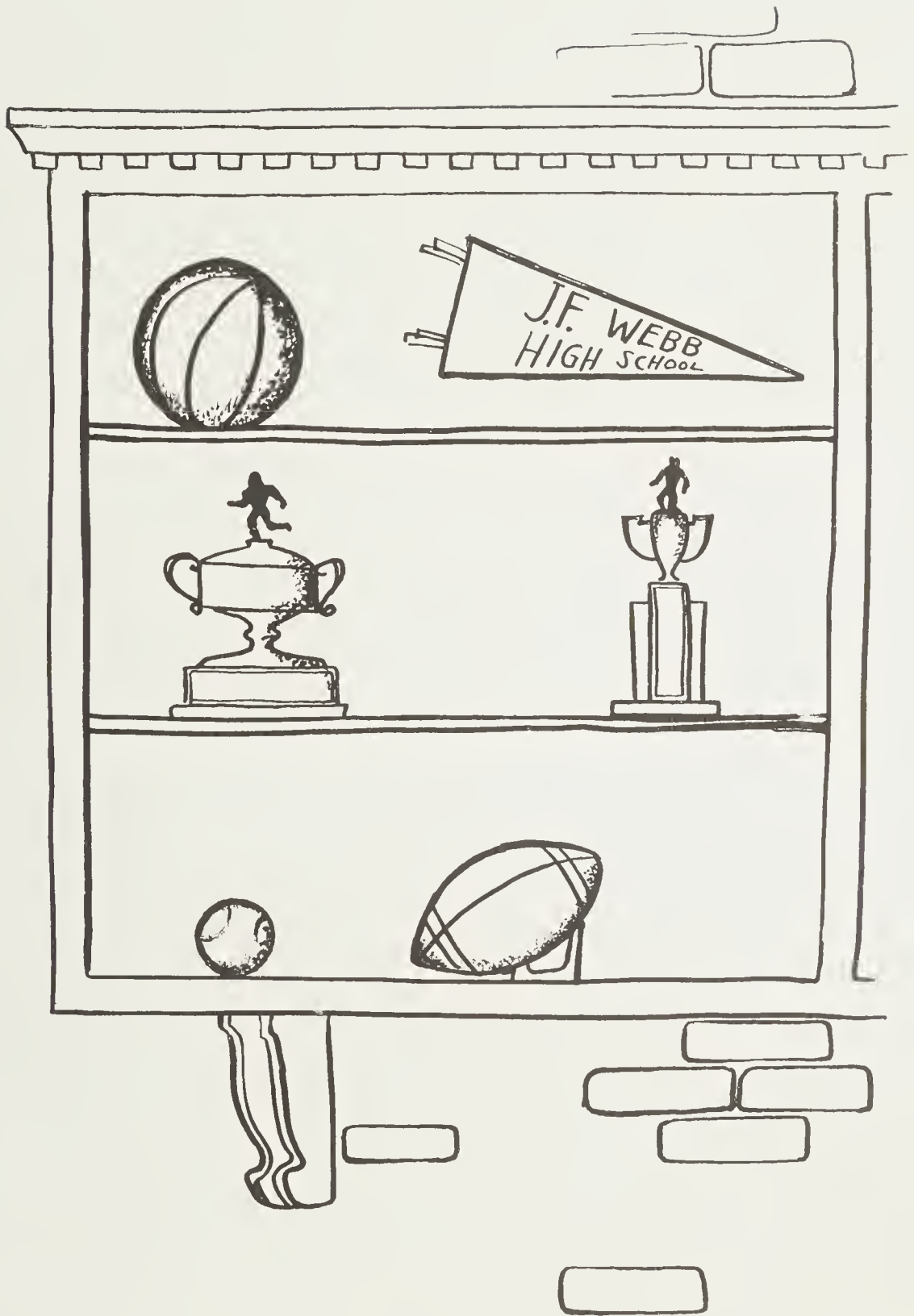

These talented young ladies hope that by separating themselves from the Mixed Chorus they have established a tradition at Webb which will continue, growing bigger and better each year.

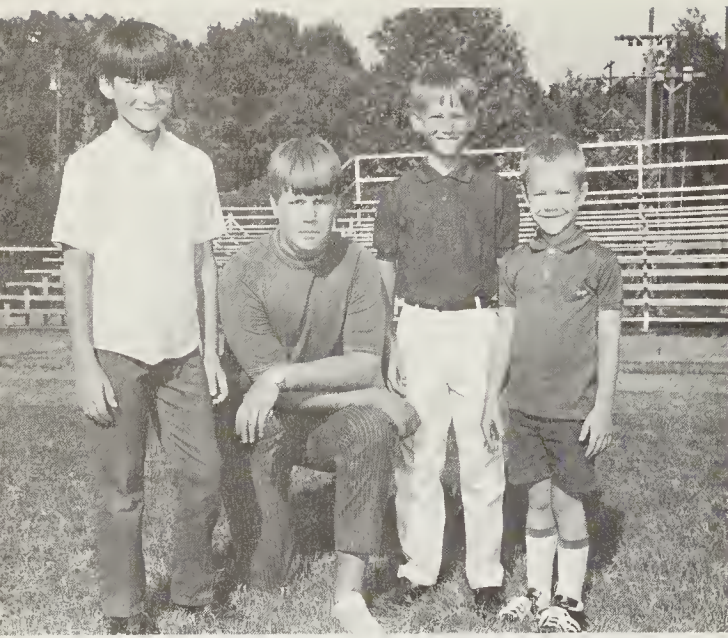

The schedule includes 13 conference games and 6 non-conference tilts.

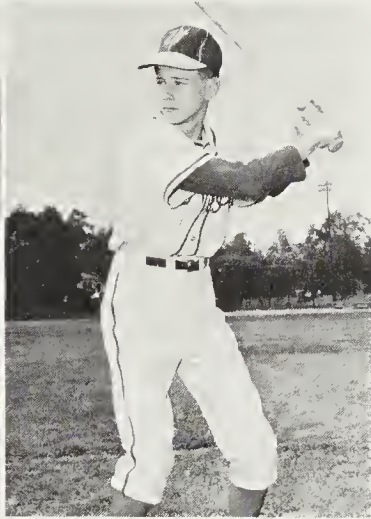

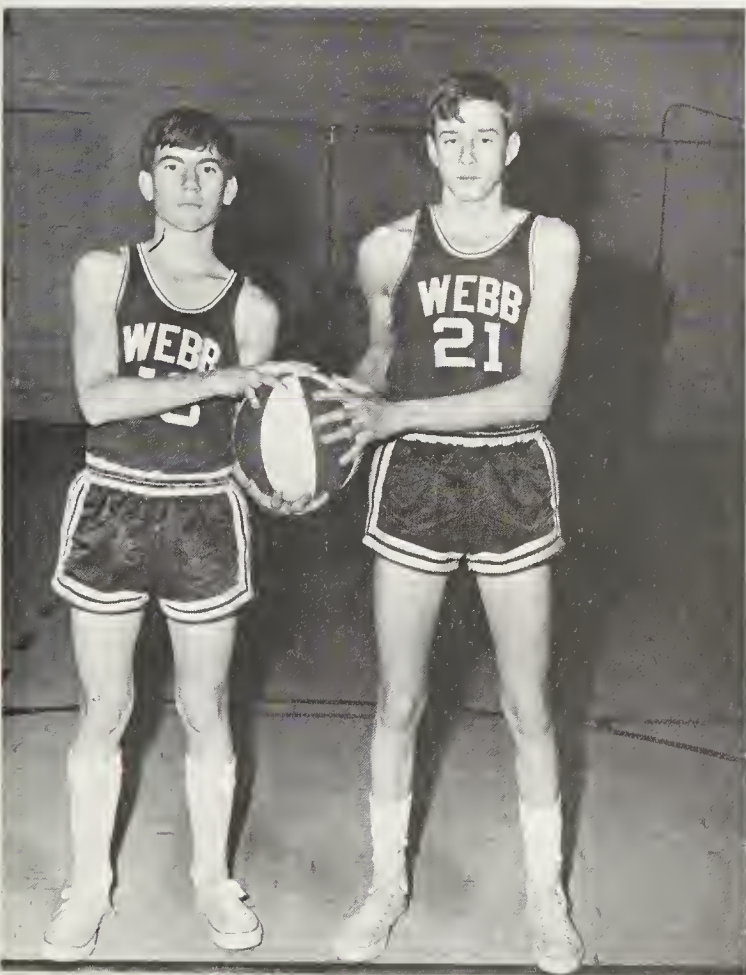




J.V. Basketball

The National Honor Society was organized at J.F. Webb High School in 1965. Thirty-one seniors were the charter members.

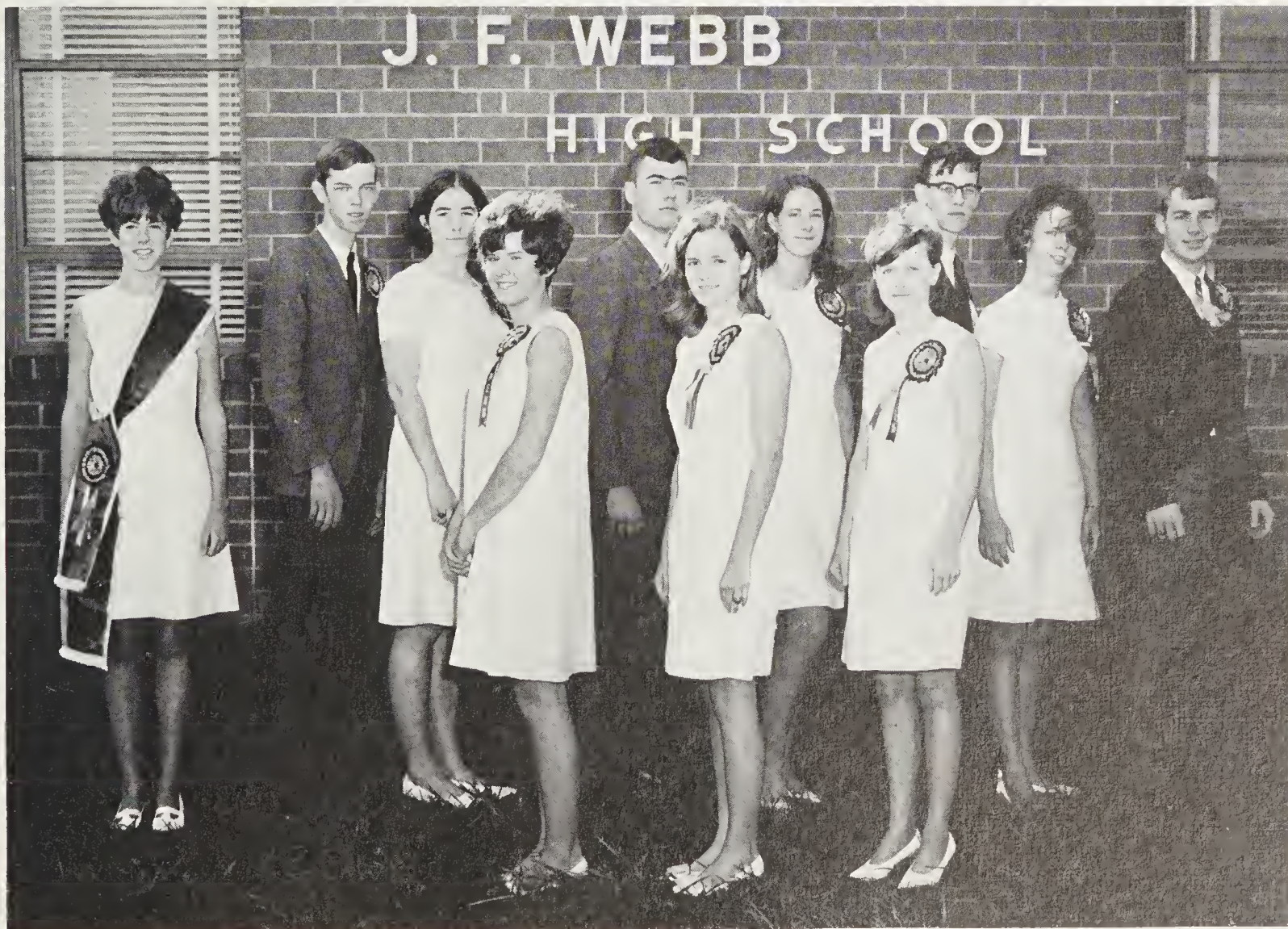
A student must have an average of ninety during their first two and a half years of high school to be eligible for membership in this organization. These students must display qualities of scholarship, leadership, character, and service.
