I got here on Saturday  
from the South, and have  
today engaged a passage on  
board the "Atlantic" to  
sail for Liverpool on 27<sup>th</sup>

wish me to take to Sir W. J. Hooker.

I lately had a letter from  
Sir Wm in which he speaks

most affectionately of "the  
good Torrey" - so that your  
supposition that he was hurt  
with you has no foundation.

I leave at your College  
here a copy of the new Edition  
of my "Manual of British  
Algae" - for which I solicit  
a place on your shelves. -

My tour to Key West was  
tolerably productive of Algae -  
I found 130 species in  
all - several of which are  
new, & others belong to

genera of which no American  
species had previously been  
found. I did not collect  
any Phanerogamous plants—  
(to my shame be it spoken)—in-  
deed I found the labour of  
Alga drying to occupy my  
time very fully—and the latter  
part of my stay the weather  
became so hot that I could  
not get out except in the  
evening. I found D. Blodgett  
a very intelligent person.  
He told me he had a few  
new things for you—but his  
previous collections had been  
so very full that there are

few novelties to be sent:

At Washington I had the  
pleasure of making Miss Mar-  
garet Torrey's acquaintance  
while staying with Mr. Henry.
