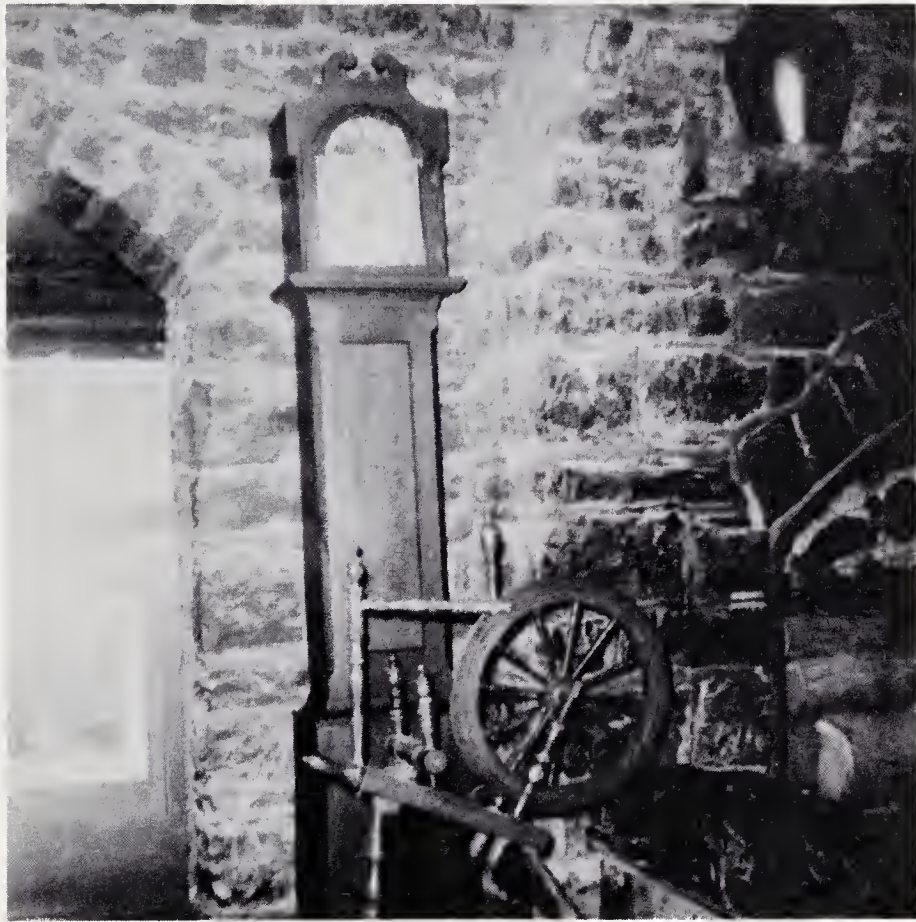

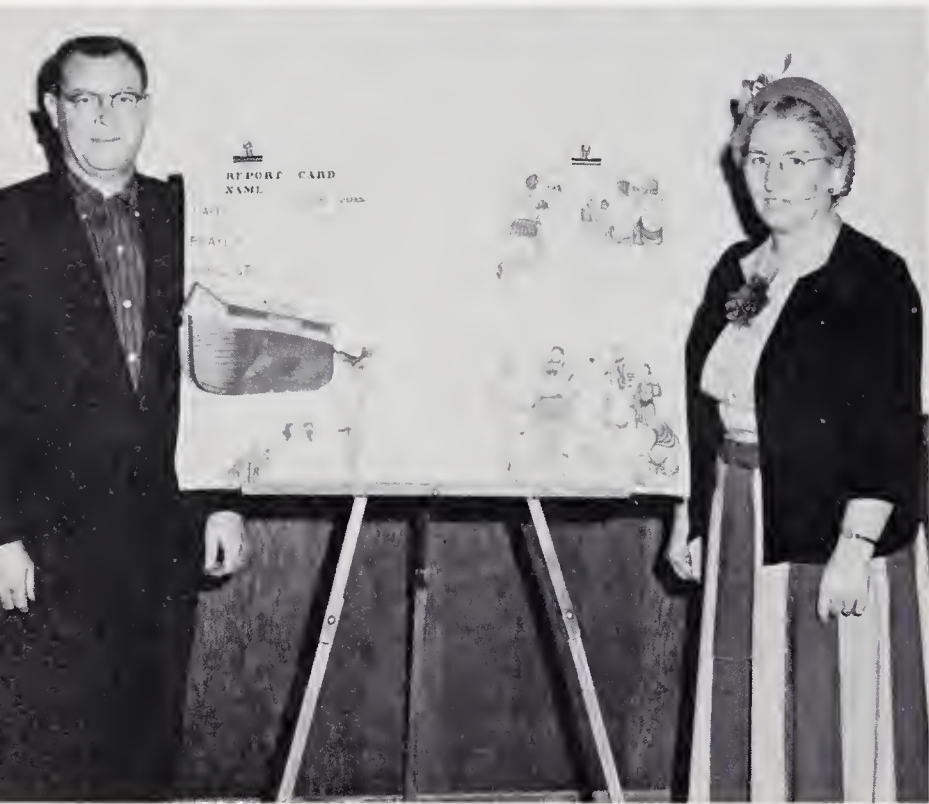
At first there is the confusion of registration and doubts about choice of subjects. Later, however, order emerges, and the students settle down to the pattern of studying.
